On that first Easter Sunday morning, as relayed by the Gospel of John, the world seemed a dark place for Mary Magdalene, Simon Peter and the beloved disciple. But they gradually woke up to a new vision of life. They saw the tomb, now empty. They saw the cloths that had wrapped the body of Jesus. And then they encountered the risen Lord.

Jesus' resurrection from the dead is not simply a fact of history to share at Easter. It is a mystery to be lived out everyday of our lives. As Christians, we are just as inspired by the presence of Jesus among us today as those who first saw the empty tomb.

Like them, we know that Jesus is not found among the dead. He lives among us in the community gathered to celebrate the Holy Eucharist. He lives in the Gospel proclaimed by our words and deeds. Through the Sacraments of the Church, he gathers disciples, heals the sick, reconciles sinners and calls us to serve others. In the Church's outreach, it is the hand of Jesus that lifts up the poor, feeds the hungry, shelters the homeless and visits the lonely. In these ways, and many others, we give witness to the mystery of Jesus living among us. Indeed, we truly become the Body of Christ for the world.

This Easter mystery cannot be lived in isolation. It requires the bonds of community to support us and to challenge us. Every Sunday the Church gathers as the Body of Christ at the table of God's Word and the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, the source of our life in Christ. We gather every Sunday as active participants in the life of our resurrected Lord. In our parish there are opportunities for everyone to encounter the risen Christ. All young people, families, men, women and seniors have a great opportunity to come together to build friendships and learn more about the Church and faith. Please find more details about groups and ministries, which can further develop this, inside the bulletin today.

St Patrick's parishioners, the Parish Pastoral Council, Fr Paul and I welcome you, and indeed invite you, to be the Body of Christ for the world with us. If you feel

CHRISM MASS AT THE CATHEDRAL

On Tuesday Night, bishop Anthony, joined by the priests of the diocese, gathered at the Cathedral to celebrate the Chrism Mass. This Mass manifests the unity of the priests with their bishop.

Here the bishop blesses three oils — the oil of catechumens, the oil of the infirm (sick) and holy chrism — which will be used in the administration of the sacraments throughout the diocese for the year.

Each parish is given containers of these oils which are used in the parish through out the coming year.

Gosford Parish has been entrusted to the loving care of the Society of the Divine Saviour since 2002. We have been blessed in our Parish to have been pastorally supported by many wonderful Salvatorian Priests, mostly from Poland, but also from Germany and more recently Vietnam.

Under the guidance of our Parish Priest, Fr Greg Skulski and his assistant Fr Paul Tran, St Patrick's has continued to be a dynamic and alive parish with many wonderful initiatives, that provide opportunities for all parishioners to develop their relationship with, and be the face of Jesus in our community.

Over the past few years our many parish ministries have grown with increased support and new ministries have emerged to meet the needs of our vibrant parish community.

Our ministries include a Senior Ministry group that tends to the spiritual needs of our elderly community in both private homes and nursing home facilities. They have regular meetings and outings that provide a wonderful vehicle for connection to the parish for those less active and mobile. An extension of this group is the wonderful men and women who regularly visit Gosford Hospital to sit and spend time with members of our community that are unwell.

The parish supports numerous prayer and bible study groups. This has been a particular passion of Fr Paul's and he has bought his knowledge and passion to others and encourages the spiritual growth of many in the parish. Our Children's Liturgy group is well supported by both the number of children attending and the adult parishioners that give their time to develop the understanding of the Jesus story to our younger parishioners, in both a fun and authentic way.

Gosford Parish has an active MenAlive ministry which encourages a strengthening of and rejuvenation of faith in God for men within the parish. It supports them to be an active force of renewal in the Church and Parish community. We have a Women's group that meets to pray together regularly and provides opportunities to discuss issues specific to women in the Church community. We also have a family group that meets regularly, allowing an opportunity for parents and couples to pray and grow in their faith in communion with other parishioners.

Pope Francis reminds us that the youth of the Church "are not the future they are the now of God". It is in this spirit, and with the tremendous energy of Fr Greg, Gosford Parish has developed and supported a significant number of groups to provide young people an opportunity to express their faith and grow in relationship with God. These groups include a Years 5/6 youth group, Youth group for high school students, and a Young Adults group. Each group provides immense vitality and opportunities for our young people to get to know Christ more deeply.

Gosford Parish strives to live the charism of Fr Francis Jordan, founder of the Salvatorians, who challenges us "not to rest content until all people know, love, and serve Jesus as their Saviour".

GOSPEL

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

The teaching of scripture is that he must rise from the dead.

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

Peter describes the scope of the spread of the gospel. Although Jesus' ministry had a beginning - his baptism by John - it does not seem to have an end. It continues through those commissioned to preach the gospel and to bear witness to it. This is precisely what Peter does; he bears witness to the resurrection (v.40) and proclaims the universality of its effects (v.42). Peter insists that Jesus' resurrection was a work of God, a genuine resurrection from the dead and not merely a resuscitation. The appearances of the risen Christ were authentic experiences and not hallucinations. Finally, appointed by God, Jesus fulfils the eschatological role of the judge of the living and the dead (v.42; cf. Dan 7:1).

The responsorial psalm praises God's power and victory, which make manifest God's goodness and mercy. The Hebrew word for mercy (hesed) is a technical term denoting God's steadfast love for God's covenant partners. God is depicted as a mighty warrior whose strong hand prevails over forces that threaten the security of the people and the very life of the psalmist. Thus, the psalmist announces abroad the mighty works of the Lord. The final image describes a reversal of fortune. The stone that was rejected becomes the very foundation of the entire building. Salvation was brought about by God and is recognised as a marvel for which to give praise and thanks.

The second reading contains the fundamental teaching about the resurrection and the way it transforms the lives of Christians. Set against the backdrop of ancient cosmology, it delineates between the world below (earth) and the world above (heaven). Having risen from the dead, Christ is now in the realm of heaven where he sits at God's right hand. There he is 'in God'. Believers have died and risen with Christ and are, therefore, summoned to a life that reflects this new reality. Though still in this world, they must be attentive to the things of another world. Actually, they now live in two worlds or, to use eschatological language, they have already entered 'the age to come'.
