## October is the Month of The Holy Rosary

#### My dear Parishioners,

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Holy Rosary and this is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7.



Devotion to the Rosary is one of the most distinguishable features of popular Catholic Spirituality.

The Rosary inspires us to meditate on the mysteries of the lives of Jesus and Mary.

In the 16th century, Pope Pius V established the standard fifteen mysteries of the Rosaries which are grouped into three, the **Joyful Mysteries**, the **Sorrowful Mysteries** and the **Glorious Mysterious**.

In 2002, Pope John Paul II added a set of five to the existing fifteen mysteries and these became known as the **Luminous Mysteries**. Today, the total number of mysteries is twenty.

"The holy Rosary is a powerful weapon. Use it with confidence and you will be amazed at the results" says St. Josemaria Escriva. Countless miracles have been obtained and victories won through this prayer of immense power. Many hearts have been touched and many discouraged people have been uplifted because of the Rosary. But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.

'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'
