

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time - 22nd September 2024



Gospel Reflection

Different hopes and expectations of the long awaited "age of the Messiah" collide in today's Gospel.

A somber Jesus speaks cryptically of what awaits him in Jerusalem, while those closest to him argue about their own

greatness and status in the Messiah's reign (that must have been quite a conversation to elicit the strong reaction it did from Jesus!). The disciples, long resigned to their people's humiliation and subjugation, dream of a kingdom of power and influence in which ambition is exalted; Jesus explains to them (yet again) that the Messiah's reign will be a kingdom of spirit and conversion in which humble service to others is exalted.

Jesus articulates the great paradox of discipleship: Do you wish to be first? Then become last. Do you seek to attain greatness? Then become small. Do you want to be masters? Then become the servants of those you wish to rule.

To emphasize the point, Jesus picks up a little child and places the child in the midst of these would-be rulers and influence peddlers. A child has no influence in the affairs of society nor offers anything to adults in terms of career advancement or prestige enhancement; just the opposite is true: a child needs everything. To be "great" in the reign of God, Jesus says, one must become the "servant" of the "child," the poor, the needy, the lost.



THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

From Altar to Aisles: The Ripple of Peace

Years ago, I remember watching a famous political commentator, who had just become Catholic, talking about how much he loves the Mass. Despite his firm character, he said one particular moment almost makes him cry...



...The Sign of Peace.

He marveled at it – the idea that you're sitting in a church full of complete strangers, turn to someone you don't know, and say to them: "Peace be with you."

In *his* world, filled with political factions and mudslinging, there was at least *one moment* in his life where he was reminded – "everyone is basically like you... and we're all trying to get along."

I'd never thought about it like that.

Still, for any of us who are human, we know that it's one thing to wish someone "Peace be with you", and another to actually live out that peace – especially when we can't find such peace within ourselves.

So this week, dear friends, let us consider the question: what is the Sign of Peace, and why should we offer it to each other?

The first reason is because Our Lord asks us. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus says: "If you are offering your gift at the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift." The Sign of Peace is a reminder of this teaching. Don't get me wrong, its not easy, but we must share peace with each other, if we are ever to fully radiate Christ unto the world.

The second reason we offer peace (even when we can't find it in ourselves) is because it is **not** *our* peace we offer; rather, it is *Christ's* peace. The Sign of Peace has taken many forms over the centuries – a kiss, an embrace, a bow, or even an icon of Christ to be kissed. Still, a key feature for the longest time was that the bishop or priest (representing Christ) would first kiss the altar or Host, then offer the kiss of peace to his deacons, then the deacons to the faithful, and the faithful out to each other, rippling out from the sanctuary unto the aisles until the whole community had received Christ's peace. The symbolism was profound: all *true* peace comes from Christ, cascading though the ministers of the Church out and among God's people. Just beautiful.

So then, what shall we do this Mass?

† † †

Well, firstly, let us receive the peace of Christ: When the priest extends his hands outwards and says: "The peace of the Lord be with you always", let us expose our hearts. Yes, expose our hearts – because the peace of Christ is being transmitted to you in that moment – like a ray of light, shooting from the priest's hands and heart, directly into yours. Let us receive the peace of Christ.

And secondly, then offer Christ's peace to others: Then, when the priest says, "Let us offer each other the sign of peace", let us turn and transmit that peace to others. A simple bow or handshake is good – and to those nearest us – for this is not a mere *greeting*, but rather a *blessing* that we share with each other.

A reading from the letter of St James

Wherever you find jealousy and ambition, you find disharmony, and wicked things of every kind being done; whereas the wisdom that comes down from above is essentially something pure; it also makes for peace, and is kindly and considerate; it is full of compassion and shows itself by doing good; nor is there any trace of partiality or hypocrisy in it. Peacemakers, when they work for peace, sow the seeds which will bear fruit in holiness.

Where do these wars and battles between yourselves first start? Isn't it precisely in the desires fighting inside your own selves? You want something and you haven't got it; so you are prepared to kill. You have an ambition that you cannot satisfy; so you fight to get your way by force. Why you don't have what you want is because you don't pray for it; when you do pray and don't get it, it is because you have not prayed properly, you have prayed for something to indulge your own desires.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark


The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of humanity ... All who wish to be first must make themselves the servants of all.

After leaving the mountain Jesus and his disciples made their way through Galilee; and he did not want anyone to know, because he was instructing his disciples; he was telling them, 'The Son of Man will be delivered into the hands of men; they will put him to death; and three days after he has been put to death he will rise again.' But they did not understand what he said and were afraid to ask him.

They came to Capernaum, and when he was in the house he asked them, 'What were you arguing about on the road?' They said nothing because they had been arguing which of them was the greatest. So he sat down, called the Twelve to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be first, he must make himself last of all and servant of all.' He then took a little child, set him in front of them, put his arms round him, and said to them, 'Anyone who welcomes one of these little children in my name, welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me.'
