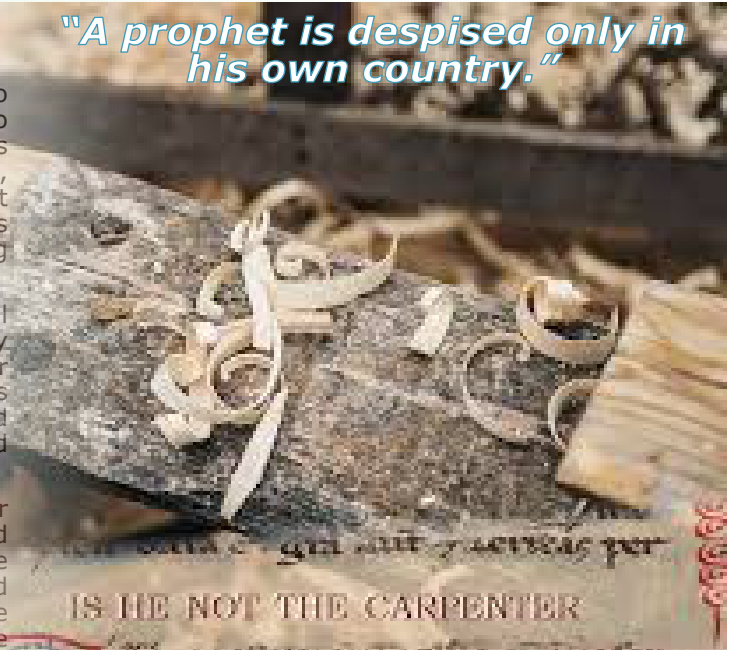
- We already know of many expenses that will be required this year, for example:

COVID UPDATE

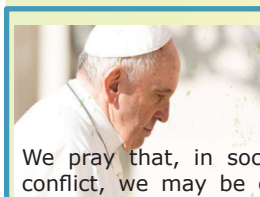
STAY AT HOME ORDER IS SCHEDULED TO END ON FRIDAY 9TH JULY.

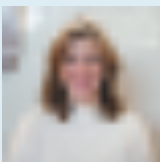

COVID-19 UPDATE REPEAT FROM LAST WEEK

With the current COVID outbreak in Sydney continuing to grow, Bishop Anthony advises us of the following;

The NSW Government has introduced the following measures, effective immediately, 23 June 2021 (enforceable from 4pm) until 12:01am Thursday, 1 July for the Greater Sydney region which now includes the Central Coast, as well as Wollongong and Blue Mountains.

To this end Bishop Anthony places before us for the coming weekend:

1. Church Capacity is subject to the 1 person per 4 Square metre rule. This will reduce your current capacity by 50%. Please ensure thorough check in records or QR codes are used.
2. Congregational singing should not occur. From the government directive, it seems possible, however, for a cantor or a small choir to sing, provided that they are socially distanced, and it is certainly possible for music, such as an organ or other instruments, to be played. How this might occur will need to be the decision of each parish priest.
3. Masks need to be worn by all who are present in the church as has been our experience in the past, as well as any gathering outside. Priests or deacons who are presiding may remove their mask whilst engaging in presidential prayers. Please note that masks are also compulsory inside other non-residential buildings in the parish, including the parish office.
4. Social gatherings after Mass should be limited to avoid mingling, so as to be careful not to put our most vulnerable at risk.



Please continue to be aware of COVID-Safe behaviours such as the practice of good hand hygiene, Physical distancing and QR code check ins which continue to keep our communities safe. Encourage anyone with symptoms of COVID-19, even mild symptoms, to get tested at a COVID-19 testing clinic and not leave their home until a negative test is received. This

includes people who have visited a confirmed COVID-19 case location in NSW or interstate during a specific time period.

Finally, please remain vigilant to information from NSW Health, particularly in relation the locations of current COVID-19 cases. We will continue to monitor the situation and will share further details as required.

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER SUNDAY 4 JULY 2021

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday will be celebrated throughout Australia this Sunday 4 July.

Every year, Catholics come together across Australia to acknowledge and

celebrate the gifts of Australia's First Peoples in the Catholic Church. This year, NATSICC has decided to adopt the NAIDOC theme for 2021 - 'Heal Country', acknowledging that today our world is in need of healing - environmentally, spiritually and socially.

A 24-page, full-colour resource booklet for 2021 has been designed to assist schools, parishes and organisations with these celebrations.

The NATSICC Liturgy team has compiled prayers, liturgy suggestions, Universal Prayers, homily notes and statistics for this purpose.

Additionally, there is a practical activity that calls for Catholics around Australia to knit / crochet blankets for the NATSICC Palliative Care package program.

Jesus went to his home town and his disciples accompanied him. With the coming of the sabbath he began teaching in the synagogue and most of them were astonished when they heard him. They said, 'Where did the man get all this? What is this wisdom that has been granted him, and these miracles that are worked through him? This is the carpenter, surely, the son of Mary, the brother of James and Joset and Jude and Simon? His sisters, too, are they not here with us?' And they would not accept him. And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them. He was amazed at their lack of faith.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The call and commission of the prophet Ezekiel are recounted in today's first reading. Ezekiel does not assume the role of prophet to himself. It is God who sends him, to the people that God selects, with the message that God determines. God has chosen a mere human (son of man) to accomplish God's designs. This experience of God is not a reassuring one for Ezekiel. He is told that the Israelites, to whom he is being sent, are a rebellious people, hard of face and obstinate of heart. Still, whether they resist the prophet or heed him, they will know that there has been a prophet among them, because of the dire consequences their rebelliousness will bring upon them.

The sentiments of the psalmist are clearly stated at the outset. Lifting up one's eyes is a gesture of humble longing. God dwells in the heavens and reigns from there as a king governs from the throne. The psalmist attends to God as a diligent household servant attends to the hands of the master and mistress. The people who have turned to God for help are overwhelmed by the disdain they suffer. They still turn to God with confidence, trusting that this sovereign God who reigns over all will snatch them from their

predicament and be openhanded in bestowing the favours that they need.

Paul situates his apostleship within the paradox of the cross of Jesus. He knows that it is foolish to allow himself to become proud of any spiritual favours he has received. Lest this might happen, he is stricken with a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan. What this affliction might have been is not clear. Paul prayed to be relieved of his affliction, but was told: 'Power is made perfect in weakness'. Thus Paul came to know that real power is to be found in vulnerability, for stripped of power one is more likely to turn to God. Now, when Paul endures insults, hardships, persecutions and constraints, he is strong with the power of Christ.

Jesus returns to his hometown (literally his father's house) and he is identified as the son of his mother. It is precisely because he originated from these people that he is rejected by them. The fact that Jesus spoke in the synagogue was not extraordinary, since adult men took their turns explaining the Scriptures. What upset the crowd was the content of his message. Their astonishment did not give birth to faith; it grew out of skepticism and developed into rejection. Their questions sprang from resentment, not awe. Who did he think he was? Without realising it, they were asking the right question, but for the wrong reason. Had they really wanted to know, his identity might have been revealed to them. It seems that those who knew Jesus the best understood him the least.

Dianne Bergant CSA was a Professor of Biblical Studies at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, where she taught from 1978 to 2014. She holds a BS in Elementary Education from Marian College, Fond du Lac, WI; an MA and PhD in Biblical Languages and Literature from St Louis University. Amongst other things, she served as President of Catholic Biblical Association of America (2000-2001) and has been awarded honorary doctorates from several other universities. She was an active member of the Chicago Catholic/Jewish Scholars Dialogue (1988-2017) and sat on the editorial boards of The Bible Today (1979-2005), Biblical Theology Bulletin (1990-2014), Catholic Biblical Quarterly (1992-2001), New Theology Review (1997-2003), Teaching Theology and Religion (2003-2005), and Chicago Studies (2003-2009). She has taught and lectured in many places in the United States and abroad and has written numerous books, articles and chapters in books.
