

POPE FRANCIS PROCLAIMS "YEAR OF ST JOSEPH"

With the Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from today, 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.

MESSAGE FROM FR GREG:

Dear friends,

Last Tuesday, Pope Francis announced a special year dedicated to St. Joseph. It runs from 8 December 2020 until 8 December 2021. The start not only falls on the 150th anniversary of St. Joseph's proclamation as the patron of the Universal Church but also on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Our Lady.

The Vatican also issued a decree granting special indulgences for the entirety of this special year, to celebrate the anniversary and "perpetuate the entrustment of the whole Church to the

powerful patronage of the Custodian of Jesus."

During this year, all of the faithful have the opportunity to commit themselves "with prayer and good works, to obtain, with the help of St. Joseph, head of the heavenly Family of Nazareth, comfort and relief from the serious human and social tribulations that besiege the contemporary world today." As we are at the beginning of a Year of Hope in our parish, this great patron is given to all of us especially during this year to help us grow more in HOPE and to pray through his intercession for our families, our country and the whole universal church!

As we quickly approach Christmas, I would like to encourage you to prepare your hearts in a special way for Jesus' birthday. We decorate our homes, and we prepare food... This is important, but we also need to make sure we don't miss the true meaning of Christmas. I would therefore encourage you to go to the sacrament of Reconciliation to make your heart clean and ready for His coming. In this parish bulletin, you will find more information about the 2nd rite of Reconciliation in our parish and also in other parishes in our area. Fr Paul and I are also available during adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

r area. Fr Paul and I are also available during adoration of the Blessed Sacrament before or after each Mass during the week and for 30 minutes before each Mass on the weekend. There are many opportunities that have been organised so that you may be reconciled with God, but it is still up to you to make the first step.

You will notice in this bulletin that there will be more Masses celebrated in the parish this Christmas, because, together with Fr Paul, I decided this was necessary to give you and other members of the parish more opportunities to attend Mass while respecting the COVID restrictions of 2sqm per person in the church. Please make sure that you register via Trybooking (using the links you can find in the bulletin or on the parish Facebook page) or please contact the parish office. In the current COVID situation, we will do all we can to make this celebration very meaningful and beautiful for all of you.

I would like to invite you to help with decorating the Church for Christmas on Saturday 19 December from 9.30~am, and cleaning of the church on Tuesday 22 December from 9.30~am. There is a lot of work and preparation to be done before Christmas to make it special, but when we all work together, we can do this very quickly. I look forward to seeing you there.

To conclude, I send my best wishes and prayers to all of you who celebrate birthdays or other special occasions this week.

COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS UPDATE

Having considered the latest round of restrictions issued by the NSW Government in Public Health (COVID-19 Restrictions on Gathering and Movement) Order (No 7) 2020, Bishop Anthony writes.

Capacity at a place of public worship or at a religious gathering, must not exceed one visitor per 2 square metres of publicly accessible space.

- This refers to services both indoors and outdoors.
- There is no upper limit for this restriction
- If outdoors, the space must be defined by fencing or another form of barrier
- The density limit does not apply if there are 25 visitors or less at the premises.
- Children count towards the capacity limit.
- Up to 50 performers can sing indoors with no cap on performers outdoors.
- All singers should face forwards and not towards each other, have physical distancing of 1.5 metres between each other and any other performers, and be 5 metres from all other people including the audience and conductor.
- It is recommended that audience members and congregants older than 12 wear masks if singing or chanting.
- Contact tracing measures remain in place, with the contact details of visitors to the premises to be securely held for 28 days. Electronic methods of contact tracing are preferred.
- Encourage congregants to wear a mask during attendance at places of worship, especially if there will be singing or chanting.



A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

There stands among you, unknown to you, the one who is coming after me.

A man came, sent by God.

His name was John.

He came as a witness, as a witness to speak for the light, so that everyone might believe through him.

He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied: a voice that cries in the wilderness:

Make a straight way for the Lord.'

Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you – unknown to you – the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The individual announcing this prophetic oracle has been anointed by the Lord and is thus endowed with the spirit. The anointing may be a figure of speech, but the duties that accompany it are very real and explicitly social. The afflicted referred to were probably victims of some social system. The good news promises that they will be the beneficiaries of the year of release, while the oppressive system will suffer the vengeance of God. The reading begins with a promise of salvation and ends with a prayer of thanksgiving for salvation granted. It contains several prophetic themes: God cares for the afflicted, saves

through the agency of human beings, and fulfills promises; all things are accomplished through God's grace.

The psalm has strong parallels with the victory hymns of other women, Miriam (Exod 15:1-18), Hannah (1 Sam 2:1-10), and Judith (Jdt 16:1-17). In it, Mary praises God for the wonders that are being accomplished within her. Her own lowliness is evidence that the poor and downtrodden have been visited with salvation. The humility that acknowledged her lowliness does not deny the greatness of the things that will be accomplished through her. While the first verses describe the great things that God did to Mary, the last ones list some of the past blessings enjoyed by Israel. Mary's hymn suggests that the marvels accomplished in her are a final example of God's mercy. The salvation of the people has finally come.

Paul urges the Christians to be unceasing in rejoicing, prayer, and thanksgiving. He does not overlook the realities of suffering in life, nor does he advocate a false sense of happiness that simply refuses to let in anything that is painful. The joy that he urges is the joy that comes from knowing that in Christ's resurrection, even death itself has been overcome. Paul suggests the presence of charismatic or spirit-filled activity. He encourages the Thessalonians to give full rein to the gifts of the spirit, while discerning what is genuinely of God and what is not. He prays for their holiness and then assures them of God's faithfulness to the promises of salvation made to them.

'Who are you?' is the hinge question in the gospel reading. This is not a simple enquiry about name or occupation; it is a very concrete question. 'Who are you in relation to the Messiah?' The Baptist himself testifies to his relationship to the Messiah. He is the divinely chosen witness to the light, not the light itself. Messianic expectations were anything but uniform at this time. After he denies being any messianic figure, John identifies himself as 'a voice in the wilderness' (Isa 40:3). His role is preparatory; he explains this when the officials question his reasons for baptising. John is content to be first the witness, the herald, and nothing more.

Dianne Bergant CSA was a Professor of Biblical Studies at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, where she taught from 1978 to 2014. She holds a BS in Elementary Education from Marian College, Fond du Lac, WI; an MA and PhD in Biblical Languages and Literature from St Louis University. Amongst other things, she served as President of Catholic Biblical Association of America (2000-2001) and has been awarded honorary doctorates from several other universities. She was an active member of the Chicago Catholic/Jewish Scholars Dialogue (1988-2017) and sat on the editorial boards of The Bible Today (1979-2005), Biblical Theology Bulletin (1990-2014), Catholic Biblical Quarterly (1992-2001), New Theology Review (1997-2003), Teaching Theology and Religion (2003-2005), and Chicago Studies (2003-2009). She has taught and lectured in many places in the United States and chapters in books.
