COVID UPDATE

FROM THE BISHOPS OFFICE

An excerpt from a letter dated March, 26 2021.

Important COVID Update

As we would be aware, the NSW Government has eased COVID restrictions, effective Monday 29 March. The implications of this development for our churches and



liturgies, especially for Holy Week, were outlined to us in a letter from Bishop Anthony on 18 March.

We have now received advice from the NSW Minister of Health about two important clarifications in respect to this.

The Minister has now granted an exemption to churches, such that congregational singing will be allowed on this weekend, i.e. before the 29 March.

In respect to the numbers of people able to be welcomed, Churches remain subject to the 2 square metre principle. The number of people able to join us therefore cannot be according to seating capacity, but to the number that the 2 square metre principle allows. Remember that this calculation is based on the total size of the building, not just the space of pews.

The Archbishop of Sydney is seeking an exemption to this ruling to allow 100 per cent capacity for all Catholic Churches in NSW for the Solemn Commemoration of the Passion on Good Friday afternoon. We will relay the outcome of this with you as soon as we have news.

Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy.

OUR FRIDAY HOSPITAL VISITING MINISTRY NEEDS YOUR ASSISTANCE

To refresh your memories, we have a team of volunteers who visit Catholic patients at Gosford Hospital on a Friday morning to touch base and determine if they would like communion brought to them on the Sunday by a different team. COVID hit and our teams could no longer function, and even though restrictions have eased we are not back to a full complement of visitors as some are still wary, and others have decided to retire. Sadly we can only visit fortnightly now due to the drop in numbers, and we would like more members so that we can reinstitute weekly visits. You may determine whether you would like to visit weekly, fortnightly or even monthly.

Those wishing to join this ministry should have a 40 hour CPE course certificate, or be happy to attend the next course in July, as well as the required vaccinations to protect themselves and the patients. If you are interested in this ministry, please contact the Parish Office.

ECUMENISM

SIGN THE SYDNEY STATEMENT

The Sydney Statement is an interfaith charter that details how to engage in interfaith relations with others – in daily life, in acting together for the common good, in sharing knowledge about each other's religions and spirituality – and to promote interreligious dialogue within one's own community. Youth PoWR (Parliament of the World's Religions) generated the content of the statement, approved its text, and authorized its publication. Everyone is invited to sign up to its values, principles and commitments on its dedicated website.

The Statement seeks to build bridges between believers of different faiths through a series of shared values and principles. It invites signatories to make twenty-one practical commitments based on these values and principles.

MEET OUR PARISH CATECHIST'S BARBARA MCCARTHY

What prompted you to become a Catechist?

For many years I had been a Sports Coach, I enjoyed being with the Children and coaching them the basics of Sport. One day a 'Sister of Saint Joseph' told me I could

use that knowledge to teach Children about God. I said "NO, I didn't know enough about my Religion to pass on to the Children" the Sister then asked me "Do you go to Mass? Do you pray? Do you know the Sacraments? Who was Mary and Joseph? Christmas? Easter? " I replied "Of course I know all those things" "Then you have the knowledge needed to pass it on"

Sister went on to explain to me there were Foundation courses to assist me to learn the basics of teaching, including Classroom Management. Manuals were supplied with lesson plans, Children's activity books were also supplied for each week's lesson. Everything was ready to go.

Well that was a 'few' years ago now and I have learnt a lot about my Faith. I have been enriched by the Children I have taught. Sometimes it has not been easy, and I think maybe I should give it up, but then the Holy Spirit steps in, along comes a New Year, new kids and here we go again.

Which age group do you most like to engage with, why, what takes place in your lesson?

The students call me Mrs Mac.

I begin my class with a Prayer, I then tell the students the subject of the lesson. I usually get some response about what they can remember or blank faces, as I teach year 6, most of what they are hearing they have heard somewhere else or is something for them to debate or a subject to make them think. I love listening to their thoughts. I can have some serious debates; some that can make you laugh or cry. You never know what will come up. We then use the Student activity books and finish with a Prayer. Then, Bye till next week. Amen.

MK 15:1-39

The passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

First thing in the morning, the chief priests together with the elders and the scribes, in short the whole Sanhedrin, had their plan ready. They had Jesus bound and took him away and handed him over to Pilate.

Pilate questioned him, 'Are you the king of the Jews?' 'It is you who say it' he answered. And the chief priests brought many accusations against him. Pilate questioned him again, 'Have you no reply at all? See how many accusations they are bringing against you!' But to Pilate's amazement, Jesus made no further reply.

At festival time Pilate used to release a prisoner for them, anyone they asked for. Now a man called Barabbas was then in prison with the rioters who had committed murder during the uprising. When the crowd went up and began to ask Pilate the customary favour, Pilate answered them, 'Do you want me to release for you the king of the Jews?' For he realised it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had handed Jesus over. The chief priests, however, had incited the crowd to demand that he should release Barabbas for them instead. The Pilate spoke again. 'But in that case,' he said to them 'what $\bar{\text{am}}$ I to do with the man you call king of the Jews?' They shouted back, 'Crucify him!' 'Why?' Pilate asked them 'What harm has he done?' But they shouted all the louder, 'Crucify him!' So Pilate, anxious to placate the crowd, released Barabbas for them and, having ordered Jesus to be scourged, handed him over to be crucified.

the palace, that is, the Praetorium, and called the whole cohort together. They dressed him in purple, twisted some thorns into a crown and put it on him. And they began saluting him, 'Hail, king of the Jews!' They struck his head with a reed and spat on him; and they went down on their knees to do him homage. And when they had finished making fun of him, they took off the purple and dressed him in his own clothes.

They led him out to crucify him. They enlisted a passer-by, Simon of Cyrene, father of Alexander and Rufus, who was coming in from the country, to carry his cross. They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha, which means the place of the skull.

They offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he refused it. Then they crucified him, and shared out his clothing, casting lots to decide what each should get. It was the third hour when they crucified him. The inscription giving the charge against him read: 'The King of the Jews.' And they crucified two robbers with him, one on his right and one on his left.

The passers-by jeered at him; they shook their heads and said, 'Aha! So you would destroy the Temple and rebuild it in three days! Then save yourself: come down from the cross!' The chief priests and the scribes mocked him among themselves in the same way. 'He saved others,' they said 'he cannot save himself. Let the Christ, the king of Israel, come down from the cross now, for us to see it and believe.' Even those who were crucified with him taunted him.

When the sixth hour came there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?' which means, 'My God, my God, why have you deserted me?' When some of those who stood by heard this they said, 'Listen, he is calling on Elijah'. Someone ran and soaked a sponge in vinegar and, putting it on a reed, gave it him to drink saying, 'Wait and see if Elijah will come to take him down.' But Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last.

All kneel and pause a moment.

And the veil of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The centurion, who was standing in front of him, had seen how he had died, and he said, 'In truth this man was a son of Cod'.
