

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 29th September 2024



Gospel Reflection

As we have seen throughout Mark's Gospel, the people of Jesus' time held great stock in the

existence of demons: whatever mental illness or physical infirmity they could not understand was caused by some "demon." It was also the belief that a demon could be exorcised if one could invoke the name of a still more powerful spirit to order the evil and unclean spirit out of a person.

John, a member of Jesus' inner circle, tried to stop someone who was cashing in on Jesus' growing reputation as a healer by invoking Jesus' name to cast out a demon. John's concern, at first reading, appears to have some merit – but recall the on-going battle among the disciples as to who is the greatest among them. Jesus responds, therefore, by condemning his followers' jealousy and intolerance, warning against an elitist view of discipleship that diminishes the good done by those we consider "outsiders."

Today's Gospel selection includes Jesus' exhortation that it is better lose one's limb if it leads one to sin. Two notes about these final verses:

The "millstone" Jesus speaks of is the large piece of stone that is turned by a pack animal to grind grain. Drowning a criminal by tying him to one of these large heavy stones was a method of execution in Rome and Palestine.

Gehenna was a vile place in Jewish history. The young King Ahaz (2 Chronicles 38: 3) practiced child immolation to the "fire god" at Gehenna. In Jesus' time, Gehenna, a ravine outside Jerusalem, served as the city's refuse site. Gehenna became synonymous with our concept of hell for the Jews.

Children's Liturgy will commence on Sunday 13th October during the 10:30am Mass. It will continue to be held on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 10:30am Mass. This will cater for children aged 3 to 8 years old. Each week a theme that correlates to the readings and Gospel is presented to the children using age-appropriate materials. The adult catechists incorporate prayer, song, group discussion, worksheets and other activities so the children can relate the Word of God to daily life. The children leave the church after a blessing from the priest, gather in the parish meeting room, and return during the offertory.



In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus Christ instructs his Apostles to care for those who are hungry, thirsty, sick, in prison and poor.

In those who are oppressed or struggling, Jesus identifies himself. "Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me," he says. (Matthew 25:45 NRSVCE).

Saint Vincent de Paul took this instruction to heart throughout his life, so much so, he is the patron of all works of charity.

As a young priest, he was kidnapped and auctioned off as a slave, spending two years in bondage. This, along with other experiences with the poor, led to a change of heart in Saint Vincent, who had originally envisioned a life of leisure as a priest.

Instead, he dedicated his priestly ministry to serving the neglected and the poor, those in small villages and other areas which were largely abandoned by the rest of society.

He helped to found the Congregation of the Mission, known as the Vincentians, to bring the Good News to the poor and minister to them. He also founded the Company of the Daughters of Charity, a group of women who served the poorest of the poor.

So strong was his influence and example, that the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul was named after him two centuries after his death. Known in Australia as "Vinnies", this society continues the great work of Saint Vincent in more than 150 countries across the globe, serving the poor and witnessing to the intrinsic dignity of every single person.

Saint Vincent's desire to serve the poor was first and foremost driven by an encounter with Jesus Christ.





Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time- Year B

First Reading Numbers 11:25-29 (JB)

A reading from the book of Numbers

Are you jealous on my account? Who decrees that all people may prophesy?

The Lord came down in the Cloud. He spoke with Moses, but took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. When the spirit came on them they prophesied, but not again.

Two men had stayed back in the camp; one was called Eldad and the other Medad. The spirit came down on them; though they had not gone to the Tent, their names were enrolled among the rest. These began to prophesy in the camp. The young man ran to tell this to Moses, 'Look,' he said 'Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.' Then said Joshua the son of Nun, who had served Moses from his youth, 'My Lord Moses, stop them!' Moses answered him, 'Are you jealous on my account? If only the whole people of the Lord were prophets, and the Lord gave his Spirit to them all!'

A reading from the letter of St James

Your wealth is rotting.

An answer for the rich. Start crying, weep for the miseries that are coming to you. Your wealth is all rotting, your clothes are all eaten up by moths. All your gold and your silver are corroding away, and the same corrosion will be your own sentence, and eat into your body. It was a burning fire that you stored up as your treasure for the last days. Labourers mowed your fields, and you cheated them - listen to the wages that you kept back, calling out; realise that the cries of the reapers have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. On earth you have had a life of comfort and luxury; in the time of slaughter you went on eating to your heart's content. It was you who condemned the innocent and killed them; they offered you no resistance.

Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark Anyone who is not against us is for us. If your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off.

John said to Jesus, 'Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him.' But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward. 'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'


