REFLECTION ON ADVENT

The word Advent is originally derived from the Latin word adventus which means coming or arriving. The Latin word expresses the memorial of the first coming of Jesus Christ as a baby incarnated to the Virgin Marry more than two thousand years ago on Christmas Day. It also indicates the Second Coming of Christ in glory. However, the Vietnamese translation of the word advent which is "vong" – Advent Season to "Mùa Vọng" – designates another aspect of the season. "Vọng" means waiting, looking forward to. The waiting that "vọng" implies is not any kind of waiting such as waiting for the line in the supermarket or waiting for traffic but it is waiting with hope and joy. Adventus illustrates the action of God. Meanwhile "vọng" calls us as the other party of the Covenant to take action.

So, how does this waiting affect us?

The atheist French philosopher Jean Paul Sartre once wrote that our judgement or our intuition is impacted not only by the presence of the surrounding objects but also the nothingness of something. In other words, the absence of something that we are waiting or expecting to happen also influences us significantly. Although from an atheist philosopher to me this could teach us something about the truth. When we actively wait for something, perhaps more importantly someone, the absence of the person or the event yet to come significantly colours our thinking and our senses. When we wait for a friend in a park who is late or when we wait for our children coming home for Christmas, the park becomes full of the absence of our friend when we look for him, or the prepared dinner in the dining room is full of the absence of our children who have not yet come home. Our mind could run through many scenarios like this.

This waiting and the impact of it are depicted clearly in the Bible when the people of Israel were waiting for God to come to rescue them. The Psalmist describes the effect of waiting making them "as a deer long for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O God" (Psalm 41:1) or "my soul

thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water" (Psalm 61:1). Their anticipation of God transformed their whole life.

Nonetheless, waiting on God is not easy. As Jesus says: "you know neither the day nor the hour" (Matthew 25:13). The uncertainty of the day God comes to us in the final hour of our lives or the second coming of Christ makes us forget to wait on God most of the time in our lives. We prefer to be preoccupied by many other things, although good and necessary. Our intuition of the world is not coloured and impacted by God most of the times.

Let's take this advent season for example. Let us ask ourselves that are we looking forward to Christmas day to celebrate Christ's birthday or are we only looking forward for a festival no different than other festivals. Are our minds and hearts filled with many worries, Christmas parties, booking for holidays, shopping, or are they filled with the joy of waiting on God?

From the example of this advent season, we consider again the coming of Christ to individuals and the second coming of Christ. Is our life joyfully and hopefully affected by the absence of the event yet to come for which we are waiting for? Are they filled with Christ and his teaching, his love and his hope for us? Or else, does it not really matter to us?

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The reference to Bethlehem is rich in early royal importance quite distinct from association with Jerusalem, the capital of the royal family. The ruler promised is not the dynastic successor, but a new Davidic king, fresh and totally committed to God as the young David was. He will be called forth for God and strengthened by God to rule. Kings were frequently characterised as shepherds, because of their responsibility to care for the people. This promised king will shepherd in the strength and majesty of God. The oracle suggests that tribulation will precede the birth of this new ruler. However, once the tribulation of birth is over, the joy of new life will blot out the

The communal lament contains several images of God. As shepherd, God is responsible for the care of the flock, leading it to verdant pastures and protecting it from danger. God is also an imperial ruler, majestically enthroned and surrounded by cherubim. As Lord of Hosts, God can marshal the 'hosts' (units) of heavenly defenders. Finally, as keeper of vines, God cares for the growth and productivity of the community. These apt images characterise the relationship between God and the people. Though God is powerful like an imperial ruler or a military leader, the care that God provides compares to that of an attentive shepherd or a patient vine dresser.

The author of Hebrews contrasts the former sacrificial ritual with Christ's sacrifice. The sacrifices mentioned represent the entire sacrificial system. Christ's sacrifice is preferred over all others, because of the preeminence of his human body as compared with the bodies of the sacrificial animals. The author also contrasts adherence to the law and Christ's obedience to God's will. Christ annuls the first (external adherence) in order to establish the second (internal obedience). By freely offering his body in sacrifice, Christ identifies his own will with the will of God. We are sanctified through this sacrifice, not through any sacrifice required by law. For it was through his human body, a body like ours, that he demonstrated his obedience.

The response of the child in Elizabeth's womb is reminiscent of the joy that filled David as he leaped before the ark of the covenant. Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit and proclaimed her faith in the child that Mary was carrying. In both cases, it was the realisation of being in the presence of God that caused them to rejoice. It is as if Mary is the ark and the child within her is the glory of God. There is a sequence of recognition that begins and ends with Mary. At the sound of Mary's greeting the child in Elizabeth leaped for joy, signalling to her the presence of her Lord in Mary's womb; at this, Elizabeth recognises the blessedness of Mary's unborn child and, through him, the blessedness of Mary.


