## World Mission Sunday

Today, we celebrate WORLD MISSION SUNDAY. "Go and invite everyone to the banquet" (Mt 22,9) is the theme that Pope Francis has chosen for this year's Mission Day. It is a verse from the parable of the wedding banquet (Mt 22,1-14). As we reflect on this parable, we can discern several aspects of mission. We need to remember that the servants had previously been sent to deliver

king's invitation to the guests (vv. 3-4). However, His invitation was refused by them. Although, His invitation was rejected by the guests, the king tells his servants "Go into the main streets and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet" (22,9).

God, who is great in love and rich in mercy, constantly sets out to encounter all men and women, and to call them to the joy of His Kingdom, even in the face of their indifference or refusal. Both before and after his resurrection, Jesus told his disciples, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations..." (Mt 28,19), thus involving them in his own mission. The Church has received this command from the Lord and has been continuing it without losing heart or weary in the face of difficulties and obstacles.

We are all missionary disciples of Jesus. The primary mission of the Church is sharing the joy of the Gospel and inviting people to Jesus. Mission is, therefore, a tireless going out to all people and inviting them to encounter God and enter the joy of his kingdom. As baptised, be ready to set out anew, each according to our state in life, to inaugurate a new missionary movement, as the dawn of Christianity in the Acts of the Apostles. All those who have experienced Jesus as Savior and Lord set out to share their Christ experience to others, Blessed Virgin Mary, Mary Magdalene, Shepherds, Peter, Paul, Thomas to name a few. Pope Francis says, 'imprisoning' church which does not let the Lord out, which keeps him as 'its own'.

Dear friends, it is our time to set out to the people and share the joy of the Gospel. There may be rejection, indifference, opposition, humiliation etc... However, these are part of the mission. As we celebrate today as Mission Sunday, let's pray and thank all the missionaries, in response to God's call, have left everything behind to go far from their homeland and preach the Gospel of Jesus.

'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

When the other ten heard this they began to feel

indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them: 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt.
