## FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION REFLECTION

The Assumption of Our Lady, celebrated on August 15th, is a significant feast in the Catholic Church, honouring the belief that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory at the end of her earthly life. This doctrine, proclaimed dogmatically by Pope Pius XII in 1950, reflects the deep veneration of Mary as the Mother of God and the first and most perfect disciple of Christ.


In the Assumption, we see the fulfilment of Mary's unique role in salvation history. Chosen by God to bear His Son, Mary responded with total faith and obedience, becoming the new Eve whose "yes" brought life and salvation into the world. Her Assumption is a testament to her sinless nature, preserved from original sin from the moment of her conception, and her life of perfect fidelity to God's will.

This feast also points to the destiny that awaits all faithful Christians. In Mary, we see a glimpse of our own future resurrection and glorification. The Assumption reminds us that our ultimate home is not in this world but in the eternal presence of God. It is a call to live our lives with an eternal perspective, focusing not on the temporary trials and tribulations of this life but on the everlasting joy and peace that God promises.

Furthermore, the Assumption underscores the dignity of the human body. In a world that often devalues the body, treating it merely as a tool for pleasure or productivity, Mary's Assumption affirms the sacredness of the body. Her being taken up into heaven body and soul signifies that our bodies, too, are destined for glory. This has profound implications for how we view and treat our bodies and the bodies of others, calling us to respect and honour them as temples of the Holy Spirit.

As we reflect on the Assumption, we are invited to deepen our devotion to Mary, seeking her intercession and following her example of faith, humility, and obedience. Mary, assumed into heaven, continues to be our mother and advocate, guiding us towards her Son and the fullness of life in Him.

Let us, therefore, celebrate this feast with joy and gratitude, honouring Our Lady's Assumption and renewing our commitment to live as faithful disciples of Christ, with our eyes fixed on the heavenly glory that awaits us. Mary, Queen assumed into heaven, pray for us!.

CatholicCare provides a number of services to support people who are homeless or transient, including a women's refuge, transitional accommodation options, young parents homelessness services and street sleeping outreach supports. We also operate Dom's Place in Hornsby and Mary Mac's Place in Woy Woy where we provide meals, a place to shower and wash clothes, and somewhere for people who are homeless or transient to come and connect with supports and community. Your donations on this weekend would be greatly appreciated.



• Raise awareness of the plight of people who are without a home and numbers involved

• Life expectancy for people who are homeless is about 30 years less than general population

- 140 people died in NSW whilst homeless last year
- Clear link between homelessness and mental illness. People with chronic mental illness can not maintain or deal with their own home without a great deal of support.

Mind Australia in Victoria is meeting these needs by providing, so far, about thirteen

"Havens" of 16 self-contained units with 24/7 and NDIS support. More are to follow.

• Mind Australia and The Haven Foundation are bringing their expertise from Victoria to build housing-with-care on behalf of "HOME on the Central Coast" (an initiative started 13 years ago) for people with chronic mental illness, with NSW Government funding. This will house 16 people; so many more such caring developments will be needed.

## HOUSING FOR PEOPLE WITH ENDURING MENTAL ILLNESS

During National Homelessness Week, the committee of the registered charity HOME on the Central Coast, established 12 years ago, would like to give an update and also say thanks for your previous support for this incorporated association. Its aim is to provide social housing-with-care for vulnerable people with chronic mental illness. This is a community organisation in which some parishioners have become involved. It's a sad fact that in NSW at least 140 people die each year while homeless, and about 80% would have an untreated mental illness, and die without any care and in isolation.

We are pleased that Mind Australia, based in Victoria, and its subsidiary The Haven Foundation are coming to NSW on behalf of HOME on the Central Coast. The NSW Government has allocated \$20 million to build three "Haven" social housing projects, the first to be on the Central Coast. Ten

"Haven" projects for up to 16 residents, with communal facilities and 24-hour care, have already been built in Victoria, with 14 more to follow soon. Residents express their appreciation on the Mind Australia website. Kindly pray for the local project, especially that suitable land will soon be found. HOME on the Central Coast committee ill take on the role of advocacy and fund raising for all needed extras, and be a support to families of residents.




