Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. In our reading for today, we read the account of the Last Supper found in the Gospel of Mark. It begins with the instructions that Jesus gave to his disciples to prepare their Passover celebration. It then goes on to give an account of the Last Supper

The Gospel of Mark describes Jesus

Last Supper with his disciples as a celebration of the Jewish feast of Passover.

...In the description of the Passover meal found in today's Gospel, however, Mark omits many elements of the Jewish Passover meal. Instead he describes only those elements he believes to be most essential to the Christian Eucharist: Jesus

took bread, blessed the bread, broke the bread, and shared it with his disciples. Similar words and actions follow as Jesus shares the chalice with his disciples. This bread now shared is Jesus' own body. Those who drink from the chalice are invited to share in a new covenant which will be sealed by Jesus' own blood. Mark's Eucharistic theology looks forward to the Kingdom of God that Jesus inaugurates.

The Gospel for today reminds us that the Eucharist is a memorial of Christ's sacrifice on the cross. We believe that

Jesus is truly present to us in the elements of bread and wine. Each time we celebrate this sacrament, we prepare for the Kingdom of God. This celebration, as the Second Vatican Council taught us, is the source and summit of the Christian life. (Loyola Press)

### Gospel Reflection for the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ One Bread, One Body

In the gospels there are plenty of times when Jesus is with people eating and drinking and today's gospel is no exception. As always, Jesus is concerned with people and their real needs. They are hungry, so he feeds them. He is gracious in his abundant giving. But he feeds them not only with food; he also feeds them at a much deeper level. He teaches them, he welcomes them and he heals them. He treats us the same way; when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, Jesus welcomes us, he speaks to us and through his Body and Blood, we are nourished and we are healed.

The Eucharist is God's greatest gifts to us. But it is not our right and we cannot demand it. Pope Francis reminds us of this when he says, 'the Eucharist is not a prize for the perfect, but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak.' That's all of us and each of us!

Today, we are not only celebrating receiving the Body and Blood of Christ, we are called to remember that we are the Body of Christ, the Church. As St. Paul reminds us, 'Now Christ's body is yourselves, and each of you with a part to play in the whole. '(1 Cor. 12.27). Today reminds and challenges us to realise that we are the living Church, the Body of Christ, whose head is Jesus himself. Through our communion with Jesus and each other we are called to be living stones making a spiritual house. St. Augustine, the great church writer said, 'become what you receive.' If we celebrate the Eucharist with each other and receive the Body and Blood of Christ, then we are called to be the Body of Christ, the Church today. And we are asked to be a missionary church. At the end, every celebration of the Eucharist we are sent out with this great prayer of mission, let us go now to love and serve the Lord. If we share in the gift of Jesus' Body and Blood, then we are also asked to share this with others when we leave the church. Today on this wonderful feast, may each of us be fed, nourished and healed through the Body and Blood of Christ. Michael Moore OMI

### SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMENT

### From the Edmund Rice Centre:

There are 1,500 Afghan men, women and children in the community waiting for a decision as to whether they will be granted refugee protection. But the Aust. Government is saying it's safe to send them back. Our team of researchers have just returned from Afghanistan where they met and interviewed people who had been returned by the Aust. Government. Director of the Edmund Rice Centre and President of the Refugee Council of Australia, Phil Glendenning, led the research team and he spoke with Frank Kelly on ABC Radio last week:

"People said to us things like 'when I take my children to school I don't know whether they'll be alive at the end of the day.' Put yourself in the shoes of that person. Most of us are in the lucky situation of not having a clue of what war feels like, smells like, tastes like, but that's what it does to people. And for the Government to say 'it's safe to go back' is ludicrous. It's wrong. (Paul Cramsie)
