ST PAUL SUMS UP LOVE

THE GIFT OF LOVE - 1 COR 13.1-13

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.



COVID UPDATE



WITH THE NSW GOVERNMENT RELEASING THEIR ROADMAP OUT OF LOCKDOWN, BISHOP ANTHONY RANDAZZO SETS OUT A PLAN FOR THE FAITHFUL IN IN BROKEN BAY

LETTER FROM BISHOP ANTHONY

30 September 2021

you are aware the NSW Government now has published its Roadmap" from the current OVID restrictions. Broadly, this is envisaged in t h r e segments:



- From the Monday after 70% vaccination rate has been achieved (forecast to be Monday 11 October) various enterprises may open, including places of public worship, and be available for those who are vaccinated.
- From the Monday after 80% vaccination rate has been achieved, further venues can reopen for those who are vaccinated. Places of public worship are exempt from this particular restriction.
- 1 December 2021 when COVID vigilance applies to all, irrespective of vaccination status.

Considering this roadmap and all its implications for the Faithful of Broken Bay, I have determined the following to apply to our own diocese:

- 1. From Monday 11 October our churches are to be reopened for private prayer and devotion only. It is for our people to be mindful of government requirements for this stage of the Roadmap and to engage this opportunity with a sense of responsibility and COVID safety. During this stage:
 - 1.0.1. The hours of opening of our churches should be available to our parishioners.
 - 1.0.2. Public Masses remain suspended and "private" Masses with a congregation should not take place. The exception will be the Mass of Ordination at Our Lady of Rosary Cathedral on 18 October and the subsequent three Masses of Thanksgiving for our newly ordained priests.
 - 1.0.3. Confessions should not be publicly scheduled but most certainly should be available by personal arrangement with the clergy of the parish.
 - 1.0.4. Baptisms, unless in the event of impending death, should be delayed until the next stage.
 - 1.0.5. Weddings and funerals: up to 50 people attend. may vaccinated.
 - 1.0.6. Those who are unvaccinated may only attend weddings with a maximum number of 5 people.
 - 1.0.7. Those who are unvaccinated may only attend funeral with a maximum number of 10 people.
 - 1.0.8. It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitise, and always wear a

- 2. From the Monday after 80% vaccination rate has been achieved, public Masses are to resume in all our churches according to their usual schedule. In accord with the government regulation, the vaccination status of our people who attend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified. Thankfully, this will enable us to go forward together as one community of the Church. As they engage this opportunity, it will be important for our people to make informed decisions about their COVID safety. During this stage:
- Other rituals such as Baptisms and other services of prayer and devotion may be resumed.
 - 3.1. Confessions should be publicly scheduled again.
 - 3.2. The number of people who can attend Mass and other liturgies and services of prayer is based on the 4 sqm principle (uncapped), including for funerals and weddings.
 - 3.3. Congregational singing will not be possible, but a musician and cantor are possible and should be engaged for the beauty of the liturgy.
 - 3.4. COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our liturgies should be reintroduced including:
 - Avoiding the handling of objects by 3.4.1. multiple persons;
 - The Chalice is not to be shared; Holy 3.4.2. Communion for the Faithful is to be under one species only;
 - The Sign of Peace should only be given 3.4.3. by a simple bow or nod of the head.
 - Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue should be asked to wait until the end of the 3.4.4. Communion Procession and the priest should sanitise his hands after each of these communicants.
 - 3.5. It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.
 - 3.6. Given that our parish facilities other than our church buildings will be subject to the status of people's vaccination it may be that parishes continue to suspend face-to-face parish meetings, social gatherings, and use of facilities such meeting rooms and halls until after 1 December, and that parishes continue to encourage online gatherings. Should parish facilities be opened during this stage, they will be subject to the vaccination status of those who use them, and the 4 sqm principle.

4. From 1 December 2021

- 4.1. Density for gatherings in our churches will shift to one person per 2 sqm for both indoor and outdoor gatherings.
- 4.2. Congregational singing will be possible at our liturgies.
- 4.3. There is no restriction on the use of other parish facilities such as meeting rooms and halls.
- These need to be 5. I now welcome the NSW Government's roadmap, and particularly the understanding it has demonstrated for places of public worship. I am confident that the staged return I have outlined, in accord with both the spiritual needs of our people and the Roadmap, will ensure our safety and our unity as we journey forward together into the new environment ahead of us.







As it was his purpose to bring a great many of his sons into glory, it was appropriate that God, for whom everything exists and through whom everything exists, should make perfect, through suffering, the leader who would take them to their salvation. For the one who sanctifies, and the ones who are sanctified, are of the same stock; that is why he openly calls them brothers.

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. `What did Moses He answered them,



command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery

People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.

The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to the soul that seeks him.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

In the account of the creation of the woman, the word for partner (ezer) does not mean 'helper' but 'source of blessing'. In an ancient Sumerian myth, the goddess Ninti was the 'woman of life' (cf. 3:20), a phrase from the same Hebrew root as 'woman of the rib' (v.21). Just as the man (adam) comes from the ground (adamah), so the woman (issah) comes from the man (ish). These poetic constructions indicate that the author did not set out to provide an accurate account of the creation of the first couple, but sought to focus on their relationship. Finally, the word pair 'bone and flesh' is a typical way of expressing comprehensiveness. With the woman, the man is complete.

The psalm is a wisdom psalm. It contains wisdom themes such as reward and punishment, happy or blessed, ways or path. The fear of the Lord denotes profound amazement hefore awe and the tremendous marvels of God. The blessings promised here are both material good fortune and a large and extended family. The reference to children's children refers to long life and the continuation of the family. It also implies that the nation is prospering and that it will endure. The good fortune of the individual is really a share in the good fortune of the nation. The final

statement is an exclamation: 'Peace upon Israel!' Peace, shalom, is fullness of life.

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews uses an anthropological tradition to explain the solidarity of Jesus with humankind. For him being made lower than the heavenly beings was a humbling experience, not an elevating one. He emptied himself in death for the sake of all women and men. Jesus is the one who, through his death, brings others to the glory intended for them from their creation. He is the one who consecrates; they are the ones who are consecrated. Like all others, he is made a little lower than the angels, and he is not ashamed of the human nature that he shares with all the rest.

The Pharisees were not asking about the acceptability of divorce; it was permitted by law. Jesus responds to their challenge with one of his own. Without undermining the authority of Moses, he goes beyond the Mosaic tradition to the original intent of God as found in the creation account. In God's design the couple become one flesh and must not be separated. Later Jesus explains his challenge of the patriarchal understanding of divorce and remarriage. Jesus then makes children the symbol and model of those who would receive and enter the reign of God. The reign of God must be accepted as children might accept a gift. Furthermore, it must also be entered with the unself-consciousness of children.

CREATE A COVID-19 CHECK-IN CARD

https://www.service.nsw.gov.au/transaction/create-covid-19-check-card

The COVID-19 check-in card is a hard-copy (printed) card with a unique QR code that contains your registered contact details.

When you enter a COVID Safe business, a staff member scans your card and your visit to the premises is electronically recorded. If the business device is unable to read your QR code, the staff member will enter your details manually into the Service NSW business online webform.

This information, along with the details of the premises you are attending and the time and date of your visit, will comprise the record of your attendance at the venue. Service NSW will hold the record of your attendance for a period of 28 days from the date it was collected. The record of your attendance will only be disclosed to NSW Health for contact tracing purposes.

The card provides an alternative check-in method for customers who don't have smart phones and/or those who are not comfortable using the Service NSW business online webform.

When you create your card you'll need to enter your name. Only use characters that are in the English alphabet. Special characters or diacritical marks cannot be recognised by the system, so your form will be rejected if they are used.

Once you've created your card you can have it posted to you, or you can download a printable version immediately.

If you select to have your card posted to you, please enter your full address

If you lose the card, or your contact details change, you simply create a new card.

Note: This check-in method is only available at businesses that have a QR compatible device. It is not mandatory for businesses to accept COVID-19 check-in cards.

Yes, St Patrick's will have this method of check-in available when the church re-opens for Masses

HOW IT WILL WORK AT A BUSINESS OR PLACE OF WORSHIP.

How do businesses check in customers who have a COVID-19 check-in card?

When a business registers as COVID Safe at nsw.gov.au, it is given a unique QR code to display, along with a unique Service NSW business online webform URL. The online webform can be displayed on a venue-supplied digital device, such as a mobile or tablet.

To check in a customer, please take the following steps:

- 1. Open the unique business online webform on the digital device.
- 2. Click on the 'Scan a COVID-19 check-in card' link on the online webform (link can be found above the 'First name' field).
- 3. When the camera app opens, use the camera to scan the QR code on the COVID-19 check-in card.
- 4. When the QR code is scanned, the online webform automatically pre-fills with the customer's registered information.
- 5. Confirm the customer's registered information is correct by showing them the details on the screen.
- 6. Click the red check-in button. Check-in will be confirmed with a green tick.

Note: Alternatively, if a customer is able to self-serve, they can scan their QR code and check themselves in.




