



## WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR CONSECRATED LIFE — FEBRUARY 2, 2021

In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted a day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life. This celebration is attached to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2nd. This Feast is also known as Candlemas Day; the day on which candles are blessed symbolizing Christ who is the light of the world. So too, those in consecrated life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples. "This then is the consecrated life: praise which gives joy to God's people, prophetic vision that reveals what counts. Consecrated life is not about survival, it is not about preparing ourselves for ars bene moriendi: this is the temptation of our days, in the face of declining vocations. No, it is not about survival, but new life. "But... there are only a few of us..." - it's about new life. It is a living encounter with the Lord in his people. It is a call to the faithful obedience of daily life and to the unexpected surprises from the Spirit. It is a vision of what we need to embrace in order to experience joy: Jesus" -- Pope Francis, WDCL Homily on February 2, 2019



#### THE SCRIPTURES,

#### A PARTICIPATION IN THE STORY OF SALVATION

It would be beneficial if every Christian community, on one Sunday of the liturgical year, could renew its efforts to make the Sacred Scriptures better known and more widely diffused. It would be a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people.

Pope Francis 2016

Accordingly, the "Word of God Sunday" is celebrated on the 1st Sunday of February each year. In the year 2021, that is 7 February 2021.

Pope Francis reminds us to receive the Scriptures "not as a human word but as what it really is, the word of God". They are not just words. It is the Holy Spirit that "makes human words written in human fashion become the word of God". (Aperuit Illis, 5) He reminds us that when we read the Scriptures, we are entering into a true dialogue, a true encounter, a participation in the great story of salvation. As well as speaking to us personally, the Scriptures speak to us communally, "for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and to break bread in the community of believers". (Aperuit Illis, 8)

Pope Francis asks us to mark the Word of God Sunday with a certain solemnity, and to "celebrate, study, and disseminate" the word of God.

We are encouraged to see this day of the Word of God as a year-long event, where we grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures. Consider taking steps to read or study the Scriptures during the year. †



A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

The unmarried woman dedicates herself to the things of the Lord, that she might be holy.

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

#### **GOSPEL**

#### MK 1:21-28

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark This is a new kind of teaching that speaks with authority.

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant, 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

#### **SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY**

#### **BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA**

This text clearly states that Moses is the prophet par excellence. He received the word of the Lord in the form of the Law and acted as God's spokesperson by promulgating it. Several features mark the prophet. First, the true prophet does not independently assume the role of spokesperson, but is raised up by God (vv.15, 18). Second, the prophet is not an outsider, but is called forth from among the people (v.15). Third, the message

is not the prophet's, but is God's (v.18). Finally, because this prophet speaks God's words, in God's name, with God's authority, whoever disregards the message or speaks in the name of any other god is liable to divine punishment.

The psalm combines an invitation to praise, a plea for openness and a divine word. God is perceived as a rock of salvation, the creator and a shepherd caring for a flock. Because of their responsibility for the people, monarchs were often characterised as shepherds. These images of rock and shepherd illustrate the people's perception of God as protector. The psalmist issues a serious plea to be open to the voice of God 'today'. There is an appeal for a positive response, not in the spirit of rebellion that governed their ancestors while they were in the wilderness (cf. Exod 17:1-7; Deut 6:16). God desires hearts that are open, not hardened by selfishness or a lack of faith.

Paul firmly believed that the end was near. He did not outrightly oppose marriage, but the inevitability of the end suggested to him, that it would be better to be unmarried. He contrasts anxiety about the things of the Lord with anxiety about the things of the world. He knew that those involved in the world could still be committed to the Lord. He acknowledges that those married assume responsibility for the survival of the race, concerned with the things of this world so that the next generations can enjoy a prosperous future. He is careful to admit that he is giving an opinion and not an injunction that would impose restraints upon his hearers.

Following the custom of the time, Jesus took his turn teaching in the synagogue. The people were accustomed to the manner of teaching of the scribes, the official teachers who relied for their authority on the precedents already set by the teaching of others. Jesus, on the other hand, taught as one having authority in his own right. The people in the synagogue marvelled at this. The exorcism may have been an outward manifestation of this unusual authority. It describes a confrontation between good and evil. The evil spirit's acknowledgment of Jesus' superiority is confirmed by the question posed: Have you come to destroy us? Just as the people were astonished by the teaching of Jesus, so they are amazed at his power over the evil spirit.


