For the one who sanctifies, and the ones who are sanctified, are of the same stock; that is why he openly calls them brothers.

Gospel Mark 10:2-16

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples guestioned him again about this, and he said to them, 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too.'

People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, 'Let



the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who

does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.

An important communique from Bishop Anthony Randazzo via Fr David Ranson VG

Dear Fathers, Deacons, and Friends,

As we appreciate the situation in the Middle East is dire, resulting in the displacement and suffering of so many, now in Lebanon. It is also one year since the atrocities in Israel and the subsequent pain for the entire people of Gaza.

From Rome, Bishop Anthony has asked that we gather as a Diocese and pray for peace.




Purse Samaritans Operation **Christmas Child shoeboxes** have arrived and are available at the back of both St Patrick's and St Bernard's Churches.
