OLD TESTAMENT COMMENTARY

BY MARK O'BRIEN

Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24

The Wisdom of Solomon is known to us only in Greek as part of the longer list of inspired books in the Greek Old Testament (Septuagint or LXX); it is not in the canon of the Hebrew Bible. It was most likely written in Greek by a Jew living in the diaspora. It is generally dated in the late 1st century BCE and was probably attributed to Solomon in recognition of his legendary wisdom as well as to give the book added clout (a promotional ploy). An interesting feature of the book is the way it reflects changes in Israelite theology under the impact of Hellenistic thought and culture. One might think there are Christian ideas of soul and body, immortality and original sin in our reading but caution is advised. There are significant differences.

For example, the opening lines of our reading could give the impression that, for this author, God created human beings immortal and that immortality was lost through 'the devil's envy' - one of the few Old Testament texts that refer to the garden story of Genesis 2–3 and one that turns the serpent (one of God's creatures) of that story into a demonic figure. However, a consideration of the book indicates the author accepted that all creatures, human beings included, die naturally. What God intended to bestow on the human being was the gift of imperishable life but this was forfeited by the human being transferring its loyalty from God to the devil (exposed by the reality of sin). This leads in turn to a reconsideration of the meaning of the term death in the statement 'it was the devil's envy that brought death into the world'. It would seem that this is best interpreted as a spiritual death that the wicked bring upon themselves. That this spiritual death is something that afflicts the wicked, or with which the wicked are punished for their sins, is borne out by the way the reading does not paint a picture of 'original sin' affecting everyone and indeed all creation in some way. Note the statements that 'the world's created things (including human beings) have health in them, in them no fatal poison can be found, and Hades holds no power on earth'. This is a very positive view of creation, echoing the statement in Genesis 1:31 that God saw all that he had made and 'indeed it was very good'.

For an idea of how this author sees the wicked and the spiritual death that is their lives, read the verses in between the selection that is our reading (that is, 2:1-22). Part of this text forms the Old Testament reading for the 4th Friday of Lent. The presence of reported speech in this section suggests to some that the author is quoting the words of his adversaries and that the book is partly the product of an intense and at times hostile

debate in late post-exilic Judaism. New Testament authors no doubt drew on aspects of this author's theology as well as other works of the so-called 'inter-testamental period'.

Psalm 29:2, 4-6, 11-13

The responsorial psalm is a thanksgiving psalm and it is a pity that a verse is missing from the selection in the lectionary because it helps to explain such statements as 'His anger lasts a moment; his favour through life. At night there are tears, but joy comes with dawn.' In the missing verse the psalmist confesses to having committed a sin of pride, saying 'in my prosperity, "I shall not be moved".' He or she forgot that it is God who bestows favour. According to the following verses, God hid his face and 'I was dismayed'. This was experienced as being bested by enemies and coming close to the grave. We always seek to make sense of experience by providing an interpretation of it and relating it to the larger 'whole' of our lives in some way. For people of faith the role of God almost inevitably becomes a factor, as in this case. But what the psalmist sees as the hiding of the divine face was for a good purpose; it led the psalmist to acknowledge his/her wrong and to cry to God for forgiveness. The outcome was presumably a happier life for which the psalmist gives thanks to God ('you have changed my mourning into dancing').

It is at times hard to pin down what is the precise source of, or reason for, a psalmist's lament in some of the psalms. In this psalm one has the initial impression that enemies are the problem but then it is the threat of death, perhaps from sickness or what enemies have done. Other psalms use the imagery of being all alone, of being surrounded by wild beasts, of being tossed about like flotsam in the sea. One has the impression that there was a repertoire of images and metaphors that could be used to voice a variety of laments or to respond to a variety of lamentable situations. This was probably deliberate; it enabled such psalms, whether lament or thanksgiving, to be used by a wide variety of people in a wide variety of situations. In short, it is the ritual or stylized language that one often finds in the liturgy.







WORLD ELDER ABUSE AWARENESS DAY

The United Nations established World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAD) in 2011 to raise awareness about the abuse, neglect, and exploitation that older persons face while promoting respect and dignity for this population. The programming for WEAD this year, commencing 15 June, places the Spotlight on Older Persons in Emergencies. Emergencies, whether natural disasters, pandemics, or conflicts, disproportionately impact older persons. These events often exacerbate existing vulnerabilities, making it essential to address their needs in emergency planning and response. Older persons may face mobility issues, chronic health conditions, or social isolation, making it difficult for them to access aid, evacuate safely, or receive timely medical care and support services.

Awareness of Elder Abuse within our community

Alarming data released by the NSW Ageing and Disability Commission (ADC) shows a 38 per cent increase in statutory reports about the abuse of older people, with 53 per cent of these reports relating to allegations against adult children. The numbers will continue to rise unless we talk more about elder abuse.

The data reported by NSW Ageing and Disability Commission during 2020-2022 showed:

67 per cent of reports about abuse related to older women.

Regional NSW accounted for just over half of reports, with the Hunter, Illawarra Shoalhaven, and Central Coast the most common areas.

Adult Children (29 per cent) and paid workers (28 per cent) were the main reporters.

Signs of abuse can include the older person is no longer receiving the services they need to live, they are being prevented form speaking or seeing family, friends or grandchildren, or they cannot spend or access their own money.
