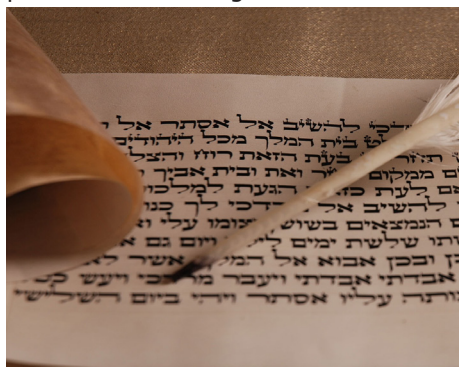
OLD TESTAMENT COMMENTARY

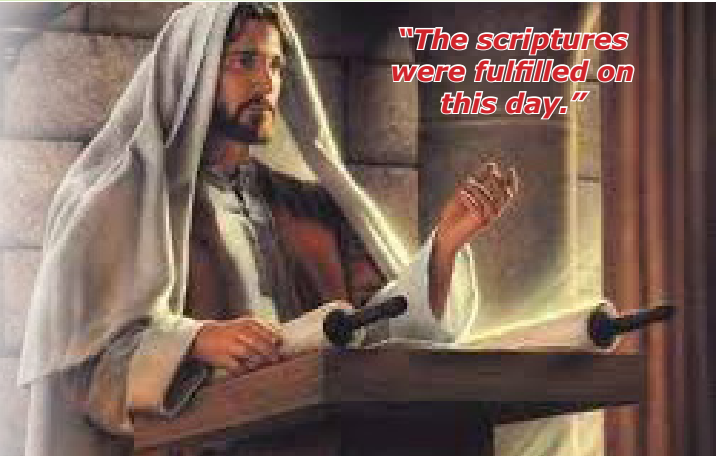
Nehemiah 8:2-6, 8-10

Our reading from the book of Nehemiah recounts the first public recitation of the Torah or law book to the exiles; the Persian empire that conquered Babylon allowed them to return to their homeland. According to the sequence of the books Ezra-Nehemiah (as they are generally listed) the recitation took place after the temple had been restored and the walls of Jerusalem rebuilt. The 'water gate' was one of the gates of the city and so named, it seems, because of an underground stream that entered the city nearby and was used to replenish a cistern for liturgical ablutions. The narrative description leads one to date this event in the latter part of the fifth century BCE but critical analysis identifies disruptions and discontinuity in some of the narrative sequence, leading to doubts about how accurately the text portrays events. There is as much or more theology/ideology running in the text as history. The primacy of the law and the need for the people to be portrayed as committed to it was so crucial for the post-exilic restoration that history probably had to give way to theology and faith proclamation.

As often happens in biblical narrative, the scene is presented initially in broad outline and the details are then added. Hence the first part of the reading describes what took place when the scribe Ezra assembled the people and read the Torah or law book to them. There is considerable debate as to whether the term Law refers to the whole Pentateuch or Torah (as it is called in Hebrew) or to a particular law book within it, such as Leviticus or Deuteronomy. The second part of the reading then fills in some details, describing what happened when Ezra stood up and opened the book. The theology embedded in this scene is to claim that wherever the Torah is proclaimed there the Lord is because it is the Word of the Lord – the Lord speaking. Hence in bowing



down before the book, the people are in reality prostrating 'themselves before the Lord'. Another detail is the report that Ezra (and the accompanying Levites) had to translate and instruct the people. From an ideological point of view this enhances the status and authority of Ezra and the Levites; the claim is that they are the authentic interpreters of the Law. From a historical point of view, it probably reflects the fact that those who had been living in exile in Babylon had lost contact with their native Hebrew tongue. It was more than likely they spoke the 'lingua franca' of the ancient Near East, Aramaic.

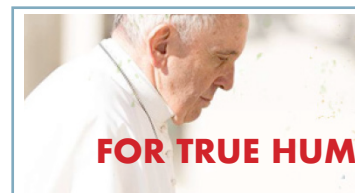

FIRST READING

NEH 8:2-6. 8-10

A reading from the book of Nehemiah

They read from the book of Law and they understood what was read.

Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, consisting of men, women, and children old enough to understand. This was the first day of the seventh month. On the square before the Water Gate, in the presence of the men and women, and children old enough to understand, he read from the book from early morning till noon; all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden dais erected for the purpose. In full view of all the people – since he stood higher than all the people – Ezra opened the book; and when he opened it all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people raised their hands and answered Amen! Amen!; then they bowed down and, face to the ground, prostrated themselves before the Lord. And Ezra read from the Law of God, translating and giving the sense, so that the people understood what was read.

Then Nehemiah – His Excellency – and Ezra, priest and scribe (and the Levites who were instructing the people) said to all the people, 'This day is sacred to the Lord your God. Do not be mournful, do not weep'. For the people were all in tears as they listened to the words of the Law.

He then said, 'Go, eat the fat, drink the sweet wine, and send a portion to the man who has nothing prepared ready. For this day is sacred to our Lord. Do not be sad: the joy of the Lord is your stronghold.'

Seeing that many others have undertaken to draw up accounts of the events that have taken place among us, exactly as these were handed down to us by those who from the outset were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word, I in my turn, after carefully going over the whole story from the beginning, have decided to write an ordered account for you, Theophilus, so that your Excellency may learn how well founded the teaching is that you have received.

Jesus, with the power of the Spirit in him, returned to Galilee; and his reputation spread throughout the countryside. He taught in their synagogues and everyone praised him.

He came to Nazara, where he had been brought up, and went into the synagogue on the sabbath day as he usually did. He stood up to read, and they handed him the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Unrolling the scroll he found the place where it is written:

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me.

He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour.

He then rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the assistant and sat down. And all eyes in

the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to speak to them, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.'
