This weekend, our Parish Pastoral Council is delighted to launch our Parish Vision, Mission and Values statement. The statement is the culmination of a discernment process that began in 2019. Throughout this process, members of the council have received formation, sought the input of the parish community, and prayed for the Holy Spirit's guidance in developing such an important document.

The intent of this statement is to give meaning and direction to the initiatives and activities of Gosford Parish in the years to come. It is our local response to the great commission and continuing command that Jesus gave the universal church as he ascended to heaven: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." Mt 28:19-20. As the body of Christ present in Gosford today, our parish community comes together to take responsibility for continuing this mission.

In order to accomplish this, the council had to consider the present state of Gosford Parish and the wider community. By understanding where we are currently, we could then determine an engaging vision, the mission to direct us there and the values that define our communal gifts and virtues. This discernment process sought the input of the wider parish community: our 3 communities, schools, groups and ministries. The council is grateful for the support and contribution the entire parish has given during this time.

It is quite appropriate that we launch such an important document at the beginning of our parish Year of Community. Throughout this year, and in the years to come, there will be ongoing opportunities to explore, discuss and apply the vision, mission and values in your lives, groups, ministries and communities. You are invited to discern how this vision and mission, and these values, could bring new life and direction to your engagement with the parish and wider community.

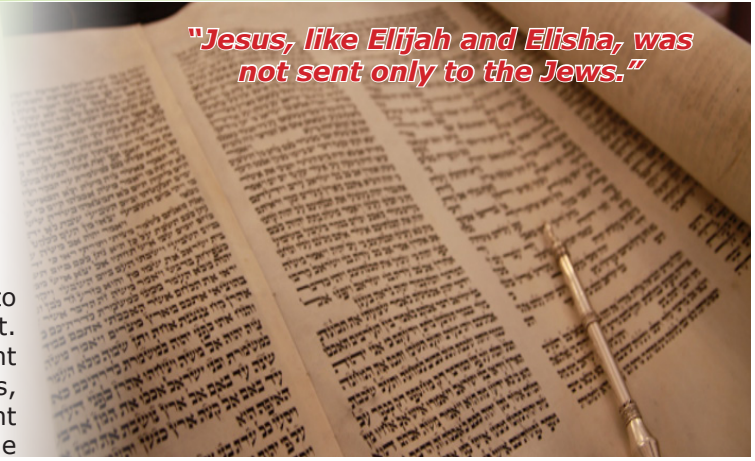



## INTERNATIONAL DOMESTIC CHURCH PROGRAM

### LAUNCHED IN GOSFORD!

Last Thursday we have officially launched the Domestic Church program in our parish with the start of formation for seven couples who will be the future leaders of family circles (groups of up to 5-6 families each). Our leaders must go through the formation first in order to be able to lead the program for others in the future. After building up the family group in our parish last year, we now want to take another step in providing permanent formation opportunities to the many families in our parish and

those surrounding. We will be the very first parish in the whole of Australia to begin this program which is already very popular in 20 countries around the world, and we hope that many families across Australia will be interested in joining in too.

### WHAT IS DOMESTIC CHURCH ALL ABOUT?

Domestic Church is a movement for married Catholic couples and families who want to grow in mutual love and pursue sanctity together. The Movement helps spouses to build true unity and create a truly Christian environment for bringing up children. It provides lifelong formation in personal, marital and family spirituality.

What makes the Domestic Church formation attractive is that it is not a novel approach to the faith or a new vision of Catholicism limited to a particular spirituality, but simply a way to access the treasures of the Church's teachings on marriage, family life, prayer, Scripture, the Sacraments, etc as spouses and parents, specifically utilising the grace of the Sacrament of Matrimony to do so. The family circles meet once a month and function on an annual basis. Each meeting will include sharing life experiences during a symbolic meal, prayer and Bible study as well as formation.

We're very excited that our parish is leading the way with permanent program opportunities for many families!

Please contact us if you are interested in joining this movement. Any families who are not from our parish and would like to join are also more than welcome to. After attending a few monthly formation meetings with us, you will be able to start family circles in your own parish if you wish.

Our leaders will start creating the family circles and explain what is all about at the first meeting which will be held at the end of March (more details will be found in our bulletin and on social media a few weeks beforehand).

Let us pray that through this new project many families will be open to the work of Holy Spirit in their lives.

**1 COR 13:4-13**

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take

offence, and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes.

Love does not come to an end. But if there are gifts of prophecy, the time will come when they must fail; or the gift of languages, it will not continue for ever; and knowledge – for this, too, the time will come when it must fail. For our knowledge is imperfect and our prophesying is imperfect; but once perfection comes, all imperfect things will disappear. When I was a child, I used to talk like a child, and think like a child, and argue like a child, but now I am a man, all childish ways are put behind me. Now we are seeing a dim reflection in a mirror; but then we shall be seeing face to face. The knowledge that I have now is imperfect; but then I shall know as fully as I am known.

In short, there are three things that last: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love.

**Jesus, like Elijah and Elisha, was not sent only to the Jews.**

Jesus began to speak in the synagogue, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' And he won the approval of all, and they were astonished by the gracious words that came from his lips.

They said, 'This is Joseph's son, surely?' But he replied, 'No doubt you will quote me the saying, "Physician, heal yourself" and tell me, "We have heard all that happened in Capernaum, do the same here in your own countryside."' And he went on, 'I tell you solemnly, no prophet is ever accepted in his own country.

'There were many widows in Israel, I can assure you, in Elijah's day, when heaven remained shut for three years and six months and a great famine raged throughout the land, but Elijah was not sent to any one of these: he was sent to a widow at Zarephath, a Sidonian town. And in the prophet Elisha's time there were many lepers in Israel, but none of these was cured, except the Syrian, Naaman.'

When they heard this everyone in the synagogue was enraged. They sprang to their feet and hustled him out of the town; and they took him up to the brow of the hill their town was built on, intending to throw him down the cliff, but he slipped through the crowd and walked away.
