
All families of Ku-ring-gai Chase Parish are invited to attend the 9am Mass on Sunday August 18 to celebrate the Feast of St. Bernard


(one of the two Patron Saints of our parish; actual Feast Day August 20). We would like this Mass to be attended by as many parishioners and families of the entire parish as possible.





## **Pope's intention** for August:

Families ~ That

families, through their life of prayer and love, become ever more clearly "schools of true human growth."



© Fr Michael Tate Jesus lived in a remote part of the Roman Empire where the majority eked out an existence. One of the few ways in which redistribution of wealth could occur was by voluntarily giving to the poor. So Jesus instructs his followers: 'Sell your possessions and give generously to those in need.'

We live in a very different society: 'The Commonwealth of Australia.' 'Common-wealth' indicates that the wealth of this nation, its people and resources, are meant to be directed to the common good. So, we respond to Our Lord's command in ways very different to what was possible in his day.

We have a compulsory taxation system which forces us to give up some of our possessions, some of our wealth to the common-wealth. Taxation and social justice policies help fulfil Our Lord's command to create a society more humane than anything remotely possible under the Roman Empire. And that would please Our Lord. Why? In part because those in need are helped. But, perhaps in greater part, because it makes us larger hearted people. We have to arrive at the moment of death with a heart so capacious that it can include the billions of people we hope inhabit heavenly existence.

We might pause for a moment to pray for our hearts to be expanded by our contribution to the common-wealth of all peoples throughout the world.

## **FINANCE** COMMITTEE REPORT TO **PARISH**

## YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2019

The Parish Finance Committee reports as follows on the financial position and performance of the Parish for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2019. During the financial year the Parish repaid \$45,396 in debt at no penalty (leaving a loan balance of \$14.849), from sources including a maturing term deposit of \$30,000 and other available cash, resulting in a considerable saving in net interest expense for the current year. As a consequence the cash balance in the Church A/c has reduced by

## \$15,315 to \$47,333.

The revenue and expenses for the year recorded a surplus of \$30,569 compared to a surplus of \$6,002 for the previous year. This improvement was mainly due to operating income being up by \$5,609 due to increases in planned giving of \$1,619 and in the loose second collection by \$5,401 and operating expenses being \$10,067 less than the previous year. This was mainly due to Altar & Church Requisites being **\$6,275** lower than the previous year as a result of parishioners donations to assist with these costs.

Also Auditing, Accounting & Legal costs and Office Expenses were \$7,540 and **\$1,983** lower respectively. This was offset by Employment Expenses increasing by \$3,872 and Repairs & Maintenance Expenses by \$1,602 on the previous year.

Capital expenditure was \$1,450 lower than the previous year. The main expenditure during the year was \$26,182 for renovations on the Berowra Presbytery.

A summary of these figures appears opposite and on the Parish's website.
