

Gospel Reflection

The true demands of the Gospel are hard to "endure": the justice and reconciliation required of the faithful disciple runs counter to the conventions of society; the attitude of humble servanthood Jesus asks of us puts us at odds with the "me first/win at all costs" philosophy of our culture. But, as Peter acknowledges, the words of Jesus are the only way to transform and restore our lives and our world in the life of God.

We often struggle to "endure this kind of talk" not because we don't understand Jesus but because we understand Jesus all too well. God's compassion, mercy and forgiveness are hard lessons to live in the challenging and complex lives we live but, in our struggles to act faithfully and with hope, we begin to understand that we are part of a world much greater than ourselves, that we are connected to everyone through the dignity we all share as daughters and sons of God.

Hopelessness can easily become a way of life; the sense that God has abandoned us or that God just doesn't exist in our lives can cripple us emotionally and spiritually. But the faithful disciple understands the reality that God is the only constant source of anything and everything that is good.

Peter's simple, plaintive answer is a confession of faith in the God of life and resurrection who is not present in the darkness of evil but in the light of goodness that seeks to shatter that darkness.

The faith that Christ comes to reveal is not a "warm fluffy blanket" under which we hide from whatever we find unsettling or painful nor a protective coating designed to ward off every form of sin and evil; faith is a light that illuminates our journey through life's challenges and obstacles, a lens through which we are able to see God's grace at work even in the most confusing and difficult times.

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS.

"All rise, Holy Mass is in session."

Back when I used to study law and work in law firms, one of the many things that fascinated me – indeed it still does today – was *courtroom etiquette*.

Few places nowadays, at least in Australia, still observe such strict rules of behaviour; keeping silence, using

honorary titles, speaking in turn, appropriate dress, rules of language, the list goes on. Of course, perhaps the most recognisable rule is *standing up* when the judge enters the courtroom. Everyone knows that one. It's a sign of respect and helps keep the order.



But it's not exactly unfamiliar to us Catholics – we stand up *every week* before the start of Mass. Still, you might wonder, why *do* we stand up? Simply out of respect? Tradition perhaps? To help us sing?

Surely there's more to it. Let's find out...

Let's start with the obvious one – Catholics stand up at the start of Mass to *welcome Christ*. In the Old Testament, when Moses entered the Tent of Meeting, the People of Israel "would rise up and worship" (Exodus 33:10). So too for us, each Sunday Mass, when the priest enters the nave at the back, we Catholics too rise together and welcome him, worshipping in song. Indeed, Christ is sacramentally *represented* and also *present* in the priest; a fact we are reminded of each time he ascends the sanctuary steps to the altar of sacrifice, just as Jesus ascended Mount Calvary. Because of Christ's sacramental presence in the priest, when we stand for the *priest*, we stand for *Christ*.

The second reason we stand – is so we can *get walking*. In the first few centuries after Christianity was legalised in Rome, the Pope would gather with his flock in the city, and make a 'penitential procession' to the church for Sunday Mass. Such pilgrimages prepared Christians for worship, but also reminded them of the truth; we do not belong to *this* world, but are pilgrims on this earthly journey towards Heaven. Over the centuries, outdoor processions to the church were shortened, and later practiced inside the church; but to this day, they retain their rich symbolism and meaning.

So then, how might we join in? What shall we do?

+ + +

Well, dear friends, this week, at the entrance hymn, let us **stand for Christ**. Let us stand for Christ when he arrives in our church. When Fr Chima or Fr Marek first enters the nave at the back, let us stand and welcome him! Trust not these feeble earthly eyes of ours that see but a man; no no, this week, put on your spiritual glasses and see! See Christ who walks our aisle, and welcome him joyfully – with song.

And then, having welcomed Christ, **join the procession**! Join in the procession to the altar. Not in body of course, for that would be chaos, and I would get fired. No, this week, join the procession in *heart* and in *spirit* and in *worship*. As you see Christ walk past you in the aisle, imagine yourself on the pilgrimage with Our Lord to the sanctuary of heaven; follow behind Him, all the way. This week, at the entrance hymn, stand for Christ and join the procession.

For we are but pilgrims on this earth; our true home is Heaven. God bless you. Seminarian Matthew

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time- Year B

First Reading

Joshua 24:1-2,15-18 (JB)

A reading from the book of Joshua

We will serve the Lord God, because he is our God.

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel together at Shechem; then he called the elders, leaders, judges and scribes of Israel, and they presented themselves before God. Then Joshua said to all the people: 'If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve, whether the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are now living. As for me and my House, we will serve the Lord.'

The people answered, 'We have no intention of deserting the Lord our God who brought us and our ancestors out of the land of Egypt, the house of slavery, who worked those great wonders before our eyes and preserved us all along the way we travelled and among all the peoples through whom we journeyed. We too will serve the Lord, for he is our God.'

The word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God.**

Second Reading Ephesians 5:21-32 (JB)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

This is the great mystery, it applies to Christ and the Church.

Give way to one another in obedience to Christ. Wives should regard their husbands as they regard the Lord, since as Christ is head of the Church and saves the whole body, so is a husband the head of his wife; and as the Church submits to Christ, so should wives submit to their husbands, in everything. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but he feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body - and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Lord, whom shall we go to? You have the words of everlasting life.

After hearing his doctrine many of the followers of Jesus said, 'This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?' Jesus was aware that his followers were complaining about it and said, 'Does this upset you? What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before?

'It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life.


'But there are some of you who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the outset those who did not believe, and who it was that would betray him. He went on, 'This is why I told you that no one could come to me unless the Father allows him.' After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him.

Then Jesus said to the Twelve, 'What about you, do you want to go away too?' Simon Peter answered,

'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.'
