

5th Sunday of Easter ~ Year B I will praise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people.

Acts 9:26-31; 1 Jn 3:18-24; Jn 15:1-8





Jesus teaches that he is the vine and that his disciples are the branches.

Today's Gospel reading is taken from the middle of the Last Supper discourse. Jesus

speaks about his relationship to his disciples. In his metaphor of the vine and the branches, Jesus is referencing the Hebrew Scriptures. In the Hebrew Scriptures, Israel is the vineyard, and Yahweh himself tends the vineyard. One of the primary themes of John's Gospel is to show Jesus to be the fulfillment of God's promises to Israel.

In this passage, Jesus teaches his disciples that his relationship with them will not end after his death; he will remain with them always. This **unity between Jesus and his disciples** is the basis for their ability to continue to do the work that he began. Similarly, Jesus' presence with us through the **Gift of the Holy Spirit** enables us to continue the work of love and reconciliation that he began.

Jesus also teaches his disciples about the importance of the words he has taught to them. Just as Jesus will remain in the disciples, so too will his words. We come to know Jesus through the Scriptures, the living Word of God. Our commitment to be Christ's disciples is sustained through God's Word. This commitment is also strengthened by our life of prayer and nourished by the Eucharist. Through the Eucharist, Jesus dwells in us, remains with us, and transforms us so that we might bear fruit in his name. We observe many people who act in ways that show their commitment to serve their neighbor. Christians and non-Christians feed the hungry, care for the sick, shelter the homeless, and give alms to the poor. These actions become acts of Christian discipleship when they are motivated by our relationship with Jesus. Whatever the immediate results, Jesus promises us that these actions will bear fruit when we undertake them in his name. (Loyola Press).

are brought together beautifully in that well-known passage from Lumen Gentium, No. 6, the Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church:

holy roots were the Prophets and in which the reconciliation of Jews and Gentiles has been brought about and will be brought about. That land, like a choice vineyard, has been planted by the heavenly Husbandman. The true vine is Christ who gives life and the power to bear abundant fruit to the branches, that is, to us, who through the Church remain in Christ without whom we can do nothing."

This week, *let us pray* that our belonging to Christ be profound and real, going beyond all of the turbulence that exists on life's surface. May Christ's very life flow through us, building up the Body of Christ that is the Church.

On May 13 (Fatima Day) please join us for Oz Rosary #53 to pray for Australia

Over one million Catholics recently gathered around the borders of **Poland** to pray the rosary for protection of their country. **Italy** and **France** followed suite then Ireland with over 280 locations praying around their coastline.

The UK Rosary is to be held on the 29th April. With more than 220 locations and still growing, many Priests and Bishops are supporting the event by leading the people in prayer to local beaches, cliffs, boat

piers and coastal areas. Pope Francis has already given an apostolic Blessing to this initiative, which is being called 'The Coast to Coast Rosary'.

Australians, under the patronage of Bishop David Cremin who has Irish links, are holding theirs around the country on **Sunday 13th May**, (Fatima Day). Already we are getting close to 100 locations: Legion of Mary, Fatima, youth, prayer and rosary groups are coming on board right across the nation to pray the rosary for the protection of Australia and for families and youth in response to the blessed Mother's request

Major centres like Sydney, Adelaide, Melbourne, Brisbane, Tasmania and Perth, all have multiple venues. St Mary's Cathedral in Perth is having a Living Rosary with numerous young people participating. Darwin Catholics are meeting at Lee Point on the beach as are Coogee people. One parish priest in Canberra is leading a gathering of people up to Black Mountain to pray for the city, while Esperance parishioners in WA are heading to the local lookout over the ocean with their local parish priest to pray. Another town in Western Australia, Manjimup, will see their congregation gather at the local church to pray the rosary and have a 'cuppa' afterwards.

Eight Jesuits during World War II living only 10 blocks from the epicentre of the atomic blast in Hiroshima prayed the Fatima Rosary everyday for protection. All survived without any side effects of radiation and the building remained intact.

After World War II Russia invaded Austria—the Catholics were called to pray the rosary every day to end the communist occupation. After some years, the Russians pulled out of the country with no explanation. There are many other instances of Mary's powerful intercession through the rosary bringing protection to countries and people.

Mary said to the children at Medjugorie that the rosary would work miracles in their lives.

So if you would like to join in praying for the Protection Of Australia, you can either initiate your own rosary, join with other KCCP parishioner at the times and venues below or join in a group already happening.

and next weekend our parish finance committee members will speak regarding this appeal.

In short though, the CWF provides for 5 important works throughout the Diocese being: 5 Pastoral Care Practitioners across 7 hospitals, CatholicCare, The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD), St Edmund's and St Lucy's Schools & the Ephpheta Centre.

The full 2017/18 quota payable by KCCP to the DBB is \$34,803, And the amount we are hoping to realise at this final stage of the current appeal is \$11,601.

Each Parish in our Diocese is set a levy which has to be met, but *if unmet by donations to the appeal*, the 'shortfall' is taken from parish funds (which would otherwise be used for essential maintenance work).

Envelopes will be available next weekend ~ please place on either plate at Mass.

Above all, please remember your ongoing support to the CWF (great or small), is greatly appreciated and I sincerely thank you for giving whatever you can. Fr Shaju.
