

3rd Sunday of Easter ~ Year B Lord, let your face shine on us. Acts 3:13-15, 17-19; 1 Jn 2:1-5; Lk 24:35-48





(Loyola Press). On the third Sunday of Easter, we continue to hear Gospel accounts of Jesus' appearances to his disciples following his Resurrection. Today's reading follows immediately after the report of Jesus' appearance to his disciples on the road to Emmaus.

Consistently in the reports of Jesus' post-Resurrection appearances, Jesus greets his disciples with the words, "*Peace be with you*." The disciples have witnessed the death of someone they

loved, and they now fear for their own lives as well. Peace is what they need more than anything else. Jesus often connects this greeting of peace with another gift—forgiveness. In today's Gospel, this connection is made in the final verses.

Even as they hear Jesus' greeting of peace, the disciples are startled and terrified. They are uncertain about what to make of the figure before them and, quite understandably, they mistake Jesus for a ghost. ... Jesus invites them to experience his resurrected body with their senses, to look and to touch. ... As further **proof of his identity** and of his resurrected body, Jesus eats with his disciples. The disciples have known Jesus best through the meals that he has shared with them... By eating with his disciples after his Resurrection, Jesus recalls all these meals, and most importantly, he recalls the Last Supper.

Luke's report of the Last Supper and the meals that Jesus shared after his Resurrection unveil for us **the significance of the Eucharist**. Having shared a meal with his disciples, Jesus now uncovers for them the significance of what was written about him in the Scriptures. So, too, our celebration of the **Mass is an encounter with Jesus**, through the Word and the Sacrament of the Eucharist. As **Jesus commissions his disciples** to be witnesses to what Scriptures foretold, our celebration of the Eucharist commissions us. Like the disciples, we are sent to announce the good news of Jesus' forgiveness of sins.



The disciples became convinced that they were in the presence of the Risen Lord Jesus Christ when he assumed a characteristic way of acting – sharing a companionable meal (of fish).

His bodily presence of that sort is now withdrawn from us. But we are now encountered by him in the Mass which has many dimensions, one of which is that of a sacred meal. When we share in the sacramental signs of his Real Presence in the Heavenly Bread and Spiritual Drink of Holy Communion, he brings us the life and warmth of the Risen Son.

In fact, he shares his very life with us, and because his life is gloriously fully human, we become less ghost -like as he heals those parts of our personality which drain goodness and vitality from the world.

We could take a moment to pray to take greater opportunities to share in the Real Presence of Our Risen Lord under the appearance of bread and wine. This will move us from the illusion of being alive to that vitality which is nourished by his glorified humanity.



The Last Supper

extract from Fr Shay Cullen, The Far East - March 2018 - p.8

... The meal of bread and wine, the Last Supper, the Eucharist, is much more than a farewell party, more than a religious rite and more than a religious obligation.

It's a unique event through which Christians experience His presence and during which the redemption of humankind that He brought about by his life, death and resurrection is re-enacted and renewed.

During the Eucharist we are called to be true and faithful disciples—to be another Christ. We are called to serve others as Jesus did—helping the poor, lifting up the downtrodden, releasing captives, healing the sick, challenging the causes of poverty and oppression, helping orphans and widows. This is the way to extend His presence and love in the world—through unselfish service.

A true disciple must take an active stand for the truth, justice and dignity of every person. The Eucharist not only gives us the spiritual power to embrace such principles but the courage to act for and on behalf of the abused, exploited, sick and the hungry.

Through faith in Jesus Christ we are one with God. When we break the bread and share the cup we celebrate this and commit ourselves to imitate Him and continue His mission to transform the world. Above all, the Eucharist is the living presence of Christ who is always with us.



Gaudete et Exsultate – Rejoice and be Glad

The newly released Apostolic Exhortation from Pope Francis, presents to us the call to holiness as a personal call for all Christians. and how we can respond in a practical way in our own times.

"We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves."

Pope Francis encourages us to reflect on living the Beatitudes, which he calls "a Christian's identity card"; and helps us to see the signs of holiness in today's world through perseverance, patience and meekness; joy and a sense of humour; boldness and passion; in community; and in constant prayer. He says, "the Lord asks everything of us, and in return he offers us true life, the happiness for which we were created.
