
- We already know of many expenses that will be required this year, for example:

OUR HOSPITAL VISITATION TEAMS NEED YOU!

Sadly COVID also affected our hospital visitation team numbers as many had to withdraw with concerns for their health. Resulting in only fortnightly visits by the Friday team, who gather names for the Sunday visitors. The Sunday visitors take communion to the patients nominated by the Friday team. We would love to go back to weekly visits but need more members to share the load.

NSW Health standards must be met when visiting, which requires completing the relevant Pastoral Education course and the necessary immunisations. The parish will cover course costs upon a commitment to proceed in the ministry. If you have any questions, please call the Parish Office.

COVID-19 UPDATE



With the current COVID outbreak in Sydney continuing to grow, Bishop Anthony advises us of the following;

The NSW Government has introduced the following measures, effective immediately, 23 June 2021 (enforceable from 4pm) until 12:01am Thursday, 1 July for the Greater Sydney region which now includes the Central

Coast, as well as Wollongong and Blue Mountains.

To this end Bishop Anthony places before us for the coming weekend:

- 1. Church Capacity is subject to the 1 person per 4 Square metre rule. This will reduce your current capacity by 50%. Please ensure thorough check in records or QR codes are used.
- Congregational singing should not occur. From the government directive, it seems possible, however, for a cantor or a small choir to sing, provided that they are socially distanced, and it is certainly possible for music, such as an organ or other instruments, to be played. How this might occur will need to be the decision of each parish priest.
- 3. Masks need to be worn by all who are present in the church as has been our experience in the past, as well as any gathering outside. Priests or deacons who are presiding may remove their mask whilst engaging in presidential prayers. Please note that masks are also compulsory inside other non-residential buildings in the parish, including the parish office.
- 4. Social gatherings after Mass should be limited to avoid mingling, so as to be careful not to put our most vulnerable at risk.

Please continue to be aware of COVID-Safe behaviours such as the practice of good hand hygiene, Physical distancing and QR code check ins which continue to keep our communities safe. Encourage anyone with symptoms of COVID-19, even mild symptoms, to get tested at a COVID-19 testing clinic and not leave their home until a negative test is received. This includes people who have visited a confirmed COVID-19 case location in NSW or interstate during a specific time period.

Finally, please remain vigilant to information from NSW Health, particularly in relation the locations of current COVID-19 cases. We will continue to monitor the situation and will share further details as required.



ANNOUNCEMENT – APPOINTMENT OF CHANCELLOR & EXECUTIVE OFFICER TO THE RISHOP



In March 2021 I wrote to you all to mark the thirty-fifth anniversary of the founding of our Diocese. While we commemorate the past it is important that we continue to direct our gaze to the future with a particular focus on our mission as a community of disciples of the Lord.

At the service on this focus on mission, I have recently realigned some of the structures and roles within the Chancery. The initial stage in that realignment included reshaping the team of Evangelisation Broken Bay and the appointment of a Diocesan-wide Director of Communications. It has also included the appointment of a Pastoral Facilitator to support a process of pastoral discernment on the Central Coast as recently announced.

Throughout this time I have also turned my mind to aligning the Office of the Bishop. Amongst my priorities is an outward focus of my own office with strong collaboration and unity between Parishes, the Chancery, Catholic Schools Broken Bay and CatholicCare Broken Bay.

To this end, I am delighted to announce that Mrs Kelly Paget has been appointed to the new role of Chancellor & Executive Officer, Office of the Bishop. Well known to you, Kelly has assisted me since my installation as the Bishop of the Diocese of Broken Bay and has already been instrumental in supporting me as my Executive Officer and as a key advisor since that time. I am most appreciative of the enormous support she has provided me. Kelly's dedication to the community of the Church of Broken Bay as well as her own personal faith commitment to the Catholic Church is something to be much admired.

While the new role includes the canonical responsibilities of the Chancellor the role also has responsibility for leading and coordinating the Office of the Bishop staff, liaising with internal and external parties, assisting with public relations as well as managing various projects. In her new role, Kelly will have an even stronger and collaborative working relationship with the Vicar General, the Director of Evangelisation Broken Bay and the Director of Communications, as well as the Executive Director of CatholicCare Broken Bay, Director of Catholic Schools Broken Bay and all the Chancery Directors, as together they assist me to lead and implement the pastoral priorities of the Diocese.

Please join me in congratulating Kelly on her appointment as Chancellor & Executive Officer.

Kelly will commence in her new role on Thursday, 1 July 2021.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Young girl, I say to you, arise.

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him.

Some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kum!' which means, 'little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.

REFLECTION BY FR MICHAEL TATE

Jesus is on his way to fulfil the request of a named male synagogue official who has given voice on behalf of his ill daughter. Jesus is stopped in his tracks by an unnamed voiceless female who has been ostracised from the social and religious life of the town.

Part of her healing is to get her voice back. She tells Jesus everything and he addresses her with the beautiful title, 'daughter'. Imagine the joy of this woman hearing such a term of affectionate relationship. Jesus went on: '... your faith has made you whole: go in peace and be healed of your disease.'

Jesus did not regard this as an interruption to his journey to heal the daughter of Jairus. Stopping was an absolute priority subverting the expectations and power structures of society. The healing presence of Jesus was, and is, radically egalitarian.

Perhaps we could take a moment to pray that we have the courage to touch the hem of our lord's cloak in confession. There we can tell him everything which has left us illat-ease in our relationship with god, our fellow human beings and in ourselves. With confidence in his divine power, we can ask him to heal the dis-ease in some part of our personality. Hear him respond: "daughter (or son), your faith has made you whole: go in peace and be healed of your disease". Then, share in the joy of the woman of our gospel story.

He lectured at the university of Tasmania from 1972-78, being dean of the faculty of law in 1977-78. He was a senator for Tasmania from 1978-93, being federal minister for justice from 1987-93. He served as ambassador to the Hague and the holy see from 1993-96. He then returned to Australia and was ordained in may 2000 and has been a parish priest in the archdiocese of Hobart since then. He is an honorary professor of law at the university of Tasmania where he lectures in international humanitarian law.
