

3rd Sunday of Lent Year B Lord, you have the words of everlasting life.

Ex 20: 1-17; 1 Cor 1: 22-25; Jn 2: 13-25





Jesus drives out the moneychangers from the Temple and says that he will destroy the temple and raise it up again.

..The Gospel of John tends to reflect greater tension and animosity between Jesus and the Jewish authorities than the Synoptic

Gospels. The Gospel of John was the last of the four Gospels to be written, and its narrative reflects the growing divide between the Jewish community and the early Christian community. Thus, greater emphasis on the distinction between Christianity and Judaism is found in John's Gospel.

Reflecting upon the destruction of the Temple of Jerusalem (A.D. 70), John recalls Jesus' cleansing of the Temple and uses that story to interpret this later event. John explains to his audience, an early Christian community, that temple worship would no longer be necessary because it was surpassed in the passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus. With greater frequency than the other

Evangelists, John intersperses post-Resurrection reflections of this Christian community in his narrative.

After clearing the Temple of the merchants and the moneychangers, John's Gospel tells us that the people asked for a sign of Jesus' authority to do such an audacious act. In response, Jesus predicted his death and Resurrection. Throughout John's Gospel, the language of signs is distinctive. Jesus' miracles are called signs, and the people look to these signs for proof of his authority. Here we learn that the sign par excellence will be Jesus' passion, death, and Resurrection.

During Lent we reflect upon the meaning of this sign for us and for our world. We might take this opportunity to consider the quality of our prayer and worship. In our prayers we seek to deepen our relationship with the person of Christ. In our worship with the community, we gather to experience anew the passion, death, and Resurrection of Jesus and its significance in our lives. Bishop Peter Comensoli reminds us of our obligations and the benefits derived from doing well chosen Lenten Penance as we prepare for the focal point of the Church's liturgical year, Easter. By choosing wisely, he states that Lent can become a time of

many graces and growth in our relationship with God. Share God's mercy with others. **Paschal Precept:** The faithful are obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, between Ash Wednesday (February 14) and Trinity Sunday (27th May), unless for a good reason it is done at another time; and to confess grave sins at least once a year.

SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMENT: (Paul Cramsie) The Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart congregation has denounced the government's plan to increase weapons exports. "Weapons are designed to kill and maim human beings," said Congregational Leader Sr Monica Cavanagh. "We completely reject the philosophy which finds it acceptable to boost industry, create jobs, increase exports and protect local manufacturing via the arms

trade. "We agree with Pope Francis that those who seek to benefit from trading in weapons are 'merchants of death'," she said. In a statement, the Sisters said "there is enormous difference between a defence manufacturing industry to protect Australia and the development of a weapons export industry". They raised concerns over the government's assurances about maintaining controls over which nations could access Australian weapons, stating the proposal lacks "detail on methods of oversight and on how such controls would be policed". "It is a matter of great concern and sorrow that Australia's overseas aid has dropped to its lowest level ever, while at the same time plans are underway to increase the sale of weapons.'

"We strongly urge the government to resist the hypocrisy of talking about peace while financing and supporting the arms trade," Sr Monica said. "Over 90% of those who die in war zones are not soldiers, but civilians. "It is reprehensible for government and industry authorities to pursue financial and electoral gain through promoting the weapons which enable the escalation of violence."
