
Fathers also contribute to the formation of a child's conscience. Through their guidance, children learn to

ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF BLD FRANCIS JORDAN



Fr Jordan's path to beatification began in 1943 when documentation of his life and works was sent to the Vatican.

John Baptist Jordan was born on 16 June 1848, in Gurtweil, Germany, a small town in the Black Forest area. He traveled throughout his homeland for work as a laborer and painter-decorator. In his travels, Jordan saw how government constraints on the Church – known as the Kulturkampf – discouraged people from practicing their faith. It only strengthened Jordan's faith, however, and on 21 July 1878, he was ordained to the priesthood in Freiburg, Germany. As Fr Jordan pondered how to combat the growing void in spirituality and religion, he sensed something more for his future. In September 1880, he met with Pope Leo XIII and outlined his vision to establish a society devoted to teaching of the faith. The Pope gave

Jordan his blessing to proceed.

On 8 December 1881, Fr Jordan and two others professed private vows as members of the Apostolic Teaching Society. Soon, Therese Von Wüllenweber joined them. The new foundation grew in members and sent missionaries around the globe. Together with Fr Jordan, Therese would co-found the Sisters of the Divine Savior and lead the congregation as Mother Mary of the Apostles for 19 years. For the times, Fr Jordan's vision was bold: men and women, religious and lay, working together as equals to bring the Gospel of the Savior to all people everywhere. Today, more than 2,000 priests, sisters, brothers and lay women and men carry out that mission in a variety of ministries on six continents. They are known as the three branches of the Salvatorian Family: the Society of the Divine Savior; the Sisters of the Divine Savior; and the International Community of the Divine Savior, or Lay Salvatorians.

Fr Francis Jordan died in Tafers, Switzerland on 8 September 1918, and was buried in the local church. In 1956, his body was moved to Rome and entombed in a special chapel in the Society Motherhouse. On 19 March 1999, Pope John Paul II visited there and prayed at Fr Jordan's tomb.

On 19 June 2020, Pope Francis declared the authenticity of a miracle through the intercession of Fr Jordan. It was the final step on his path to beatification, and on 15 May 2021, we will call him Blessed.

So many times, have I heard stories from both friends and family about the incredible encounters and life-changing events of those who have attended World Youth Day, but I truly believe nothing could have prepared me for the experience I was about to take on when agreeing to attend this year's WYD in Lisbon, Portugal.

Firstly, I have to say that I don't think I will ever be able

to properly put into words the gratitude I have for the Salvatorian group of young Catholics from across Australia, who we were so abundantly blessed to travel alongside. My heart was so touched by each person's generous expression of kindness, encouragement and loving receptivity in our many deep and thought-provoking conversations along the journey, which in turn, truly opened my eyes to the way Our Lord can use His children as a channel from which His love flows.

As well as forming and growing in friendship with my fellow pilgrims, a few of my favourite personal encounters on this journey would have to be visiting the Basilica of Mary Major on our second day in Rome, where I knelt with Jaimi before the very cradle of Christ. I remember staring in awe at the beautifully adorned in gold and silver cradle and feeling the tears flow down my face, completely overwhelmed, as I never knew I would ever be so physically close to anything our Lord had touched before.

While I closed my eyes, I heard the words in my heart be repeated over and over, "Hold onto Me. Do not be afraid, just keep holding on."

I must include also our precious time in Fatima, where we joined thousands of other pilgrims in praying the rosary by candlelight and processing around the Sanctuary square. I will never forget the feeling of our Lady's tender, motherly love that immersed me, while we all walked together as her children, singing Ave Maria. At the end of the rosary, I remember staring for hours at the luminous glow, beaming from the Basilica of our Lady and thanking Mary for protecting us on our journey and leading us to her Son.

Finally, I want to express my utmost gratitude and love for St. Patrick's Parish, for so generously donating and supporting us in all our fundraising events in order to make this pilgrimage possible. Your abundant kindness and willingness to provide this experience for us, has blessed us more than you could ever imagine, and I could not be more thankful to be a part of such a beautiful community.

TIPS FOR PARENTS

- Even when things appear to be going well, children's online behaviour still requires parental monitoring.
- Spend time online with your child this can be a fun family activity.
- Try to locate the computer accessed by children in a visible place.
- Help your child to use the internet for research teach them that online information is not always accurate
- Set rules ensure your child knows what information they can access and share set time limits.
- Teach your child not to respond to communication that makes them feel uncomfortable.
- Reassure your children that internet access will not be denied if they report something inappropriate.
- You have every right and responsibility to check electronic devices used by your children if you've been given cause to do so as
- You have an obligation to keep your home and your child safe.
- By taking away mobile phones at night, parents assist natural sleep processes to occur for their kids so they can get a decent night's rest.

TIPS FOR TEENS & KIDS

- Be careful when adding new "friends' online they might not be who they say they are.
- THINK before posting online once posted, it is impossible to totally remove.
- Never share passwords and always set your profile to 'private' so your personal information remains private.
- Check with your parents before you give anyone on the internet your personal details.
- Don't respond if someone sends you unkind or offensive messages or asks you to do something which makes you feel uncomfortable - instead, tell your parents or another adult that you trust.
- If you want to meet someone you only know online, take a parent with you and meet in a public place.
- Don't open messages from someone you don't know they could contain viruses.
- Don't accept offers that seem too good to be true they could be an attempt to trap you.
- If you need help, call KIDS HELPLINE 1800 551 800.
- If there is an immediate threat to your safety, call the police on 000.


