AUSTRALIANS TO PLAY ROLE IN MAJOR GLOBAL EVENT IN ROME

Australian Catholics will play a key role in a month-long global event aimed at shaping the future of the Church.

Fifteen Australians will attend the second session of the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in Rome from October 2 to 27, which has the theme "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission".

A two-day spiritual retreat from September 30 will end with an evening mass with Pope Francis.

The work of the second session is expected to get underway after the opening Mass on the morning of October 2, with the final Mass scheduled for the morning of October 27.

The process began in October 2021, inviting people all over the world to express their understanding of a "synodal" Church and provide input into priority issues. After several rounds of global consultations, a "synthesis report" was then produced following the first session held in Rome in October 2023.

The task of the second session is to complete the discernment begun at the first session and offer the result of this discernment to Pope Francis in a final document.

The second session will be guided by a document known as the Instrumentum laboris, which summarises the "fruit" of the consultation.

Australia and other countries provided a "national contribution" ahead of the second session. This document brought together the thoughts of hundreds of Catholics on how to improve the way the Church practices synodality and co-responsibility in mission.

Social media, liturgy and faith, reaching out to families and young people, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander ministry, the equal dignity of women and men, working with other churches and encouraging the use of peoples' unique gifts were themes from the consultations.

The work of the synodal assembly – through plenary sessions known as "general congregations" and working groups – will be divided into five "modules" which mirror the sections of the Instrumentum laboris: Foundations, Relations, Pathways, Places and Conclusion.

The concluding module will be devoted to the discussion and approval of the final document which will go to Pope Francis,




NEW PWBB APPEAL FOR 2024/25 - WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT

GLOBAL DAY OF PRAYER AND FASTING

Pope Francis has called for a global day of prayer and fasting on October 7 to mark the one-year anniversary of the Hamas attack on Israel amid escalating violence in the region.

The Pope's surprise announcement, made at the end of his homily at Mass in St Peter's Square yesterday, comes the morning after Iran launched hundreds of missiles towards Israel following the launch of the Israeli military's ground offensive in Lebanon.

Pope Francis said the Church is always at the service of humanity "especially in his dramatic hour of our history, as the winds of war and the fires of violence continue to ravage entire peoples and nations".

"I ask everyone to take part in a day of prayer and fasting for peace in the world," he said.

Pope Francis also revealed that he will go to Rome's Basilica of St Mary Major on Sunday to pray the Rosary on the eve of the anniversary "to invoke the gift of peace through the intercession of Most Holy Mary".

The Pope made his plea for peace during the opening Mass for the second assembly of the Synod on Synodality. Speaking to the more than 400 priests, bishops, cardinals, and lay Synod delegates gathered in St Peter's Square for the Mass, the Pope invited the members of the Synod to join him in the Marian basilica to pray the Rosary for peace

Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, has urged the importance of "prayer, fasting and penance" for peace and reconciliation in the Holy Land.

The cardinal published a prayer for peace which he has asked Catholics to pray along with the rosary during the Marian month of October.

Last week, Maronite Bishop Antoine-Charbel Tarabay called on all faithful to pray for peace, asking parishes of the Maronite Eparchy to hold Eucharistic Adoration, and to dedicate Masses on October 7 to peace in Lebanon and the Holy Land.

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference is supporting the global day of prayer and fasting for peace on October 7 and is encouraging people to participate.



'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too.'

People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.
