toe.



A DECREE REGARDING PLENARY INDULGENCE

The Apostolic Penitentiary, having listened to the various pleas recently received from various Sacred Pastors of the Church, due to the continuing state of the pandemic, confirms and extends for the entire month of November 2021 all the spiritual benefits already granted on 22 October 2020, through the Decree Protocol No, 791/20/1 with which, due to the "Covid-19" pandemic, the Plenary Indulgences for the deceased faithful were extended for the entire month of November 2020.

From the renewed generosity of the Church, the faithful will certainly draw pious intentions and spiritual vigour to guide their lives according to the Gospel law, in filial communion and devotion to the Supreme Pontiff, the visible foundation and Pastor of the Catholic Church.

This Decree is valid for the entire month of November, notwithstanding any provision to the contrary.

Given in Rome, at the Seat of the Apostolic Penitentiary, 27 October 2021.



The Holy See has granted a plenary indulgence, applicable to the holy souls in purgatory, to the faithful who visit a cemetery to pray for the dead or who devoutly visit a church and recite the Lord's Prayer and the Creed on any day in the month of November.

To gain this indulgence, the person must, as well as visiting a cemetery or a church:

recite the Lord's Prayer ("Our Father");

recite the Creed (either the Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed);

make Sacramental confession (up to 20 days before or after); receive Holy Communion (several days before or after);

and pray for the intentions of the Pope (which can be fulfilled by praying one "Our Father" and one "Hail Mary").

A plenary indulgence remits all temporal punishment due to sin but it must always be accompanied by a full detachment from sin.

Those who cannot leave home, such as the sick and the elderly, can still obtain an indulgence by reciting prayers for the dead before an image of Our Lord or the Blessed Virgin Mary. They must also spiritually unite themselves to other Catholics, be completely detached from sin, and have the intention of fulfilling the ordinary conditions given above as soon as possible.

SOMEONE IS STEALING OUR PLANTS!

It is so frustrating all around but especially for our great gardeners, Trevor, Joyce and Margaret that the plants they often donate are just being pilfered from our gardens, and it happens repeatedly. We aren't asking you to patrol the perimeters or anything but please keep your eye out for suspicious activity around the complex - especially if you live nearby. Thank you.

STILL UNDER THE SHADOW OF COVID WE REMIND YOU THAT:

Electronic check in is mandatory, as is sanitising and physical distancing – please ensure you are seated 4m2 from anyone outside your family bubble, and you stand on the stickers provided when queueing for communion.

It is your responsibility not to enter the church if you have a fever, cough, sore throat or shortness of breath.

- If you wish to take communion on the tongue, please ensure that you are at the end of the priest's queue.
- 2. A reminder that all groups will continue to meet online [if possible] until December 1.
- Weekday Masses will continue to be live-streamed as will our 10.15am Sunday Mass.

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

By a single offering he has achieved the eternal perfection of those who are sanctified.

All the priests stand at their duties every day, offering over and over again the same sacrifices which are quite incapable of

taking sins away. Christ, on the other hand, has offered one single sacrifice for sins, and then taken his place for ever, at the right hand of God, where he is now waiting until his enemies are made into a footstool for him. By virtue of that one single offering, he has achieved the eternal perfection of all whom he is sanctifying. When all sins have been forgiven, there can be no more sin offerings.

GOSPEL MK 13:24-32

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

He shall gather his elect from the four winds.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven.

'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves come out, you know that summer is near. So with you, when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.'

COMMUNION ANTIPHON PS 72:28

To be near God is my happiness, to place my hope in God the Lord.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

The apocalyptic scene depicts the final struggle at the end of time and the subsequent resurrection to a life of horror or one of glorification. The suffering is probably the final tribulation that will come to pass before the appearance of the eschatological reign of God. It was considered the 'birth pangs of the messiah', the agony that must be endured if the reign of God is to be born. The allusion to some

kind of resurrection from the dead followed by reward and punishment is clear. This vision is one of hope and challenge for those who are undergoing great distress.

The psalm verses speak of covenant relationship with God and the confidence that flows from it. The allotted land is the inheritance each tribe was given and which was handed down generation after generation. The cup might be the communal cup passed around, from which all drank. This action solidified the union of all who drank from the common cup. When this action took place at a cultic meal, those participating in the feast were joined not only to each other but to the deity as well. God is at the psalmist's right hand, standing as an advocate or a refuge. Such protection is reason for profound rejoicing.

An understanding of the Jewish practice of sin offering is behind the explanation of the unique sacrifice of Christ. The efficacy of this sacrifice transcends both spatial and temporal limits. Through his unrepeatable sacrifice Jesus is able to expiate all transgressions of all people of all time. His singular status as priest and inestimable value as victim set this sacrifice apart from all others. Jesus is seated at God's right hand, the recognised place of highest honour (Psalm 110). With his sacrifice, Jesus has accomplished what the sacrificial system of Israel, despite its preeminence, was unable to accomplish.

The coming of the Son of Man in the clouds, an allusion to the mysterious figure in the Book of Daniel (7:13), heralds the advent of the new age. This mysterious figure comes in power and glory, not in fury and destruction; he comes to gather the elect, not to scatter them. This is the great ingathering of the elect, the time of harvesting, the 'day of the Lord'. Jesus points to the fig tree's blossoming in the spring as a sign of the advent of the events he has just described. Unlike the ripening of the figs, which can be expected at a particular time of the year, the exact time of the coming of the new age is shrouded in mystery. The lesson to be learned from all of this is: Be prepared! At all times, be prepared! Be prepared for the coming tribulation; be prepared for the appearance of the Son of Man. Be prepared!
