
NEW TESTAMENT COMMENTARY

BY MARY COLOE PBVM "Us and Them"

James 5:1-6; Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

In today's Gospel it is John, not Peter who is the spokesperson for the disciples and he raises an objection to others working in Jesus' name but who are not one of the 'in' crowd – 'he was not one of us'. John here voices the tragic judgement that people often make about those who are different from themselves. Instead of focusing on what they share in common able to cast out demons, working in the name of Jesus - John measures this other person's activity solely in terms of his belonging within the discipleship group or not. Does he have the same Galilean accent; does he recognise the importance of the inner group of disciples; has he followed Jesus from the beginning, or is he a later arrival? Jesus' reply points out that the disciples have no monopoly on Jesus' name. The ability to work miracles is not something the disciples have a franchise on. God is able to work outside their select group.

As I write this, I am conscious of a recent decision taken by the Australian government to process people seeing asylum here, in another country, Nauru. Many Christian Church leaders have spoken out against this policy. This seems to me to be an example of failing to see in these people, the same human needs, and desires that we share - freedom from fear of oppression and death, the possibility of a better life for themselves and their children. With the exception of the aboriginal people, we are all late arrivals, and most of our ancestors were at one time, 'boat people'. Peter's words, 'he was not one of us' need to be reflected on, in the light of the many struggles taking place in our world today. We see many examples on the nightly news of the violence cause by such intolerance of others who are different - different ethnic group, different religion, and different culture - not one of us! Jesus' response to Peter is very strong - 'you must not stop him'! Perhaps today could be spent on reviewing our own attitudes to people who are different. Perhaps

instead of focusing on the differences we might look to find what we have in common.

The other material in today's Gospel probably goes back to independent sayings of Jesus that Mark has collected into this context. Using extreme examples, typical of oral teaching, Jesus speaks of the deadliness of sin. Not so long ago we heard news reports told of a young hiker in America whose arm was trapped beneath a boulder. His desire for life was so strong that he amputated his own arm, rather than remain trapped and die. This graphic example depicts the point of Jesus' teaching. Choose life not death, even if the life choice costs.

The reading from James addresses the issue of justice and the sinfulness of greed and wealth acquired at the expense of others. In this letter, James is dealing with the practical realities of living a truly Christian life. Wealth, poverty, greed, cheating and unfair wages these are real issues for his community as they are for us today. Sometimes you hear it said that religion should keep out of politics, but this is impossible, since religion deals with the realities of people's lives, and people live within political systems. We do well to remember that Jesus was killed as a political troublemaker in teaching an alternative kingdom to the empire of Rome. If we want to be Christian in more than name, then how we live in our community, how we participate in shaping political values need to be seen as ways of being disciples.
