### YEAR OF THE FAMILY

As the fifth anniversary of his apostolic exhortation "Amoris Laetitia" approaches, Pope Francis announced that the Catholic Church will dedicate more than a year to focusing on the family and conjugal love.

During his Sunday Angelus address Dec. 27 2020, Pope Francis commemorated the feast of the Holy Family and said that it served as a reminder "of the example of evangelizing with the family" as highlighted in his exhortation "Amoris Laetitia".

Beginning March 19, he said, the year of reflection on "Amoris Laetitia" will be an opportunity "to focus more closely on the contents of the document."

"I invite everyone to take part in the initiatives that will be promoted during the year and that will be coordinated by the Dicastery for Laity, the Family and Life," he added. "Let us entrust this journey, with families all over the world, to the Holy Family of Nazareth, in particular to St. Joseph, the devoted spouse and father."

According to the dicastery's website, the "Amoris Laetitia Family" year "aims to reach every family around the world through several spiritual, pastoral and cultural proposals that can be implemented within parishes, dioceses, universities, ecclesial movements and family associations."

The dicastery said that the goals of the celebration include sharing the contents of the apostolic exhortation more widely, proclaiming the gift of the sacrament of marriage and enabling families to "become active agents of the family apostolate."

The "Amoris Laetitia Family" year will include forums, symposiums, video projects and catechesis as well as providing resources for family spirituality, pastoral formation and marriage preparation.

The commemoration will conclude June 26, 2022, "on the occasion of the World Meeting of Families in Rome," the dicastery said.

Francis already had declared a year of St. Joseph, which began Dec. 8 and ends Dec. 8, 2021.

In his Angelus talk, the pope said that the Holy Family is a model in which "all families of the world can find their sure point of reference and sure inspiration."

Through them, he said, "we are called to rediscover the educational value of the family unit; it must be founded on

the love that always regenerates relationships, opening up horizons of hope."

Families can experience sincere communion when they live in prayer, when forgiveness prevails over discord and "when the daily harshness of life is softened by mutual tenderness and serene adherence to God's will," he added.

"I would like to say something to you: If you quarrel within the family, do not end the day without making peace," the pope said. "And do you know why? Because cold war, day after day, is extremely dangerous. It does not help."

Francis also reflected on the theme of forgiveness during his Angelus address on the feast of St. Stephen Dec. 26.

Recalling St. Stephen's martyrdom, the pope said that although it may seem that his death was in vain, among those who witnessed and consented to his stoning was St. Paul, who eventually became "the greatest missionary in history."

Stephen's example "was the seed" of Paul's conversion, he said. "This is the proof that loving actions change history: even the ones that are small, hidden, every day."

Christians, he added, can become witnesses of Christ through their everyday actions, "even just by fleeing the shadow of gossip" or refusing to speak ill of others.

"When an argument starts at home, instead of trying to win it, let's try to diffuse it," and forgive one another, Francis said. Small efforts and gestures, he said, "change history because they open the door, they open the window to Jesus's light." <u>Click here for more information</u>

### **COVID UPDATE**

### FROM THE BISHOPS OFFICE

For celebrations and gatherings in our local communities, both liturgical and pastoral in nature, now we should endeavor to return to normal practices as much as possible, while remaining vigilant to the public health instructions



provided through the most recent COVID-19 Safety Plans. Over the past 12 months, we have all became quite adept at reading and applying health orders; I ask that you continue to do so. The following guidelines now take the place of any earlier COVID-19 guidelines provided by my office over the past 12 months.

For our liturgies, we remain limited with a cap on the number of people able to be welcomed, according to the 2sq metre principle. However, after clarification from NSW Health this principle applies to the total space of gathering in a church not just the area of the pews.

For the time being we will continue to refrain from a physical Sign of Peace and sharing the Chalice during the celebration of Mass. Until the Government provides new guidelines, we are also to remain limited in congregational singing. However, it is important that our choirs do sing the parts of the Mass and such elements as the Responsorial Psalm and Gospel Acclamation.

With an understanding of the COVID-19 regulations, it is quite possible to host parish events and gatherings, with slightly amended practices, ensuring that food is prepared in individual serves, <u>buffet serving is avoided</u>, and those serving wear gloves and are masked. This is especially the case for events such as morning teas or parish dinners.

### SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

### **BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA**

Jeremiah's oracle of salvation contains a message that is both inspiring and challenging. At the heart of its eschatological vision is the promise of a new covenant for a people who, because of their infidelities, had been chastened for a time but who would ultimately be restored. This new covenant is made with a sinful people. There is no mention of their repentance or reform, only of God's mercy and generosity. The technical covenant formula, 'I will be their God and they will be my people', marks the specificity and exclusivity of this relationship. God's words possess performative force; what God says, actually comes to be. The hope envisioned for the future begins to take shape in the present.

The penitential psalm consists of a plea for mercy in the face of guilt. Although it pleads that God might be gracious in view of the psalmist's transgressions, its primary focus is on God's goodness. The psalmist invokes God's covenant loyalty and compassion. This is followed by a prayer for inner renewal. Having previously rebelled and violated the covenant bond, the psalmist now begs for an intimate connection with God. The passage ends with a promise to teach other transgressors about God's loving-kindness and merciful love. As with most biblical laments, it begins with sentiments of distress and helplessness, moves through expressions of trust and confidence. and ends with declarations of thanksgiving for having been heard.

The second reading is confessional in nature. Each one of its three verses offers a slightly different view of biblical Christology. By taking on flesh, Jesus took on human limitations and weaknesses as well. His anguished prayer is probably an example of a righteous person's impassioned prayer. Though Son of God, Jesus learned what every human has to learn, namely, acceptance of God's will in the circumstances of life. Having learned it himself, he can now teach others to do the same. The surest way to learn this lesson, though perhaps the hardest, is through suffering. All of this becomes comprehensible when we examine Jesus' role as mediator of salvation. It was through his suffering that he saved us.

The gospel opens with the approach of some Greeks. Neither Jesus himself nor any of the disciples went out to them; they came on their own initiative. Mention of Greeks suggests the inclusion of the Gentile world in the salvation brought by Jesus. The 'hour' is the time of Jesus' anguish and also the hour of his exaltation. References to death and subsequent fruition apply not only to Jesus' situation but also to that of his followers. They too must be willing to die in order to live. The interior struggle that Jesus endured is revealed in his prayer. He prays that God's name might be glorified, even though this will be accomplished through his own death and exaltation.
