People often imagine a huge distance between Earth and a Heaven beyond the horizon of the universe. But Jesus Christ taught us to pray

'Thy will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven.'

How can this come about? Jesus identified two areas on which we need to focus to help make Heaven and Earth share the same space.

'The quality of Mercy is not strained. It falleth as the gentle rain of Heaven on to the place beneath.'


