The season of Easter concludes with today's celebration, the feast of Pentecost.

On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem; this event marks **the beginning of the Church**.

The story of Pentecost is found in the Acts of the Apostles, today's first reading. The account in today's Gospel, John 20:19-23, also recounts how Jesus gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. Yet the event in John's Gospel takes place on Easter Sunday. There is no need to try to reconcile these two accounts. It is to know that after his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an Advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world.

In the context of the feast of Pentecost, John 20:19-23 reminds us about the integral connection between **the gifts of peace and forgiveness and the action of the Holy Spirit**. Jesus greets his

disciples with the gift of peace. Jesus then commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." He breathes the Holy Spirit upon the disciples and sends them to continue his work of reconciliation through the forgiveness of sins. Jesus' act of breathing the Holy Spirit upon the apostles mirrors God's act of breathing life into Adam. In fact, both the Greek and Hebrew words for "spirit" can also be translated as "breath."

This Gospel reminds us that **the Church is called to be a reconciling presence in the world.** The reconciling presence of Christ is celebrated in the Church's sacramental life. In the Sacrament of Baptism, we are cleansed of sin and become a new creation in Christ. In the Sacrament of Penance, the Church celebrates the mercy of God through the forgiveness of sins. This reconciling presence is also to be a way of life for Christians. In situations of conflict, we are to be agents of peace and harmony among people. (Loyola Press)



Extract from a reflection on Pentecost by Mark Francis, CSV | June 4, 2017

It seems to me that what we have read today is crucial for understanding Pope Francis' focus on joy as the Spirit's gift to believers and a necessary requirement for being credible evangelizers. He has pointed out that we sometimes place too much emphasis on Church structures and ways of proceeding that often make as tentative and self-conscious, isolating us from discerning the real needs of our suffering world. He has also pointed out that our narrow perspectives often blind us to the amazing ways in which God has moved in all human cultures. The Spirit empowers us to leave the security of the upper room -- our comfortable ways of doing things -- and equips us to reach out with joy to humanity in all it's diversity and complexity. Pope Francis, quoting the Aparecida document of the Latin American Bishops' Conference, prays that "...the world of our time, which is searching, sometimes with anguish, sometimes with hope, be enabled to receive the good news not from evangelizers who are dejected, impatient, or anxious, but from ministers of the Gospel whose lives glow with fervor, who have received the joy of Christ."

Like Jesus's first disciples we cannot leave the upper room without help. We need the Spirit in order to shed our fear and go out to the streets and witness to what God raising Christ from the dead really means for our world: justice, mercy, compassion toward the poor, community with one another, self-sacrifice and forgiveness. This is why Pentecost has been called the "birthday" of the Church. And the most important lesson at this birthday celebration is to remind ourselves that this amazing power to communicate the Good News and to move hearts and minds is not due to our efforts or our cleverness. It comes from God's Spirit that enables us to witness to the One who suffered, died and rose again for us to transform our fears -- and our world.



SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMENT: (Paul Cramsie)

Bishop Long, chairman of the Australian Catholic Social Justice Council, has issued a pastoral letter marking the feast of St Joseph the Worker. In it he says: "On this Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker, let us consider the importance of the just wage. This is particularly important in today's Australia, where wage growth has been very slow and low-paid workers often experience real hardship.

The Church has stressed the fundamental importance of fair remuneration for work. A just wage will meet the immediate needs of workers and their families and also allow them to save for the future. It ensures the prosperity of a society is shared adequately and that the social, economic and cultural life of the community is allowed to flourish. Workers cannot be valued only by their cost or treated simply as a factor of production. ... The common good will never be served unless we ensure the greatest support to those most in need. Ultimately, the just wage is the means of verifying the justice of the whole socioeconomic system."
