THE ESSENCE OF COMMUNITY

When people were nearby lepers were to say, "Unclean, unclean." The leper shouldn't even have been in the village that day when Jesus came. Even when he approached Jesus the leper kept his distance. Jesus had to stretch out his hand to touch him when curing him. The man was not as courageous as the hemorrhaging woman who touched Jesus' clothes (Mark 5:27). When Jesus healed the leper, Jesus not only healed his illness but restored him to his community and family once again.

We are meant for community, we are not meant for isolation. When Paul was wandering around Corinth he saw the pagan shrine to Asklepios, the pagan god of healing, and saw depictions of body parts on the wall that had been healed, an arm, a leg and so on. You might ask how could there be healings in a pagan shrine. An engineer by the name of Vitruvius, a contemporary of Jesus, has left us descriptions of these healing shrines and said you need two things for them - clean air and pure water - and if you provide these most people will be healed and you can give the credit to the god. As Paul wandered around this pagan shrine in Corinth, he obviously saw that a hand on its own looks weird, a leg on its own looks weird so Paul wrote in 1 Cor 12:14:ff "Nor is the body to be identified with any one of its many parts. If the foot were to say, "I am not a hand and so I do not belong to the body" would that mean that it stopped being part of the body? If the ear were to say "I am not an eye and so I do not belong to the body," would that mean that it was not a part of the body?...God has put all the separate parts into the body on purpose...Now you together are Christ's body, but each of you is a different part of it."

We have been created for community and are called to live our faith in and with a community. Isolation and independence is a contradiction to Christianity. Every Sunday when we celebrate the Eucharist we celebrate as a community. Paul said to the



"All people shall see the salvation of God."

Corinthians, "We though many form one single body." (1 Cor 10:17) In community we are to make Christ real. Love is to be the characteristic of the Christian community. As Paul said to the Corinthians, "if I give away everything but am without love, it will do me no good whatever." (1 Cor 13:3) Jesus said, "By this will all know that you are my disciples, if you have love one for another." (John 13:35). That is why Paul could say in our second reading today, "Take me for your model as I take Christ." (1 Cor 11:1) Everyone in the community is to reflect Christ. The Eucharistic Acclamation in our Mass today is, "When we eat this bread and drink this cup we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory." That is also what Paul wrote the Corinthians (1 Cor 11:27). How can we say that when we gather for the Eucharist we proclaim Jesus' death? When we gather for the Eucharist it is to be an act of love, reflecting the love in the community, because everyone in the community is to reflect Christ. If we gather for the Eucharist but do not love each other, our Eucharist is a sham.

Jesus healed the leprous man and restored him to community. We have been created for community and are called to live our faith in and with a community. "We though many form one single body," and "by this will all know that you are my disciples, if you have love one for another."

Every time I pray for all of you, I pray with joy, remembering how you have helped to spread the Good News from the day you first heard it right up to the present. I am quite certain that the One who began this good work in you will see that it is finished when the Day of Christ Jesus comes. God knows how much I miss you all, loving you as Christ Jesus loves you. My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare you for the Day of Christ, when you will reach the perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God.

GOSPEL

LK 3:1-6

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

All people shall see the salvation of God.

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness; Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.

Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, winding ways will be straightened and rough roads made smooth.

And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON

BAR 5:5; 4:36

Jerusalem, arise and stand upon the heights, and behold the joy which comes to you from God.

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

Two movements appear in this dramatic depiction of reversal of fortune. The grieving city of Jerusalem is told to replace its mourning garb with garments that bespeak splendour and rejoicing. The city whose name means 'foundation of peace', is given a new name: 'the peace of justice, the glory of God's worship'. Jerusalem is also told to stand on the heights and watch the resplendent return of its previously captured citizens. No reason is given for God's remarkable magnanimity. It is simply extended to Jerusalem and to its children. It is God's mercy that prompted the reversals, and the reversals witness this mercy to the rest of the world.

Believers trust that God will surely act on their behalf, because God has done so before. The great blessing of Israel's past was the return from exile. The response of the returnees was amazement. The graciousness of God, seen in this deliverance, speaks volumes to the other nations. It throws into bold relief God's saving power. This is a God who shows preference for those who are poor and marginalised in society, the homeless and the foreigner, the displaced and the refugee. The prayer for deliverance is straightforward: Restore us now as you restored us in the past. The people are confident that they will be heard.

Paul's affection for the Philippians is evident. It is more than merely human sentiment, as noble as that might be. It is identified with the affection that Christ has toward them. It is really the love of Christ expressing itself through him. Paul acknowledges that the spread and fruition of the word is really God's doing. Paul is merely the instrument that God has used to plant the seed. The eschatological character of this passage becomes clear when Paul identifies the time of full flowering as the day of Christ Jesus. Paul prays that their love for each will increase; and that they will be pure and blameless for the coming day of Christ.

The account of the ministry of John the Baptist is steeped in imagery that suggests new life. Some form of baptism was one of three requirements for becoming a Jew (along with circumcision and sacrifice). It was an ascetic act that at times signified turning away from evil, and at other times represented cleansing from sin, which was the divine answer to repentance. In either case, it carried an eschatological importance, marking the entrance into a new form of living. The baptism of John called for repentance (metánoia), a conversion or change of heart. This conversion was for the forgiveness of sin. Clearly the eschatological significance of John's baptism was salvation, not judgment. John is the herald of the coming of the Lord. Just as the exodus and return from exile involved a desert crossing, so the eschatological renewal proclaimed by John begins in the desert.
