IN OUR YEAR OF HOPE AT ST PATRICK'S.

How on earth does one live a life full of hope in today's world of greed, self entitlement and a lack of ethics shown by many in leadership? How do we live in hope following our own sin?

Is this the life God intended for us? Did God want us to lead a life of fear and dread of what others would do to us?

How does God allow such sin and the resulting bad that comes from evil?

Maybe the answer is fairly simple, God created us in his image and Loves us so much he gave us free will. God wants us to

We have the ability to choose to follow God and truly love Him. Genuine love can not be forced on those who have free will, but they can choose to love or not to love.

Following Adam and Eve eating the forbidden fruit (choosing to deviate from Gods will) the bible tells us that humanity, the descendants of Adam and Eve are separated from God. We can see by our own choices in life that we also separate ourselves from God. As a result we experience the folly of our ways and ultimately we can learn to mistrust God, by saying "Why does God allow this".

Surly our hope lies in God's love of us. God gave us Jesus his son, the second person of the trinity. Jesus lived his life on earth without falling into sin and gave up his life by way of crucification! Jesus then rose again.

Jesus came to us as fully human and fully God. He experienced all of the hardships and sufferings of living in a damaged world filled with broken people, just like us. But, he never sinned. This qualified Jesus to pay for all the wrongs of everyone throughout history. Through his perfect life, death and resurrection, God demonstrated his grace and love to His creation. We can't add to that perfect gift. Jesus erased our sin completely — past, present and future. However, it is up to us to bring our broken image to the repair shop to be fixed. Not only did Jesus pay the price on our behalf, but he did so willingly. That has to be true love for us and is the hope we can enjoy.

Romans 5:6-8 tells us that people might be willing to lay down their lives for a good person, but it is highly unusual for anyone to die for a scoundrel. Yet this is exactly what Jesus did on the cross for us. He died, not while we were very good — like we were at creation, but while we were very bad — and isn't that how we are now.

We have the choice to give into our pride, staying distant from God. This would mean we separate from God forever in Hell. Or, we can choose to accept what Jesus did for us and begin living free from the consequences of sin. This means we will spend eternity with him in heaven. Maybe we could rely on our own performance plan, or we can trust Jesus to do what we can't do for ourselves, the choice is up to us.



If we think about accepting the truth of what Jesus did for us, when we believe in the truth, does it not change the way we live our lives?

Accepting Christ means agreeing with him about our sin, asking him for forgiveness and inviting him to be the new leader of our lives. The decision to trust Jesus for our Salvation means abandoning all attempts to earn his love, but spending every day living in that love.

'You shall not bear false witness against Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken fortysix years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

> During his stay in Jerusalem for the Passover many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he gave, but Jesus knew them all and did not trust himself to them; he never needed evidence about any man; he could tell what a man had in him.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The commandments provide a sketch of the God with whom the people were in covenant, and they outlined how these covenanted people were to revere their God We are preaching a crucified Christ, and live with each other. Deliverance from

bondage to Egypt is the basis of conformity to the commandments. Commitment to the one God is the reason the Israelites were forbidden to revere other gods. Since one's name contained something of one's own identity, the vain use of God's name was considered a profanation of God's divine being. Observance of the Sabbath was rooted in the creation of the world. All the commandments are meant for adults, including the one to honour parents. Murder, adultery, stealing, lying and coveting all threaten the social fabric of the group.

Although the general theme of the psalm is praise, its tone is didactic and exhortative. It describes the blessings that acceptance of the law can impart. It both describes the law and persuades the people to embrace it as the will of God and to live in accord with it. The qualities associated with the law found in this psalm are some of the most highly prized attributes of any tradition. Each one of the statements in this psalm identifies the law as belonging to the Lord. The law that is praised here is not just any religious law; it is uniquely Israel's, because in a very specific way it represents the will of the all-holy God of Israel.

Paul criticises the Jews for their demand for signs and the Greeks for their preference for knowledge. He insists that the crucified Christ is the standard against which everything is judged. Though both traditions would reject a humiliated man, he argues that the vulnerable and debased Christ is in fact the power of God; the ridiculous and despised Christ is really the wisdom of God. In this light, it becomes clear that what the Jews and the Greeks rejected as foolishness was actually authentic wisdom, and what they cherished as wisdom was really misguided and folly. Those who are called and who are open to this call will be able to recognise it.

Jesus' actions in the temple are actedout prophecy and his words are prophetic forthtelling. With his actions and his words, Jesus makes a double claim. By driving the merchants out of the temple precincts, he announces that the time of fulfilment has come. Then, identifying God as his Father affirms his right to make such a claim and to act in accord with it. The Jews, most likely the temple authorities, demand that Jesus justify his actions. Playing on a word for temple, he predicts his death and resurrection. This corresponds to the earlier allusion to Zechariah and the replacement of the temple sacrifice by his own suffering. Only after the resurrection will the disciples understand this last saying.
