In John's Gospel, we hear Jesus affirm that he is known by the Father and that his disciples will know the Father by knowing Jesus. In this passage, however, Jesus reminds his disciples

that this knowledge is to be expressed in love. Those who know Jesus well-and Jesus says that his disciples do know him-will love one another. Knowledge leads to love, which leads to action. John reminds his community that Jesus taught that love is the sign of a true disciple and, thus, a true Christian. Even more, a true disciple shows a particular kind of love, sacrificial love. In the Greek, there are two words for love that are used in this passage. The first is *agape*. The second is *philia*. The first word is most often used to describe love for other persons and for God. It is understood as the highest and most perfect kind of love. The second word is used to describe the affection of friendship. In this context, John appears to use these words as synonyms. The root of the Greek word for friend comes from this second term for love, philia. By using this word, Jesus transforms the terms of his relationship with his disciples and redefines for them their relationship with God. In the Hebrew Scriptures, faith in God made

Here Jesus teaches that his relationship to his disciples is based on friendship, not servitude.

John reminds his community that Jesus also taught that a disciple is one who had been chosen—one who had been chosen by Jesus. To be chosen by Jesus, however, is not to be set apart from the world. Instead, to be chosen by Jesus is to be sent to serve the world as he did. **The disciples of Jesus were chosen and were sent into the world to bear fruit by serving others, by sacrificing for others, in love.**

This reading, like last week's, is part of Jesus' Last Supper discourse. In the context of John's Gospel, these words are spoken before Jesus' Crucifixion. We read his instruction to the disciples in light of his death and Resurrection. We know **that Jesus himself gives us the greatest example of the kind of love and service that he teaches to his disciples.** He has, in fact, laid down his life for his friends, for his disciples, and for us. Through his death and Resurrection, we have received the grace to love others as Jesus has commanded. (Loyola Press).

WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY - 6 May 2018

A message from Bishop Peter A Comensoli

In his annual Message for World Communications Day, Pope Francis says, that communication is part of God's plan for us - an essential way to experience fellowship. But, in this age of fast and furious media it can be difficult to know who and what we can trust. News, Social Media, Movies, Videos, Celebrities, Art, Music and more fill our lives with conflicting stories and realities.

Carefully discerning authentic communications, and being authentic communicators ourselves can be a minefield we need to negotiate carefully...and slowly.

It can be all too easy to place the responsibility for 'good' news solely on journalists and media organisations, when in fact we too share in the ownership of information by how we receive and share it.

As Pope Francis says in his Message, we need to be 'people who are not greedy but ready to listen, people who make the effort to engage in sincere dialogue so that the truth can emerge; people who are attracted by goodness and take responsibility for how they use language.'

And at all times, we need to be the voice of Christ. In the words of St Francis of Assisi: *Lord, make us instruments of your peace.*

Love and commandments: The love that Jesus speaks about is very different from the love of the pop songs on MTV, or much of the love on TV and the movies. Sometimes when we love, we will be very happy. But sometimes loving the poor, the sick, the criminal will not be very easy. If we have to look after a relative who is close to dying, it can be a very painful experience,

especially if that patient is difficult or unresponsive to our attentions. But that is love. Love is not a question of keeping rules and commandments. Love is a way of life.

It is an internal attitude which influences every single thing we do and say and think. **The love of a Christian needs to be unconditional**. Sometimes people will love us back; sometimes they will not. Sometimes, even though we want to love people, they may reject us. If they do reject us, we need not necessarily think that we have done wrong. When people cannot return genuine love, it is they who have the problem. Sad to say, not everyone is capable of loving. All the more reason why we need to reach out to them. People often learn to love by being loved.

The most important thing is not that I am very clever, very successful, very rich, very famous... The most important thing is that I am someone who really loves.

When I genuinely love others, there will always be some who cannot love me back but there will be others who will really respond in love. And it may be that my love has empowered them to be loving too. To be able to reach out in love and to experience being loved is God's greatest grace. *Sacred Space -<u>www.sacredspace.ie</u>*

After some years, the Russians pulled out of the country with no explanation.
