SOUTH LAND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Beatitudes we just heard are at the beginning of the 'Sermon on the Mount'. This sermon provides a picture of a society where the usual expectations of how people relate to each other are overturned.

Our Lord wants to create a new society where the old rules of engagement are superseded, especially in relation to enmity and violence. In fact, in the Sermon on the Mount all forms of resolving disputes, starting with families (spouses, brothers) are turned upside down. And we are a 'Land Down Under'.

Australia is a place to which people have been attracted over the millennia to forge a new future. First, the original inhabitants coming down through Asia, and then the settlers, migrants and refugees of the last 236 years. (Of course, the convicts were a less voluntary part of the movement of peoples!)

Most were attracted by a vision of a different future, a future where human beings could relate to each other differently to the old order in Europe, and more recently in the Middle East or Africa or Asia or Central or South America.

People were and are prepared to take the risk of being dislocated, of re-locating because of that vision of a different future, particularly a future not determined by the violence of feudal warfare which had characterised their homelands for generations, centuries, and even millennia.

They come because they aspire to be someone different, to do something different, in ways not predetermined by centuries of custom and tradition in their home society.

Is this movement of people to Australia a 'chance event'? Is it just another phase of world history? No.

I recall walking down a corridor in the Vatican, the wall of which was painted with a map of the world. Where Australia is, there was just ocean blue. It was painted before European explorers began to map our coastline!

Those mapping expeditions gave us our name 'Australia'. De Quiros, the great Portuguese explorer of the 16th Century, set out on a quest for 'Terra Austrialia del Espiritu Santo', South Land of the Holy Spirit. Right from the start, the full title of our land was bound up with the Holy Spirit.

I am confident that 'Australia' is a work of the Holy Spirit, no chance event in world history but a gathering of peoples for a Divine purpose.

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention

For the right to an education.

Let us pray for migrants, refugees and those affected by war, that their right to an education, which is necessary to build a better world, might always be respected.

One of the most distinctive works of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost was the breaking down of ethnic, tribal and language barriers between people. That is why Christianity spread like wild fire across the Roman Empire.

Australia is a place where that Pentecostal impulse is felt very strongly. People from every nation, tribe, ethnic and religious group on the face of the earth have relocated here and are creating a new sort of society.

Human beings can relate to each other free from past structures of oppression and division in their old homeland societies.

They have come, in their millions, to escape the histories of societies where everyone 'knew their place', to a land where we relate to each other for our inherent worth. Hence the great Australian characteristic: 'egalitarianism'. This is simply the social recognition of the truth of the Genesis creation story: we all share a common humanness and a common humanity.

Have we responded to the Holy Spirit perfectly? No. Our treatment of the earliest inhabitants of this land was shameful, to say the least. Here in Tasmania, the use of armed force against the aboriginal people was authorised at the highest levels. Tasmanian historian, Nick Brodie, has written on this under the title The Vandemonian War. This nicely plays on the original name of Tasmania, i.e. Van Diemen's Land, and the sense of a demonic force utterly contrary to the Spirit of the Sermon on the Mount.

Our treatment of those genuinely fleeing persecution in their homelands on occasion falls short of what the Lord of the Sermon on the Mount desires.

But on the whole, we are creating a version of the Kingdom of God

under the Southern Cross of which we can be proud.


So, Australians All, let us rejoice –







DO YOU KNOW THE SYMBOLS OF THE **JUBILEE YEAR?**

Pilgrimage

The Jubilee calls us to set out on a journey and overcome certain limits. When we move, in fact, we do not merely change location, but we transform ourselves. This is why it is important to prepare, plan the route, and understand the destination. In this sense, the pilgrimage that defines this year begins even before the journey itself: its starting point is the decision to embark on it.

Holy Door

From a symbolic point of view, the Holy Door acquires a particular significance. It is the most characteristic sign because the goal is to be able to cross it. Upon crossing this threshold, the pilgrim recalls the text from chapter 10 of the Gospel according to Saint John: "I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved; they will come in and go out and find pasture". The gesture expresses the decision to follow and be guided by Jesus, who is the Good Shepherd.

Reconciliation

The Jubilee is a sign of reconciliation because it opens a

favorable time for personal conversion.

One places God at the center of their existence, turning towards Him and acknowledging His primacy. Specifically, it involves living the sacrament of reconciliation, taking advantage of this time to rediscover the value of confession, and personally receiving the word of God's forgiveness.

Prayer

There are many ways and many reasons to pray.

The foundation is always the desire to open oneself to the presence of God and His offer of love. The Christian community feels called and knows that it can address the Father only because it has received the Spirit of the Son. The moments of prayer experienced during the journey show that the pilgrim carries the ways of God in his heart.

Liturgy

The liturgy is the public prayer of the Church. According to the Second Vatican Council, it is the summit toward which all her action is directed and, at the same time, the source from which all her energy flows. At the center is the Eucharistic celebration, where the body and blood of Christ are received. As a pilgrim, He Himself walks alongside the disciples and reveals to them the mysteries

of the Father, so that they may say,
"Stay with us, for it is nearly evening and the day is almost over." (Luke 24:29)

Profession of Faith

The profession of faith, also called the creed, is a sign of identity specific to the baptized. It expresses the central content of the faith and summarizes the main truths that a believer accepts and bears witness to on the day of their baptism, sharing them with the entire Christian community for the rest of their life.

Indulgence

An indulgence is a concrete manifestation of God's mercy that surpasses and transforms the limits of human justice. This treasure of grace became history in Jesus and the saints. By witnessing these examples and living in communion with them, the hope of forgiveness and one's own path to holiness is strengthened and becomes a certainty. The indulgence allows one to free their heart from the burden of sin and make the necessary preparation with full freedom.
