SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY BY DIANNE BERGANT CSA

In Isaiah, the ability to speak and the words that are spoken all come from God. They are given to the speaker, but they are for the sake of the weary and downtrodden. They are words of comfort. The speaker suffers both personal insult and physical attack. Despite all of this, he does not recoil from his call. He willingly accepts the consequences of his prophetic ministry. In the face of all the affliction, the speaker retains confidence in God, but without the complaint. If anything, it resembles a declaration of confidence in God's sustaining presence.

The psalm is a combination of a lament (vv.8-9;17-20) and a thanksgiving song (vv.23-24). The opening verses describe the derision that the psalmist must endure from onlookers. They are mocking what they consider to be the psalmist's misplaced trust. Their taunt throws into question whether or not there is any point to such trust. Does God really care what happens to this pitiful individual? Neither the mockery nor the brutality of these onlookers can undermine the devotion of the psalmist, who, in the face of all of this suffering, still clings to hope. The reading ends with an exclamation associated with thanksgiving.

The Christological reflection on the nature and mission of Christ can be divided into two parts. In the first (vv.6-8), Jesus is the subject of the action; in the second (vv.9-11), God is. The first part describes Jesus' humiliation, the second recounts his exaltation by God. Christ did not cling to the dignity that was rightfully his, but emptied himself and took on the human condition. The exaltation of Christ is as glorious as his humiliation was debasing. It is important to note that while Christ was the subject of his self-emptying, his superexaltation is attributed directly to God. The extent to which Christ is to be revered because of this is total.

This passion narrative is really a series of discrete individual stories: the institution of the Lord's Supper (22:14-20); Jesus' farewell instruction (vv.21-38); the events on the Mount of Olives and Peter's denial (39-65); Jesus' trial, flogging and sentencing (22:66-23:25); the way of the cross and crucifixion (23:26-43); Jesus' death and burial (24:44-56). The narrative of the institution of the Lord's Supper is a classic farewell scene. The events that took place on the Mount of Olives are the prelude to Jesus' rejection and the agony. The one who is judge over heaven and earth is then dragged from one judgment seat to another. The last lap of the road to redemption then lies before him. His agony

may have been prolonged, but in death he simply breathed his last. Because the Sabbath was about to begin, he was hurriedly taken down from the cross and immediately buried. The execution is reported quite matter-of-factly. The culminating event of the redemption of the world has been accomplished with dispatch. © Dianne Bergant CSA







His state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are, and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross.

But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

GOSPEL

LK 23:1-49

The passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke

The elders of the people and the chief priests and scribes rose, and they brought Jesus before Pilate.

They began their accusation by saving, 'We found this man inciting our people to revolt, opposing payment of tribute to Caesar, and claiming to be Christ, a king.' Pilate put to him this question, 'Are you the king of the Jews?' 'It is you who say it' he replied. Pilate then said to the chief priests and the crowd, 'I find no case against this man.' But they persisted, 'He is inflaming the people with his teaching all over Judaea; it has come all the way from Galilee, where he started, down to here.' When Pilate heard this, he asked if the man were a Galilean; and finding that he came under Herod's jurisdiction he passed him over to Herod who was also in Jerusalem at that time.

Herod was delighted to see Jesus; he had heard about him and had been wanting for a long time to set eyes on him; moreover, he was hoping to see some miracle worked by him. So he questioned him at some length; but without getting any reply. Meanwhile the chief priests and the scribes were there, violently pressing their accusations. Then Herod, together with his guards, treated him with contempt and made fun of him; he put a rich cloak on him and sent him back to Pilate. And though Herod and Pilate had been enemies before, they were reconciled that same day.

Pilate then summoned the chief priests and the leading men and the people. 'You brought this man before me' he said 'as a

political agitator. Now I have gone into the matter myself in your presence and found no case against the man in respect of all the charges you bring against him. Nor has Herod either, since he has sent him back to us. As you can see, the man has done nothing that deserves death, so I shall have him flogged and then let him go.' But as one man they howled, 'Away with him! Give us Barabbas!' (This man had been thrown into prison for causing a riot in the city and for murder.)

Pilate was anxious to set Jesus free and addressed them again, but they shouted back, 'Crucify him! Crucify him!' And for the third time he spoke to them, 'Why? What harm has this man done? I have found no case against him that deserves death, so I shall have him punished and then let him go.' But they kept on shouting at the top of their voices, demanding that he should be crucified. And their shouts were growing louder.

Pilate then gave his verdict: their demand was to be granted. He released the man they asked for, who had been imprisoned for rioting and murder, and handed Jesus over to them to deal with as they pleased.

As they were leading him away they seized on a man, Simon from Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, and made him shoulder the cross and carry it behind Jesus. Large numbers of people followed him, and of women too, who mourned and lamented for him. But Jesus turned to them and said, 'Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep rather for yourselves and for your children. For the days will surely come when people will say, "Happy are those who are barren, the wombs that have never borne, the breasts that have never suckled!" Then they will begin to say to the mountains, "Fall on us!"; to the hills, 'Cover us!" For if men use the green wood like this, what will happen when it is dry?' Now with him they were also leading out two other criminals to be executed.

When they reached the place called The Skull, they crucified him there and the two criminals also, one on the right, the other on the left. Jesus said, 'Father forgive them; they do not know what they are doing.' Then they cast lots to share out his clothing.

The people stayed there watching him. As for the leaders, they jeered at him. 'He saved others,' they said 'let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One.' The soldiers mocked him too and when they approached to offer him vinegar they said, 'If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself.' Above him there was an inscription 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' But the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all?' he said. 'You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it; we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,' he said 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

It was now about the sixth hour and, with the sun eclipsed, a darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour. The veil of the Temple was torn right down the middle; and when Jesus had cried out in a loud voice, he said, 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.' With these words he breathed his last.

All kneel and pause a moment.

When the centurion saw what had taken place, he gave praise to God and said, 'This was a great and good man.' And when all the people who had gathered for the spectacle saw what had happened, they went home beating their breasts.

All his friends stood at a distance; so also did the women who had accompanied him from Galilee, and they saw all this happen.


