ACT OF HOPE PRAYER

Act of Hope O my God, relying on Thy infinite goodness and promises, I hope to obtain pardon of my sins, the help of Thy grace, and life everlasting, through the merits of Jesus Christ, my Lord and Redeemer. Amen.

CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH:

"Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the Kingdom of Heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit...poured out upon us richly through Jesus Christ our Saviour, so that we might be justified by His grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life'" (CCC 1817). Note: Theological means that this gift comes from God and leads us back to God. A virtue is an habitual and firm disposition to do the good. Supernatural means that the virtue is above our nature.



The virtue of hope responds to the aspiration to happiness which God has placed in the heart of every person; it takes up the hopes that inspire our activities and purifies them so as to order them to the Kingdom of Heaven. We receive the supernatural gift of hope from God in Baptism. The supernatural virtue of hope allows the possibility for Christians to trust in God. This grace is a gift of God, infused by Him. Hope has to do with things that seem difficult or impossible to receive, such as salvation.

The gift of hope given by God never disappoints. Hope tells us that God, Who promised us eternal salvation, will also give us the graces that we need for the journey to Heaven. He is faithful to His word, so we can put our trust in Him. Faith assists us to hope in God and His promise that He will always remain with us.

Hope sustains us at all times, especially when feelings of discouragement or abandonment seem to overwhelm us. In addition, hope keeps us from discouragement. Hope opens up our heart in expectation of future blessings and eternal beatitude.


Buoyed up by hope, we are preserved from turning inward in selfishness and led to the happiness that flows from living charity.

Why do we need the supernatural virtue of hope?

God is almighty, merciful and good. The supernatural gift of hope helps us to trust in God's promises, opening our heart to His mercy. Hope ensures the desire written on our heart by God to attain the glory of Heaven promised by God to those who love Him and do His

PASTORAL DISCERNMENT PROJECT - CENTRAL COAST

AN APPOINTMENT BY BISHOP ANTHONY RANDAZZO

TO OUR VERY OWN PATTI BEATTIE

At this week's Clergy Conference, and as part of the 35th anniversary of the Diocese of Broken

Bay, I invited the region of the Central Coast to engage a process of pastoral discernment, recognising its particular pastoral circumstances, opportunities and challenges. This project of pastoral discernment envisages a sustained and prayerful study of the various factors which give the region of Central Coast its unique character. These identify the region as a specificterritory for pastoral mission, and as a particular context for a renewed proclamation of the Gospel, for evangelisation and catechesis, and for pastoral creativity.

The aim of this initiative is to renew the life of the Church in this region of the Diocese, ensuring a sustainable and thriving ecclesial community. In initiating this work, the project and its process may provide a future template for discernment in other regions of the Diocese.

I'm pleased to announce that Mrs Patti Beattie has been seconded from Catholic Schools

Broken Bay (CSBB) as the Pastoral Facilitator to coordinate and animate the project. Patti is an experienced leader with exceptional organisational, technology and communication skills with over 25 years of teaching experience in Broken Bay Diocese.

This is a major strategic pastoral initiative, to be conducted over several phases. It will require the support and commitment of a range of persons and agencies across the Diocese and the integration of several existing planning processes.

The pastoral discernment will be launched in the second half of 2021 with a timeline of 12 months to complete. In the coming months I will formally launch the project and communicate with you further the various processes that the project envisages to engage the People of God in the region of the Central Coast throughout this discernment.

Please join me in praying for the success of this important initiative.





And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

The reading from Job reports a theophany, a self-revelation of God. Using questions, God leads Job into a deeper appreciation of God's own self and enables him to look beyond the natural world that he knows and to consider the forces of nature in a new way. Such insights filled Job with both confidence in God and courage in the face of threats to his safety. This section from God's speech to Job addresses God's power over the primordial waters, a common symbol for chaos. Job may not have been present at God's cosmological victory, but he is certainly able to appreciate the order that was born of it.

A reading from the second letter of St In the responsorial psalm, God is praised for saving those in dangerous waters (vv.23-24). Sea (yâm) is the name of a Canaanite deity who threatened the order of the world. Defeated by God, it was bound, but never completely destroyed. Therefore it remains a constant threat until the end of time when it will finally be defeated (cf. Rev 21:1). Until then, only one with the power of the divine primordial warrior can keep the monster leashed.

of the Lord in re-harnessing threatening force. With no effort at all the Lord quells the fury as one would hush a restless babe in swaddling bands (cf. Job

Paul is compelled both to accept the significance of faith in Jesus' death and resurrection and to preach this message to others. He draws several contrasts to make his point. Using the Adam tradition, he argues that as Adam brought death to all, so Christ brings life to all. This insight into the mystery of the resurrection enables believers to judge no longer 'according to the flesh' but with new eyes. Transformed by the death and resurrection of Jesus they are now a new creation. Paul alludes to the eschatological distinction between this age and the age to come, when all things will be brought to fulfilment and the reign of God will be established completely and forever.

It is not by accident that the powers of chaotic water are harnessed in this nature miracle. In several ancient Near Eastern myths (e.g., Enuma Elish), the powers of chaos are portrayed as personified monsters of the deep. The gospel writer portrays Jesus as the one who alone can triumph over chaotic water. The disciples certainly recognised this, for they ask: Who has power over the sea? This is not an idle query. This question captures the gist of the account: Who is this man? By what authority does he act? This was doubly an issue, because Jesus did not invoke the power of God before he spoke or acted; he simply spoke or acted and left to those around him to decide about him for themselves.

Dianne Bergant CSA was a Professor of Biblical Studies at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, where she taught from 1978 to 2014. She holds a BS in Elementary Education from Marian College, Fond du Lac, WI; an MA and PhD in Biblical Languages and Literature from St Louis University. Amongst other things, she served as President of Catholic Biblical Association of America (2000-2001) and has been awarded honorary doctorates from several other universities. She was an active member of the Chicago Catholic/ Jewish Scholars Dialogue (1988-2017) and sat on the editorial boards of The Bible (1979-2005), Biblical Today Theology Bulletin (1990-2014), Catholic Biblical Quarterly (1992-2001), New Theology Review (1997-2003), Teaching Theology and Religion (2003-2005), and Chicago Studies (2003-2009). She has taught and lectured in many places in the United States and abroad and has written numerous books, articles and chapters in books.
