REFLECTION FOR FATHER'S DAY

Fatherhood is a sacred vocation, a calling from God that bears the responsibility of nurturing not just the physical and emotional well-being of children, but also their spiritual growth. On this Father's Day, we are reminded of the profound role fathers play in the lives of their children, especially within the Catholic faith. The example a father sets can shape a child's understanding of love, integrity, and their relationship with God.

In Catholic teaching, the father is often seen as the spiritual head of the household. This doesn't mean merely enforcing rules or providing material needs but being a living witness to the love and mercy of God. A Catholic father's role is to embody the virtues of faith, hope, and charity, not just in words but in actions. Children learn more from what they see than what they hear, so a father's daily life becomes the first catechism his children encounter.

One of the most important ways a father can witness to his children is by modeling a life of prayer and devotion. Another crucial aspect of a father's role is teaching his children about the faith. This doesn't necessarily mean delivering formal religious instruction—though that is important—but more so in the way he lives his faith. Whether it's taking the time to explain the meaning of a feast day, sharing stories of saints, or discussing the homily after Mass, these moments provide opportunities for children to see how faith is integrated into daily life. Through these interactions, a father passes on the richness of Catholic tradition, helping his children to build a strong spiritual foundation.

Finally, a Catholic father's witness includes showing how to live out the Gospel in everyday life. This means practicing charity, being honest, showing respect for others, and standing up for what is right. When a father acts justly and treats others with dignity, he teaches his children the importance of living out their faith in the world.

On this Father's Day, let us celebrate and pray for all fathers, especially those striving to fulfill their role as the spiritual leaders of their families. May they be strengthened in their vocation, and may their witness to God's love and truth guide their children on the path of faith. Fathers, you are a gift from God, and through your love and example, you help to bring your children closer to Him.

"Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained" John 20:22-23

WHAT ARE SOME BENEFITS OF GOING TO CONFESSION?

Confession helps us to better "know myself." Confession brings us peace. Confession helps us become more saintly, more like Jesus. Confession makes our will stronger.

FIVE STEPS FOR A GOOD CONFESSION

- Examine your conscience
- Be sincerely sorry for your sins
- Confess your sins to a priest
- Resolve to change your lite
- After your confession, do the penance the priest assigns.

HOW OFTEN SHOULD I GO TO CONFESSION?

According to the Church's command, "after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year."Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion, even if he experiences deep contrition, without having first received sacramental absolution, unless he has a grave reason for receiving Communion and there is no possibility of going to Confession.

Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1457

WHAT IS A SIN?

Sin is an offence against God, His love and His law and turns our hearts away from Him.

Mortal sins destroy the grace of God in the heart of the sinner. Mortal sin cuts our relationship off from God and turns us away from Him.

Mortal sin is committed with full knowledge of the sinner.

Mortal sin is committed with full consent of the sinner.

This means that mortal sins cannot be done "accidentally." A person who commits a mortal sin is one who knows that their sin is wrong, but still decides to commit the sin anyway. This means that mortal sins are rejection of God's law and love.

Venial sin - is committed without full reflection and consent and doesn't cut us off from Christ. It weakens union with God.

WHAT IS THE CATHOLIC DEFINITION OF SCRUPULOUS?

In Catholic moral teaching, scrupulosity defines the spiritual and psychological state of a person who wrongly believes he/she is often guilty of mortal sin and therefore not often in a state of grace.

For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lipservice, while their hearts are far from me.

The worship they offer me is worthless, the doctrines they teach are only human regulations.

You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.'


