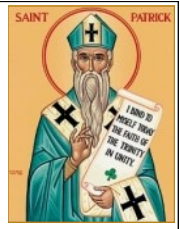

That a spirit of dialogue, encounter and reconciliation emerge in the Near East, where diverse religious communities share their lives together.

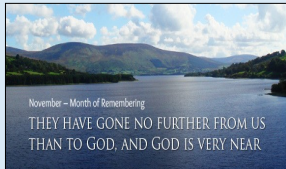


**Billy Elliott and the Resurrection © Fr Michael Tate**

Billy Elliott was a boy brought up in a strife-torn mining town in the north of England. He discovered a passion for dancing. At an interview at the Royal Ballet School which was going badly, he was asked: 'What do you feel when you're dancing?' 'I've got fire in my body.' And he got the scholarship because the panel realised that when Billy danced, he became 'fully alive': body-mind-spirit fully integrated. When Billy danced, everything that Billy was, was dancing. That is what our Resurrection is all about. Our whole personality will be dancing with the radiance of Divine Fire coursing through our body-mind-spirit. The Sadducees' small-minded sarcasm could not grasp that we will be bodies transfigured, translucent to divine light and energy. We could take a moment to pray that, by the grace of God, our bodies will dance, enflamed by Divine Love.

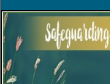

**Parish Renewal and Revitalisation ... The Plenary Council 2020:**

As you may already know, the Plenary Council 2020 will be held next year. The initial phase was Listening and Dialogue and from this six themes have been chosen for the Council to focus upon. The second phase is Listening and Discernment on these six themes and discuss ideas about what the future of our Church should look like. The six themes are: Open to conversion, renewal and reform; A joyful, hope-filled and servant community; Humble, healing and merciful; Prayerful and Eucharistic; Inclusive, participatory and synodal; Missionary and evangelising.

## KCCP has joined the 'cashless society' at St Patrick's Asquith, installing two Tap and go devices.



As more and more people cease to carry cash, we have noticed a continuing decline in giving to our 2nd collection which is important to the parish as these funds are used to fund the day to day running of our parish. A recent decision was taken by the Parish Financial Committee to install 2 Tap 'n' Go devices which are located near the centre door to the main courtyard and near the door to the side courtyard (near the school). Each of these machines are set to \$5.00 per tap, so if you wanted to contribute \$5 you would tap once, or if \$10 you would tap twice etc etc.
