Apostleship of the Sea Sunday (Sea Sunday) - 14 July Spirit of welcome leads 2019 Sea Sunday celebration

On Sea Sunday, the church prays for all those who live and work at sea.

Stella Maris, Apostleship of the Sea, is the official maritime welfare agency of the Catholic Church that supports seafarers both practically and spiritually, attending to their welfare in many ports around Australia and elsewhere through Stella Maris Centres and Chaplaincies. Chaplains, volunteers and staff visit to speak to the ship's crew, offer friendship, arrange Mass and attend Mass with them, listen to their needs, and provide access to Wi-Fi or Internet so they can contact their families. Hospitality within Stella Maris centres is also offered which provides an important break from work routines onboard.

The annual Sea Sunday appeal shines a light on the valuable work of one of the Catholic church's international agencies, the Apostleship of the Sea, which attends to the welfare of seafarers in many ports around Australia and elsewhere through Stella Maris Centres and Chaplaincies. Australian Catholic Bishops Conference president Archbishop Mark Coleridge said: "There are a million seafarers on the high seas, and that's why the work of Apostleship of the Sea is absolutely vital to caring for seafarers who are often doing it hard, and working under enormous pressure." "That's why I commend to you, whether you have a commercial seaport in your diocese or not, to support the essential mission of the Apostleship of the Sea."

Bishop Bosco Puthur, Bishop Promoter for the Apostleship of the Sea said, "The Scripture verse that is central to this year's Sea Sunday comes from Matthew (25:35) where Christ challenges us all with the words: 'I was a stranger and you welcomed me.""

Apostleship of the Sea Australia National Director, Roslyn Rajasingam, said: "Seafarers spend many months in the high seas, away from their homes and missing their families, combating times of loneliness and in constant fear of pirates and bad weather." "About 130,000 seafarers arrive at Australian ports each year, which is roughly the size of a city with a population like Darwin – this gives some insight into the importance of our work," she said. "For some of the men and women, it's the listening ear or the kind word or the shared prayer that reminds them of home and their spiritual centre. "Like chaplains in other important ministries, those who seek to show the face of Jesus at our ports are reliant on and grateful for the generosity of Catholics and other supporters who help us continue this critical outreach to seafarers who visit Australian ports." 

1 John 5:14 ~ This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us.

Last year we were blown away by the generosity of some parishioners. These humble and anonymous folk **have assisted and continue to assist** in the offsetting of annual expenses in the parish for our Altar Breads, Altar Wine, Paschal Candles and Easter Palms.

This year we would like to request financial assistance in the replacing of all wax candles in the parish with oil candles. *You might ask why?*

We have just had the carpets cleaned at both churches and the feedback from the cleaners was all about the excessive amount of impregnated wax and the difficulty in its complete removal. In additional to this, we do not have many volunteers willing to take on the laundering of the Altar Cloths which are also beginning to feel the negative effects of the melted wax.

We are embarking upon this transition from oil to wax now as it seems like the ideal time to limit additional wax spills which are damaging the linen and carpet and would be very expensive to replace. We are reliably informed that other parishes within our Diocese who are already using oil candles have seen a saving between 30-40% on their outlay for wax candles.

We are starting off by replacing the *Altar Candles. Each church will need 6 in total.* These will comprise of an outer shell and an inner oil canister (fully sealed) which sits neatly and invisibly inside the shell.

We need your assistance to raise \$1,975.00 plus freight to purchase the following

8 shells (21cm diameter) @ \$75 each and 2 shells (17.5cm diameter) @ \$62.50 each = \$725.00 (one off purchase costing)

2 x boxes Oil canister refills (total of 96 canisters) = \$1250.00

(ongoing costing—1 canister will last around 5 weeks—still better value than wax candles)

Going forward (as funds permit) we will replace

Altar Server Candles and Advent Wreaths

It is hoped that by explaining the above you can see how this will represent a vast saving to the parish. It will also give those who donate the opportunity to *see* how your donation has been put to good use. Partial donations gratefully accepted. *Please consider*.
