## FR GREG'S LETTER FOR THE WEEK.

"Jesus began to preach..." (Mt 4:17). With these words, Matthew the evangelist introduces the ministry of Jesus. The one who is the Word of God has come to speak to us, both with His words and by His life.

The Word, who brings us salvation, does not go looking for untouched, clean and safe places. Instead, He enters the complex and obscure places in our lives. God wants to visit the very places we think that he would never go. However, we often close the door, preferring to keep our confusion, our dark side and our duplicity hidden.

Dear friends, as we celebrate Word of God Sunday today, let us make room inside of ourselves for the Word of God! Each day, let us read even just a verse or two of the Bible. Let us begin with the Gospel: keep it open on our

table, carry it in our pocket or bag, read it on our mobile phones, and allow it to inspire us daily. We will discover that God is close to us, that he dispels our darkness and, with great love, leads our lives into deeper waters.

This year in our parish, we want to increase our focus on both faith formation and reaching out to other people in our area with God's love. We will,

therefore, be launching a few new projects soon. Firstly, on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, we will distribute our St Patrick's Lenten Daily Reflections booklets, written by some members of the parish and to whom I would like to thank for their contribution. Also, this week all of our youth groups will recommence for the year: years 5-6 group every second Friday; high school and over every Sunday after the 6 pm Youth Mass, and young adults once a month (for more information, please see this bulletin or our Facebook page). I'm also very happy to see that our seniors' ministry is already very active and reaching out to the many senior parishioners in our community with different opportunities.

Over the last two years of my ministry in Gosford, I have seen a great need to

provide opportunities for formation and fellowship for couples and families. Therefore, together with a leadership team for this ministry, I would like to invite people in this category to our first gathering at St Francis of Assisi Centre in Somersby on the 21st February. More details are available within this bulletin. Additionally, on 20th-21st March, we will have a Parish retreat, and I look forward to this opportunity for us to take time to reflect on our prayer life.

As you can see, there are, and there will be, many opportunities for everyone for formation and growth in faith this year. I would like to encourage you all to take an active part in these and other initiatives and opportunities. I entrust our parish and all future projects to the intercession of our patron, St Patrick, and ask you to pray with me for our community.

I would like to wish many blessings to those who celebrate their birthdays or other special occasions this week. May God continue to bless us all and keep us in his love and care.

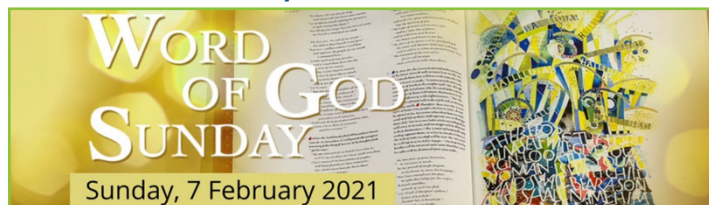

**A PARTICIPATION IN THE STORY OF SALVATION**

It would be beneficial if every Christian community, on one Sunday of the liturgical year, could renew its efforts to make the Sacred Scriptures better known and more widely diffused. It would be a Sunday given over entirely to the word of God so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people.

Pope Francis 2016

Accordingly, the "Word of God Sunday" is celebrated on the 1st Sunday of February each year. In the year 2021, that is 7 February 2021.

Pope Francis reminds us to receive the Scriptures "not as a human word but as what it really is, the word of God". They are not just words. It is the Holy Spirit that "makes human words written in human fashion become the word of God". (Aperuit Illis, 5) He reminds us that when we read the Scriptures, we are entering into a true dialogue, a true encounter, a participation in the great story of salvation. As well as speaking to us personally, the Scriptures speak to us communally, "for we urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and to break bread in the community of believers". (Aperuit Illis, 8)

Pope Francis asks us to mark the Word of God Sunday with a certain solemnity, and to "celebrate, study, and disseminate" the word of God.

We are encouraged to see this day of the Word of God as a year-long event, where we grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures. Consider taking steps to read or study the Scriptures during the year. †

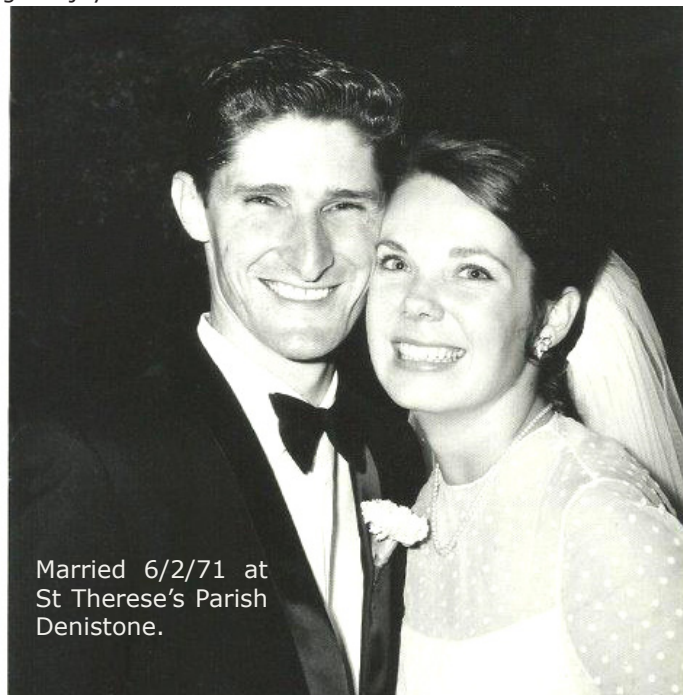

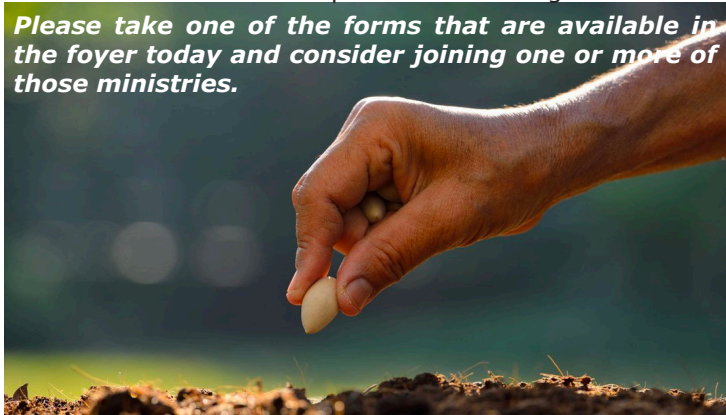

## COVID UPDATE - AT THE TIME OF PRINTING

### SAME AS LAST WEEK.

- All places of worship and corporate event venues (fully seated with no singing or dancing) will be subject to the 1 person per 4sqm rule.
- Masks will remain compulsory for front-of-house hospitality staff, on public transport, in places of worship, hairdressers, beauticians and gaming rooms.
- Singing indoors including choirs or places of worship will be limited to five people.

It is anticipated that all settings requiring the 4sqm rule will revert to the 1 person per 2sqm rule in one weeks' time if current trends continue, subject to expert health advice.

## CONFIRMATION 2021

### SUNDAY JUNE 5

Last year Bishop Randazzo made changes to the sacramental programs regarding the eligible age of candidates. From 2021, the eligible ages of candidates for the sacramental programs will be:

- Confirmation to children in Year 3.
- 1st Reconciliation to children in Year 4.
- 1st Eucharist to children in Year 4.

Therefore our 2020 Year 2's who missed out last year will now be eligible for confirmation this year.

As last year's Year 3's have already received the sacraments of 1st Reconciliation & 1st Eucharist in 2020, those sacramental programs will not now be available until 2022 for Yr 4 students.

Applications for Confirmation 2021 will be available from the weekend of February 20/21 via many platforms.

Enrollments will close on Monday, March 29.

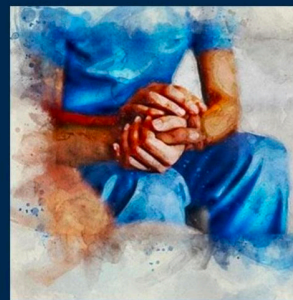

**A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians**

**Punishment will come to me if I do not preach the Gospel.**

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it! If I had chosen this work myself, I might have been paid for it, but as I have not, it is a responsibility which has been

put into my hands. Do you know what my reward is? It is this: in my preaching, to be able to offer the Good News free, and not insist on the rights which the gospel gives me.

So though I am not a slave of any man I have made myself the slave of everyone so as to win as many as I could. For the weak I made myself weak. I made myself all things to all men in order to save some at any cost; and I still do this, for the sake of the gospel, to have a share in its blessings.

## GOSPEL

### MK 1:29-39

**A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark**

**He cured many who suffered from diseases of one kind or another.**

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.

## SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

### BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

This text clearly states that Moses is the prophet par excellence. He received the word of the Lord in the form of the Law and acted as God's spokesperson by promulgating it. Several features mark

the prophet. First, the true prophet does not independently assume the role of spokesperson, but is raised up by God (vv.15, 18). Second, the prophet is not an outsider, but is called forth from among the people (v.15). Third, the message is not the prophet's, but is God's (v.18). Finally, because this prophet speaks God's words, in God's name, with God's authority, whoever disregards the message or speaks in the name of any other god is liable to divine punishment.

The psalm combines an invitation to praise, a plea for openness and a divine word. God is perceived as a rock of salvation, the creator and a shepherd caring for a flock. Because of their responsibility for the people, monarchs were often characterised as shepherds. These images of rock and shepherd illustrate the people's perception of God as protector. The psalmist issues a serious plea to be open to the voice of God 'today'. There is an appeal for a positive response, not in the spirit of rebellion that governed their ancestors while they were in the wilderness (cf. Exod 17:1-7; Deut 6:16). God desires hearts that are open, not hardened by selfishness or a lack of faith.

Paul firmly believed that the end was near. He did not outrightly oppose marriage, but the inevitability of the end suggested to him, that it would be better to be unmarried. He contrasts anxiety about the things of the Lord with anxiety about the things of the world. He knew that those involved in the world could still be committed to the Lord. He acknowledges that those married assume responsibility for the survival of the race, concerned with the things of this world so that the next generations can enjoy a prosperous future. He is careful to admit that he is giving an opinion and not an injunction that would impose restraints upon his hearers.

Following the custom of the time, Jesus took his turn teaching in the synagogue. The people were accustomed to the manner of teaching of the scribes, the official teachers who relied for their authority on the precedents already set by the teaching of others. Jesus, on the other hand, taught as one having authority in his own right. The people in the synagogue marvelled at this. The exorcism may have been an outward manifestation of this unusual authority. It describes a confrontation between good and evil. The evil spirit's acknowledgment of Jesus' superiority is confirmed by the question posed: Have you come to destroy us? Just as the people were astonished by the teaching of Jesus, so they are amazed at his power over the evil spirit.
