St Patrick's Gosford Year of COMMUNITY

SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The first reading contains one of the most important creedal statements found in the Pentateuch (cf. Deut 6:20-24 and Josh 24:2b-13). It enumerates the saving events that shaped Israel's faith: an admission of its humble beginnings; a report of its oppression in Egypt; a testimony to its deliverance by God; an acknowledgment of God's gift of the land to them. This brief account covers three very distinct periods in the history of the people: the age of the ancestors; the time of the deliverance from bondage; the period of the entrance into the land.

The verses from Psalm 91 are a kind of cultic liturgy: the worshipper is addressed (vv. 1-2); there is a message of assurance (vv. 10-13); the psalm concludes with an oracle of salvation (vv. 14-16). Four divine titles describe God. 'Most High', the name ascribed to the deity worshipped in Jerusalem even before David conquered that ancient city (cf. Gen 14:18-22), describes God as creator of heaven and earth. 'Almighty' is a name associated with the early ancestors (cf. Gen 17:1; 28:3; 35:11; 43:14; 48:3). 'Lord' or YHWH, the personal name of the God of Israel, is linked with the covenant made through Moses. Though each title has a slightly different meaning, together they sketch a picture of a victorious creator who entered into covenant with human beings.

Paul speaks of three important themes: the importance of faith as the basis of salvation; the Christological interpretation of Scripture; the universal character of salvation through Christ. The essence of Paul's preaching is twofold: the centrality of Christ in the drama of salvation; and the need to accept the gospel in order to open oneself to Christ's saving power. Paul alludes to two prophetic passages. Isaiah speaks of a firm cornerstone that God lays in Zion (Isa 28:16). Paul claims that Jesus is that cornerstone. Joel described some of the terrors that will accompany the Day of the Lord (Joel 3:5, Hebrew). Paul identifies Jesus as this Lord.

The account of Jesus' temptations in the wilderness connects Jesus with ancient Israel. The wilderness had been the place of Israel's testing (cf. Deut 8:2). This account shows that unlike that ancient people, Jesus did not fail his test. The length of Jesus' fasting also has ancient Israelite

significance. The two men who represented Israel's law and prophets, Moses and Elijah respectively, fasted for forty days and forty nights. Moses fasted as he wrote the ten commandments on tablets of stone (cf. Exod 34:28). Elijah fasted as he walked to Horeb (cf. 1 Kgs 19:8). The temptations themselves occurred in three different places: the wilderness, on a high mountain; on the parapet of the temple in Jerusalem. In each instance, Jesus is challenged to prove that he is the Son of God. Jesus never directly addresses the question of his divine sonship, but he always shows himself to be faithful as Israel was not.

But rather than giving up, he said, "we beg God more intensely."


