In today's Gospel, there are four exchanges between Jesus and the crowd. In the first, the crowd, having followed Jesus to Capernaum, asks a very matter of fact question: "Rabbi, when did you get here?" Jesus replies by naming their motivation

in pursuing him. They have been fed. Jesus acknowledges this, yet challenges them to see beyond the fulfillment of their material needs. The crowds have followed Jesus because they have been fed. They ought to be seeking out Jesus because he can give them eternal life

As the second dialogue begins, it seems that the crowd might be on their way to accepting Jesus and his mission. They ask: "What can we do to accomplish the works of God?" Jesus replies that they must have faith in the one sent from God. But in the third dialogue, the crowd reveals their inability to see Jesus' true identity. They ask Jesus for a sign so that they might know that Jesus is from God. How strange this sounds since Jesus has just

fed more than 5000 people. What more is expected? But the crowd cannot see beyond the surface of the sign. They show this in their interpretation of the sign that came from Moses. In their description, they identify Jesus with Moses, as if to say, as Moses gave the people manna in the desert, give us a sign so that we will know that you are from God. They are looking to identify a prophet without realizing that God is standing before them. Jesus corrects their misinterpretation, saying that the manna received by their ancestors came from God. As God fulfilled their ancestors' needs in the desert, so God has provided them with food for eternal life. In the bread that they have received from Jesus, they have received physical nourishment and also spiritual nourishment. Jesus wants the crowd to see beyond the surface to the One who provides true nourishment. The conclusion of the dialogue reveals the crowd's blindness. They ask for what Jesus has just told them they have found: "Sir, give us this bread always." Jesus answers plainly that he himself is the Bread of Life they seek. Jesus himself is the Bread of Life who will satisfy every hunger and thirst. (Loyola Press)

Wednesday August 8 ~ Solemnity of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop: Faith ~ Anne Rennie

A SERENDIPITOUS spelling error in a student presentation on Mary Mackillop got me thinking about what we do to nurture our souls. The dear girl had been talking about Mary being the soul (instead of sole) provider of her family in 1850's Melbourne. It had fallen on Mary's young shoulders to look after the family, as her father's income and employment were erratic. Charity for Mary really did begin at home.



We have internet providers and service providers and health providers in a world that sometimes seems spiritually barren?

Prayer is one such avenue of provision, a means of nourishment, a well that never runs dry. Prayer features in our daily homeroom. It is our opening up to God and I explain the sign of the cross as a readiness and receptivity. It must be executed reverently, not casually. We are then orientated, albeit briefly, to the sacred, before the business of timetable changes and lost property announcements. I love that the students pray for each other unselfconsciously, collectively and with a community warmth that translates into more than a wish that things get better. A child can share their concerns or hurts or joys. They can pray for victory at netball or for those suffering the torments of natural disasters or

terrorism in faraway lands. They can count their daily blessings of good health, play lunch knowing they sleep safely at night. The "Lord hear our prayer" chorused response of the 25 others who have witnessed this small petition is charged with another-worldly grace.

Education is so much more than literacy and numeracy and becoming a productive economic unit. It is also about soul searching and finding.

Prayer can provide a new learning about self when ego is left behind and silence embraced and we wait for an inner whisper. The beauty of prayer is that the opening of our hearts is as natural as the opening of a flower, wrote the Benedictine priest John Main. If the young people who share our lives are enabled to appreciate beautiful words and melodies, to see the magic in the moon and the sun setting fire to the horizon at the end of the day, and to thank God for this, then their souls will indeed be nourished.



mountain. While they are there, Elijah and Moses appear with Jesus. In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, Jesus instructed the disciples to keep secret what they had seen until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. The disciples' confusion continued as they wondered what Jesus meant by "rising from the dead." Until they also witness his passion and death, the disciples cannot possibly understand Jesus' Transfiguration. We, however, have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we see in this event an anticipation of Jesus' Resurrection, a foreshadowing of

Christ's glory in heaven, and the promise of our own resurrection. (Loyola Press)




