UNITED IN MISSION

The Salvatorian Family is an expression of the charism, the gift of the Spirit given to Father Francis Jordan for the Church. We trace our common roots back to the Apostolic Teaching Society, founded by Father Jordan on 8 December 1881 in Rome. Diocesan priests were its first members. Therese von Wüllenweber (later Blessed Mother Mary of the Apostles) committed herself to this Society in 1882. Large numbers of laity of all ages joined this foundation.

Today the Salvatorian Family has three autonomous branches:

- † Society of the Divine Saviour
- † Congregation of the Sisters of the Divine Saviour,
- † International Community of the Divine Saviour.

We are united by our commitment to the mission as envisioned by our Founder, forming one family of zealous apostles who announce to all the salvation that has appeared in Jesus Christ. (Titus 3:4) Just as Father Jordan's original project evolved over time, we are open to where the Spirit will lead us in the future.

We live our call in equality and complementarity in ways appropriate to our diverse states in life, gifts, and cultures.

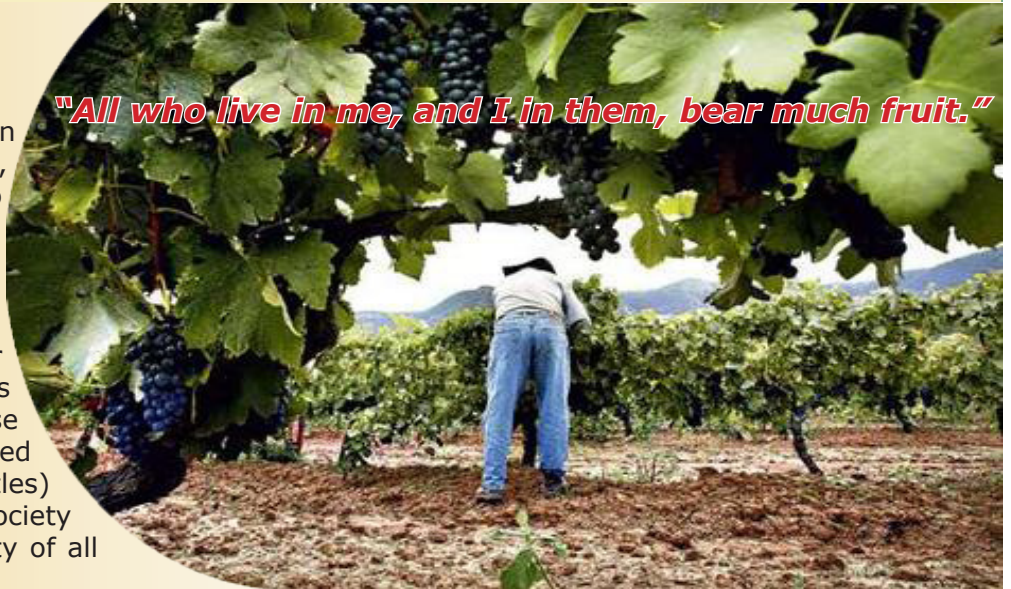
SOCIETY OF THE DIVINE SAVIOUR

We are called to become saints and to work in order that others become saints

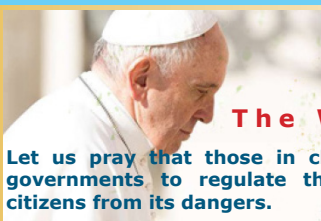

Let them, therefore, be mindful above all that all our progress is the work of divine grace, which they should in unceasing prayer implore for themselves from the Father of all light." (Rules 1882)

SISTERS OF THE DIVINE SAVIOUR

Also known as Salvatorian Sisters, are a worldwide community of religious women. We collaborate with other members of our Salvatorian Family (Salvatorian Priests and Brothers; Salvatorian Laity – married and single), sharing a particular spirit of universality inherited from our Founder, Father Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan. We come from many cultures and nations. We choose to live by common values, work for the same goals, and share resources. This is one important way we witness to Christian gospel values

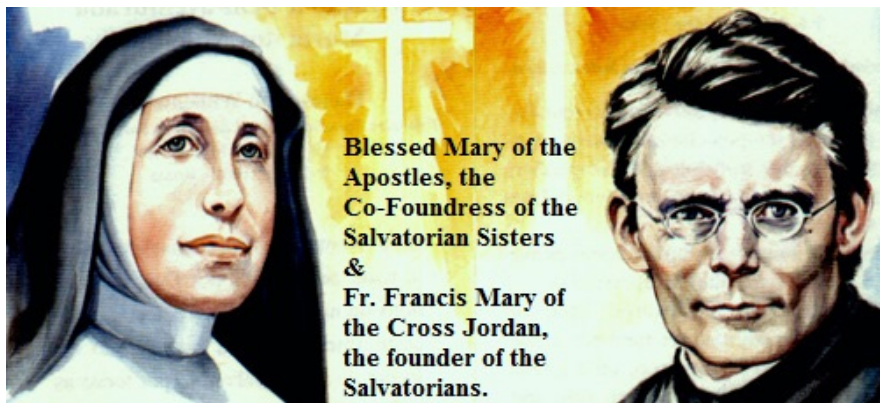
Through our life style and humanitarian service we express our conviction that God loves humanity in all its diversity. We respect values within all cultures and religions that promote full human development for each person and social grouping. We are motivated to work for justice by our commitment to empower people forgotten on the margins of society.

HISTORY

The Congregation of the Sisters of the Divine Savior was the second foundation established by Fr. Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan. In 1881 Fr. Jordan founded the Society of the Divine Savior, then known as the Apostolic Teaching Society, in Rome. His ultimate goal was to involve people from all walks of life to work together for the advancement of religious faith. He believed in service to the local church and to the spreading of faith in mission countries.

Jordan was convinced that all professional means should be directed toward strengthening the faith of all people, so that their primary goal in life would be achieved – to know Jesus Christ in order to experience the God of Love and Life. Jordan hoped to involve the laity as equal partners in this apostolic mission within the church and society. These convictions gave rise to the spirit of universality that now marks all Salvatorians (the common name used by the religious and lay members of the Salvatorian Family).

Therese von Wüllenweber, a German baroness, met and shared Jordan's vision. The Congregation began in 1888. By 1890 Fr. Jordan sent Priests and Brothers to serve in Northeast India. In 1891 Mother Mary of the Apostles, as Therese was then known, sent Sisters to work with the women and children of the new Indian mission.

Mother Mary of the Apostles loved the missions. She felt that women should be able to serve as true collaborators in every type of apostolic work, with special attention directed toward the needs of women and children. Within a few years the small

group of Sisters moved from Tivoli, Italy, where they had begun, to Rome. Today Rome continues to be a gathering place for all Salvatorians.

INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY OF THE DIVINE SAVIOUR.

Lay Salvatorians are men and women, married or single, who have God at the center of their lives; people who have the ability to lead, transforming their environment by the way they live, defenders of life, human rights and all of God's creation; people who, with their lives, give testimony of God's kingdom and find strength by sharing in spiritual community with other Salvatorians.

They are united with Society of the Divine Saviour and Congregation of the Sisters of the Divine Saviour, by a public commitment to the mission as envisioned by our Founder, Father Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan, forming one family of zealous apostles, announcing to all the salvation that has appeared in Jesus Christ (John 17:3). The Lay Salvatorians share their vocation in equality and complementary with the other members of the Salvatorian Family.

Beg of the Holy Spirit that you may become people of prayer, that you may observe the precept of the Divine Saviour.

Pray continually and never lose heart.

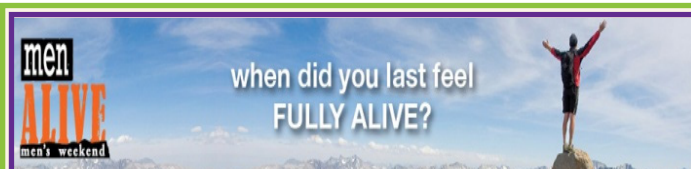

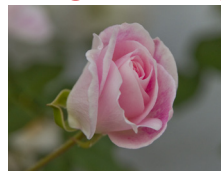

REFLECTION

BY FR MICHAEL TATE

Spiritual Drink

We are too familiar with today's gospel. Christ is the vine and we are the branches, sometimes in need of a good pruning. But God's purpose is not to produce a perfect vineyard. It is to produce a full-bodied wine at the end of history.

There is a foretaste of this at every Mass. The wine we offer – 'fruit of the earth and work of human hands' – becomes the spiritual drink which best serves the purpose of our Heavenly Father. How does this happen?

For the Jewish people observing an animal whose throat is cut, it is obvious that the life drains out with the blood. 'Life' and 'blood' became synonyms. So, when the Jewish Jesus says of the wine in the chalice at the Last Supper: 'This is my blood', amongst other things he is saying: 'This is my life force, this is my very life given unreservedly for you.'

So, when we drink from the chalice at Holy Communion, the life of the Risen Lord courses through our bodies just as the sap of the vine courses through its branches. We share the same ultimate vitality so that our bodily existence builds into the Body of Christ. He becomes truly 'full-bodied' as the Divine Vignerons desires.

We could take a moment to pray that we respond to the pruning and the tending and the pressing by our Heavenly Father so as to contribute our distinctive character to the vintage at the end of history, the spiritual drink of the Kingdom of Heaven.

Rev Prof Michael Tate graduated in Law from the University of Tasmania in 1968, and in Theology from Oxford University in 1971. He lectured at the University of Tasmania from 1972-78, being Dean of the Faculty of Law in 1977-78. He was a Senator for Tasmania from 1978-93, being Federal Minister for Justice from 1987-93. He served as Ambassador to The Hague and the Holy See from 1993-96. He then returned to Australia and was ordained in May 2000 and has been a parish priest in the Archdiocese of Hobart since then. He is an Honorary Professor of Law at the University of Tasmania where he lectures in International Humanitarian Law.

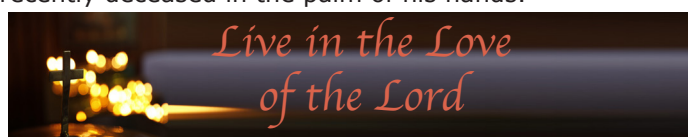
