### House-tops and Sparrows © Fr Michael Tate

When I was a schoolboy, we would write at the top of our exercise books AMDG (Latin for 'All for the Greater Glory of God').

### The signage went on the top of our exam papers also.

But before the public exams the Brothers used to sternly warn us not to make the mistake of heading our exam papers in that way for fear that a Protestant examiner would realise we were Catholics and mark us down. This was hardly proclaiming our faith from the housetops as called for in today's Gospel! But in those days there was still fear of sectarian hostility. Certainly, there was discrimination in employment and access to finance, etc. So, at times we whispered among ourselves, and certainly no AMDG from the house-top of the exams held at the City Hall.

Of course, compared with what Jesus was foreseeing for his disciples in the first century, ours was the mildest of persecutions, if it could be called that. But, that mild experience leads to unrestrained admiration for those who suffer real persecution because they remain faithful to the Gospel.

How does 'Do not be afraid' really sound to them? If you or I were part of a Sudanese village of African Christians with an Arab Muslim militia swooping down on a mission of destruction, would we take solace from the fact that God knows about the fate of a couple of sparrows?

### Our Gospel read:

**'... not one [sparrow] falls to the ground without your Father knowing.'** But that is a bad translation. The Greek simply says 'not one [sparrow] will fall to the ground without your Father.' Full stop! Our Heavenly Father accompanies a dying sparrow as it dies! That is the measure of the Creator's love for all creatures. God wants to, does, enter into the moment of death, *our* moment of death.

Now, that *would* be consoling if I were facing being torn apart by lions. I *could* take courage from that.

One of the first Christian groups to hear this Gospel was that set around the Tigris River running through Baghdad in modern day Iraq. For almost 2000 years these Chaldean Christians have maintained their allegiance to the Gospel and to the successor of St Peter (though they are not *Roman* Catholics). Now they face terrible persecution from fanatical Muslims who, of course have dominated the country since their emergence centuries after the Gospel was first preached along the Tigris.

One hundred and fifty thousand have fled as refugees to neighbouring countries. Many others have fled to the north to Kurdistan. The Archbishop of Mosul was killed. Kidnapping, torture and killings are common. We can barely imagine hearing today's Gospel amongst the remnant, the

pathetic few, left in Baghdad today, those few who refuse to deny Christ, those few who remain true to the Gospel.



For myself who made sure I didn't write AMDG at the top of my exam paper, I know I have no right to expect others to show heroism and courage to the ultimate degree, even facing death. But, I can pray for them.

This is the gut wrenching stuff which, as last week's Gospel taught us, is the surest foundation for authentic prayer and action. Let us show real solidarity with those for whom today's Gospel is a challenge beyond our imagining.

May God preserve them from all danger.

### A letter to the People of God in the Diocese of Broken Bay ~ [Bishop Anthony 9 June 2020] My dear brothers and sisters in Christ.


Since my appointment as Bishop of Broken Bay, I have tried to engender a spirit of generosity and enthusiasm for the mission of the Church. I do so, because the community of the Church is an evangeliser, and to evangelise we must be generous and enthusiastic for the Lord. We begin by being evangelised ourselves. As Pope Saint Paul VI taught, the Church "is the community of believers, the community of hope lived and communicated, the community of brotherly love, and she needs to listen unceasingly to what she must believe, to her reasons for hoping, to the new commandment of love" (cf Evangelii Nuntiandi 15). To engage faithfully in our mission, we must be led, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to conversion, renewal and reform, so that the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church will be recognised, known, and loved as the living Body of Christ. Throughout our Diocese of Broken Bay, hundreds of women and men generously and enthusiastically carry out their mission on a weekly basis as catechists. Their participation in this mission is not to be underestimated. These women and men of faith are called and commissioned to be spiritual guides, teachers of the faith, and leaders in the community. They work with the priests and deacons of the Church. Under my episcopal oversight and care, they are engaged in the mission of evangelisation and catechesis - which is first and foremost a work of faith. This week I would like to acknowledge the marvellous work that our catechists do by proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ. Their students in the faith see Christ in them. In many instances, our catechists are the first proclamation of the Good News in their lives of their students. Their support of parents and carers strengthens the family and the community. Others believe and hold to the teachings of Christ because of what our catechists teach by word and deed. As the public school system reopens to our catechists, I would ask that you keep them in your prayers, especially in this COVID environment. The work of evangelisation and catechesis is one that belongs to every member of the community of the Church. It can be a daunting thought for some, who might not think that they are "qualified" to teach the faith. Our catechists know how to overcome many obstacles to evangelisation. The starting point is not a book; rather it is a living relationship with Jesus Christ. He is the Good News. Accepting him into our lives as Lord and Saviour is the first work of being evangelised. But you, Lord of Hosts, you who probe with justice, who scrutinise the loins and heart, let me see the vengeance you will take on them, for I have committed my cause to you. ### Second Reading: Rom 5:12-15 ~ A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law. Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

### **Gospel Acclamation:**

Alleluia, alleluia! The Spirit of Truth will bear witness to me, says the Lord, and you also will be my witnesses. Alleluia! **Gospel:** Mt 10:26-33 ~ A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the house-tops. 'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows. 'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'
