


FR GREG'S LETTER FOR THE WEEK.

This week Catholics and other Christians around the world will observe Ash Wednesday, which marks 40 days before Easter and the beginning of Lent. The number 40 indicates a period of change.

If you would like to observe this holy day according to the Catholic tradition, there are a number of rules which you should be familiar with.First, you should not eat meat on Ash Wednesday. The rule of abstinence from meat is binding upon Catholics who are aged 14 and over. Ash Wednesday is one of the two days in the year of obligatory fasting and abstinence for Roman Catholics (the other being Good Friday). Fasting means a person is permitted to eat one full meal in the

day. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but they are not to equal that of a full meal. This is obligatory for those aged 18 to 60.

Catholics often also receive ashes on their forehead on Ash Wednesday,




considered and heeded.

which reminds us of our mortality (often stated as, "we are dust and to dust we shall return"). While it is not considered a holy day of obligation, Catholics are encouraged to attend Mass on this day.

As we begin our Lenten journey on Ash Wednesday, let us ensure that we use this time for spiritual exercise and growth, by:

Prayer - for example, Mass attendance; family prayer; a visit to a church or chapel; reading the Bible; making the Stations of the Cross; praying the Rosary.

• Self-denial - for example, not eating meat; not eating sweets or dessert; giving up entertainment to spend time with the family; limiting food and drink so as to give to the poor.



Reconciliation - this will be available thirty minutes before each Mass during the week and on the weekend. St Patrick's Parish 2nd Rite of Reconciliation will be held on Thursday 25th March at 7pm.

Unfortunately this year, because of COVID-19 restrictions, we will not be able to run our lenten passport activity for the children. However, St Patrick's Lenten Reflections booklet will be available for everyone after each Mass on Sunday in the foyer, as well as on our website and Facebook page. You will also be able to download the booklet on your mobile phone.

I wish many blessings for those parishioners who will celebrate their birthdays or special anniversaries this week.

Barry is a Gamilaroi man originally from western NSW, who has transformed his life. Barry remembers his early years as a time of enormous hardship, fraught with poverty and despair. He didn't have a stable home or support network and his upbringing by grandparents all contributed to his vulnerable position.

Barry became a father in his late teens, suddenly facing responsibilities for which he wasn't ready. He began to drink heavily, mimicking behaviour he'd witnessed previously.

"I became an alcoholic from about 17 unknowingly, bingedrinking on weekends when I wasn't working." Barry says. "I was still holding onto some of that stuff of being abandoned, losing brothers and sisters, grief and loss. I was masking that all with alcohol, instead of dealing with it."

Thankfully, Barry and others like him, had the opportunity to participate in Red Dust Healing – a cultural healing program encouraging participants to examine their own personal hurt and allowing healing from within.

CONFIRMATION 2021

SUNDAY JUNE 6

Last year Bishop Randazzo made changes to the sacramental programs regarding the eligible age of candidates. From 2021, the eligible ages of candidates for the sacramental programs will be:

- Confirmation to children in Year 3.
- 1st Reconciliation to children in Year 4.
- 1st Eucharist to children in Year 4.

Therefore our 2020 Year 2's who missed out last year will now be eligible for confirmation this year.

As last year's Year 3's have already received the sacraments of 1st Reconciliation & 1st Eucharist in 2020, those sacramental programs will not now be available until 2022 for Yr 4 students.

Applications for Confirmation 2021 will be available from the weekend of February 20/21 via many platforms.

Enrollments will close on Monday, March 29.



LENTEN PENANCE

Lent is a preparation for Easter, the focal point of the Church's liturgical year. As we prepare for the most important of the Christian feasts we are reminded of the love that God has shown in sending Jesus to us. Lent is a time of thanksgiving for what God has done for us. Jesus' announcement that the Kingdom of God had come was a proclamation of the divine intervention which was intended to draw all humanity to a share in the divine life.

The preparation to receive the Kingdom is to repent: "Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is at hand." In the presence of Jesus, we are called to conversion. This is not just something that takes place once. Conversion is a continuing transformation of ourselves which opens us up more and more to God's presence in Jesus. Conversion is an ongoing reality in our lives.


We remember this especially at this time of Lent. Lent is a period in which we focus in a special way on turning our hearts towards God. To do this we must be ready to surrender ourselves. We need to find ways which are personally meaningful for us to bring about this surrender.

Practices of penance are meant to help us to come to openness to God. They need to be educative, transforming us so that our hearts may turn more easily to God. The choice of Lenten penance is important. It is not just what we do; it is why we do it, and the effect that it has on our lives. Choose wisely and Lent can become a time of many graces and significant growth in our relationship with God.

DAYS OF PENANCE

Abstinence from meat and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On all other Fridays of the year the law of the common practice of penance is fulfilled by performing the suggestion by Fr Greg on Page 1.

The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

Leprosy was a general term that covered a wide variety of chronic skin diseases. It caused skin to break thus exuding bodily fluids. The issue here is bodily boundaries, not hygiene. Since bodily fluids belonged within the body, emissions other than the normal functions of elimination were O come, ring out your joy, all you upright clearly out of place. Those with skin ailments were deemed unclean, were banished from the community, and were required to keep their distance from others, for anyone who had direct contact with someone or something unclean was considered unclean. Because social and religious alienation was so severe, it was believed that the condition was brought on by some kind of sin. Such thinking did not A reading from the first letter of St prevent Jesus from showing compassion.

> The psalm is one of the Penitential Psalms. The double statement of blessedness introduces wisdom teaching about the benefits of God's merciful pardon, which

is valued more highly than prosperity or reputation. Anyone so treated by God is truly blessed. This is not 'cheap grace'. Forgiveness is not given indiscriminately. Rather, it is given to those who have honestly sought forgiveness, who have admitted their sinfulness and have repented of it. The psalm ends with an exhortation to rejoice. If one is just, then rejoicing is not only encouraged, it is probably a spontaneous response to God's magnanimous mercy. The psalmist's experience of personal contrition and divine clemency is offered as an example for others to follow.

Paul describes the delicate balance that existed between the freedom he enjoyed because of his faith in Christ and his need to accommodate himself to those to whom he was preaching. He feared that they would be repelled by something that was not intrinsic to the gospel. The gospel is demanding enough. People did not need to be burdened with obligations extraneous to its message. Conflict occurred whenever the attitudes that operated within one religious system were transferred to another. Paul insists that neither Jewish dietary laws nor the assertion of one's freedom should be the governing principle in the lives of Christians. The glory of God and sensitivity to the consciences of others should be the driving force.

The man in the gospel suffered from some kind of skin ailment. Though socially alienated and ritually unclean, he did not adhere to the laws of purity. Instead, he boldly approached Jesus and begged to be made clean, not to be cured. Social and religious acceptability seem to be more important to him than physical healing. Since impurity was considered contagious, to touch the man would make Jesus unclean. But it didn't. Instead, Jesus' touch healed the man and restored him to the state of ritual purity. Because the people were captivated by the wonders he could perform, Jesus chose the seclusion of solitary places rather than the press of the crowd and their misunderstanding of his mission.
