The parish council along with Fr Greg have chosen an new theme for the upcoming year.

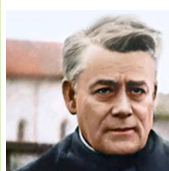
The new theme and artwork will be unveiled on Sunday 29th November the first day of the new liturgical year.

MESSAGE FROM FR GREG:

Dear Friends,

Throughout November the Church prays for all those who are in purgatory waiting for the day when they will join the company of the saints in heaven. The celebration of Mass is the highest means of charity the Church can provide for the dead, however we can also relieve their sufferings through our prayers, sufferings and penances. In particular, we can help the souls in purgatory by undertaking actions (prayers, etc) that have indulgences attached to them.

During the month of November, Pope Francis has made a special dispensation to allow us to receive an indulgence which can be applied to the souls in purgatory. A plenary indulgence is granted when the faithful piously visit a church or a cemetery between 1-30th November. During the visit it is required that one Our Father and the Creed be recited. All with all indulgences, is also necessary to fulfil the usual conditions of:

- receiving the sacrament of confession, either eight days before or after the pious act is performed,
- receiving Holy Communion on that day, and
- reciting prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father (one Our Father and one Hail Mary is the minimum, but any other additional prayers may be added). Let us continue to pray for all of our departed loved ones, and in this way return the love they have shared with us during their earthly journey.

I would like to express my gratitude to all those parishioners who have helped on Saturday 14th November with the renovation of the piety shop and the foyer at St Patrick's Church. This is in preparation for our new project of a welcoming committee, which will be launched on the first Sunday of December.

I send many blessings, best wishes and prayers to all those members of our parish who celebrate their birthdays or significant anniversaries this week!

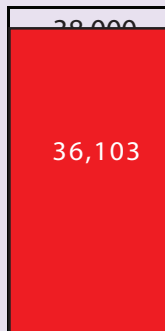

Jesus spoke this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a man on his way abroad who summoned his servants and entrusted his property to them. To one he gave five talents, to another two, to a third one; each in proportion to his ability. Then he set out. The man who had received the five talents promptly went and traded with them and made five more. The man who had received two made two more in the same way. But the man who had received one went off and dug a hole in the ground and hid his master's money. Now a long time after, the master of those servants came back and went through his accounts with them. The man who had received the five talents came forward bringing five more. "Sir", he said "you entrusted me with five talents; here are five more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Next the man with the two talents came forward. "Sir," he said "you entrusted me with two talents; here are two more that I have made." His master said to him, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you have shown you can be faithful in small things, I will trust you with greater; come and join in your master's happiness." Last came forward the man who had the one talent. "Sir," said he "I had heard you were a hard man, reaping where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered; so I was afraid, and I went off and hid your talent in the ground. Here it is; it was yours, you have it back." But his master answered him, "You wicked and lazy servant! So you knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I have not scattered? Well then, you should have deposited my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have recovered my capital with interest. So now, take the talent from him and give it to the man who has the five talents. For

to everyone who has will be given more, and he will have more than enough; but from the man who has not, even what he has will be taken away. As for this good-for-nothing servant, throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth."

REFLECTION

BY FR MICHAEL TATE

Befriending Time

God's plan for human happiness is mostly frustrated by a good person burying his or her personality traits, what one might call one's talents, which is really to bury oneself and to become invisible.

In the old language of my schoolboy catechism, we should be concerned not just with sins of commission, but with sins of omission – failure of courage, failure to take risks, failure to put everything on the line with the personality and the moment in time given to you and to me.

As Shakespeare says in Julius Caesar:

'There is a tide in the affairs of men which, taken at the flood, leads on to fortune; omitted, all the voyage of their life is bound in stillness and in miseries.'

The Divine Tide is flowing through human history. We should trust ourselves to that tide which can carry us to the shores of Heaven. Failure to take risks leads to Hellish stillness and miseries.

We could pause for a moment to pray that we might use our talents so as to hear: 'Well done, good and faithful servant ... come and join in your Master's happiness.'

Rev Prof Michael Tate graduated in Law from the University of Tasmania in 1968, and in Theology from Oxford University in 1971. He lectured at the University of Tasmania from 1972-78, being Dean of the Faculty of Law in 1977-78. He was a Senator for Tasmania from 1978-93, being Federal Minister for Justice from 1987-93. He served as Ambassador to The Hague and the Holy See from 1993-96. He then returned to Australia and was ordained in May 2000 and has been a parish priest in the Archdiocese of Hobart since then. He is an Honorary Professor of Law at the University of Tasmania where he lectures in International Humanitarian Law.

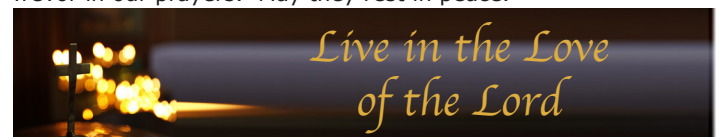
