SCRIPTURE COMMENTARY

The first reading's account of the deaths of these brothers is described in grisly detail. The reason given for their murders leaves no doubt in our minds that they are really martyrs, faithful Israelites who died for their faith. As gruesome as the details of the martyrdom may be, the real point of this narrative is the faith in resurrection that these brothers profess. The idea of individual reward or punishment became a major issue only after the experience of the exile (cf. Ezek 18:1-32). It was precisely because of the martyrdom of the righteous that the theodicy, the justice of God, became an issue. An answer to this concern was sought in the idea of a life after this life.

The psalm opens with the same call to attention found in Israel's foremost prayer, 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord is God' (Deut 6:4). However, in this prayer the one called is God. The prayer for help employs two graphic images. The apple of one's eye refers to what is most precious to the individual. The compassionate and caring God is frequently depicted as a protective bird under whose wings a fledgling is assured of finding safety and tenderness. To behold the face of God or to stand in God's presence is to have had some kind of a religious experience. It seems that God has responded and the psalmist is content.

Paul's prayer for the Thessalonians is twofold. He prays for encouragement and for strength. Paul's title for Jesus contains three Christological elements. He is Lord, the same title given to God in the Septuagint (Greek) version of the First Testament; He is Jesus, from the Hebrew name Jehoshua which means 'the Lord is salvation'; He is Christ, the 'anointed one'. It is Christ who will strengthen the believers, protect them against the forces of evil, and keep them on the path of righteousness. The love of God will ground them in their faith; it is the example of the endurance of Christ that will enable them to persevere in their commitment.

Jesus is in a theological discussion with the Sadducees about the possibility of resurrection. He first draws a line of

distinction between this age, when procreation is necessary, and the age to come, when there will be no death. He employs a very traditional Jewish method to argue his point. Reading a text literally, he draws conclusions from it that were probably never in the mind of the author. He refers to the narrative of Moses' encounter with God at the burning bush (cf. Exod 3:1-6). The text has God say 'I am', not 'I was'. The implication is that God is a God of the living, not of the dead. They were all joined to God through the covenant. Jesus' interpretation is claiming that death does not sever the union that the covenant forges.

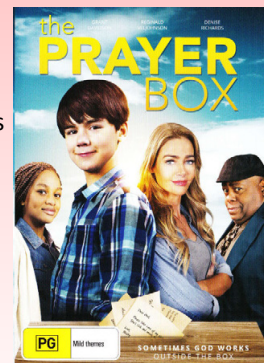



A reading from the second book of Maccabees

The king of the world will receive us into life eternal at the resurrection.

There were seven brothers who were arrested with their mother. The king tried to force them to taste pig's flesh, which the Law forbids, by torturing them with whips and scourges. One of them, acting as spokesman for the others, said, 'What are you trying to find out from us? We are prepared to die rather than break the Law of our ancestors.'

With his last breath the second brother exclaimed, 'Inhuman fiend, you may discharge us from this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up, since it is for his laws that we die, to live again for ever.'

After him, they amused themselves with the third, who on being asked for his tongue promptly thrust it out and held out his hands, with these honourable words, 'It was heaven that gave me these limbs; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again.' The king and his attendants were astounded at the young man's courage and his utter indifference to suffering.

When this one was dead they subjected the fourth to the same savage torture. When he neared his end he cried, 'Ours is the better choice, to meet death at men's hands, yet relying on God's promise that we shall be raised up by him; whereas for you there can be no resurrection, no new life.'

But the Lord is faithful, and he will give you strength and guard you from the evil one, and we, in the Lord, have every confidence that you are doing and will go on doing all that we tell you. May the Lord turn your hearts towards the love of God and the fortitude of Christ.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

He is not a God of the dead but of the living.

Some Sadducees – those who say that there is no resurrection – approached Jesus and they put this question to him, 'Master, we have it from Moses in writing, that if a man's married brother dies childless, the man must marry

the widow to raise up children for his brother. Well, then, there were seven brothers. The first, having married a wife, died childless. The second and then the third married the widow. And the same with all seven, they died leaving no children. Finally the woman herself died. Now, at the resurrection, to which of them will she be wife since she had been married to all seven?'

Jesus replied, 'The children of this world take wives and husbands, but those who are judged worthy of a place in the other world and in the resurrection from the dead do not marry because they can no longer die, for they are the same as the angels, and being children of the resurrection they are sons of God. And Moses himself implies that the dead rise again, in the passage about the bush where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. Now he is God, not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all men are in fact alive.'
