Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time – 6th October 2024



Gospel Reflection

The question of divorce was among the most divisive issues in Jewish society. The Book of Deuteronomy (24: 1) stipulated that a husband could divorce his wife for "some indecency." Interpretations of exactly what

constituted "indecency" varied greatly, ranging from adultery to accidentally burning the evening meal. Further, the wife was regarded under the Law as the husband's chattel, with neither legal right to protection nor recourse to seeking a divorce on her own. In Biblical times, there was little appreciation of love and commitment in marriage – marriages were always arranged in the husband's favor, the husband could divorce his wife for just about any reason, the woman was treated little better than property. Divorce, then, was tragically common among the Jews of Jesus' time.

In today's Gospel, Jesus cites the Genesis account of the creation of man and woman (today's first reading) to emphasize that husband and wife are equal partners in the covenant of marriage ("the two become one body"). The language of Genesis indicates that the Creator intends for the marriage union to possess the same special covenantal nature as God's covenant with Israel. Jesus again appeals to the spirit of the Law rather than arguing legalities: It is the nature of their marriage covenant that husband and wife owe to one another total and complete love and mutual respect in sharing responsibility for making their marriage succeed.

Today's Gospel reading also includes Mark's story of Jesus' welcoming the little children. Again, Jesus holds up the model of a child's simplicity and humility as the model for the servant-disciple.



Why we dedicate the Month of October to The Holy Rosary



It all started in 1571, when the Catholic League entered into battle against the Ottoman Empire to protect Italy from invasion. The Turks were on a warpath to overthrow all of Europe, killing millions of people and forcing Islamic conversion on survivors. They had conquered the Middle East and Mediterranean islands of Cyrus and Crete. Italy was next.

As the impending battle loomed, Pope Pius V called on various religious communities throughout Europe to join him in praying the rosary, including public recitations, to defeat the Islamic threat. Heading into battle, every man in the Catholic League's forces carried a rosary. Their fleet was no match for the competition, vastly outnumbered.

Miraculously, the Catholic League returned victorious after a daylong battle known as the Battle of Lepanto that took place off the coast of Greece. In thanksgiving for Mary's intercession and protection, Pope Pius V declared the day - October 7- as a feast day for Our Lady of the Rosary. To celebrate, a rosary procession was held in Saint Peter's Square.

The presence and protection of our Mother Mary has immense power - requested, channelled, and honoured through the rosary. Her immaculate intercession has won wars and conquered hearts. After the feast day was established, the entire month of October was dedicated to the rosary in 1884 by Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical Superiore Anno:

"Last year, as each of you is aware, We

decreed by an Encyclical Letter that, to win the help of Heaven for the Church in her trials, the great Mother of God should be honoured by the means of the most holy Rosary during the whole of the month of October. In this We followed both Our own impulse and the example of Our predecessors, who in times of difficulty were wont to have recourse with increased fervor to the Blessed Virgin, and to seek her aid with special prayers."



Although the commitment to the rosary was formalised in 1571, it was an established prayer long before then. The rosary was first given to Saint Dominic by the Virgin Mary during an apparition in 1214 in Prouilhe of southern France. She presented it as a source of strength and grace to persevere in his efforts to convert Albigensian heretics, saying:

"Wonder not that you have obtained so little fruit by your labours, you have spent them on barren soil, not yet watered with the dew of Divine grace. When God willed to renew the face of the earth, He began by sending down on it the fertilising rain

of the Angelic Salutation. Therefore preach my Psalter composed of 150 Angelic Salutations and 15 Our Fathers, and you will obtain an abundant harvest."


Saint Dominic went on to found the Order of Preachers, or the Dominicans. The image of Our Lady of the Rosary reflects this apparition, with Mary holding the child Jesus in one hand and the other hand extending to give the rosary beads to Saint Dominic. Pope Benedict explained the meaning behind the image in a 2007 Angelus:

"This important iconography shows that the Rosary is a means given by the Virgin to contemplate Jesus and, in meditating on his life, to love him and follow him ever more faithfully. It is this message that Our Lady has also bequeathed to us in her various apparitions."

We know it to be one of the most recited and celebrated Catholic prayers - used to implore our Mother Mary for her intercession and blessings. St John Paul II expanded on the rosary's power in his 2002 apostolic letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae, when he announced the Year of the Rosary and the addition of the Luminous Mysteries:

"With the Rosary, the Christian people sits at the school of Mary and is led to contemplate the beauty on the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love. Through the Rosary the faithful receive abundant grace, as though from the very hands of the Mother of the Redeemer."

As we enter into October, let us renew our devotion to Our Lady of the Rosary - reflecting on its origins saving nations and individuals in times of conflict and despair.



Poland and Medjugorje Pilgrimage Testimonies



We visited the holy town of Medjugorje, and it is one of the world's most famous pilgrimage sites. There's lots of interesting and very beautiful places to spend time in prayer - like the outdoor 14 stations, the Queen of Peace statue or the statue of the Risen Christ. People all over the world come here for confession.

Each evening we attended the Holy Mass with the Prayer Program at the outdoor altar. The radio broadcasts simultaneous translation of the services from Croatian into many languages.

Everything is so normal and yet, so special: the exposition of the blessed sacrament on the enormous monstrance, the violinist and the musical group – all

touched my heart deeply. The kneeling of the pilgrims, the burning of the incense, reading of the holy scripture during adoration, benediction and blessing of the people with the monstrance, the pilgrims leaving quietly after benediction, St James Church – I do not know what it is that pulls me back to want to be there again but I was happy to have visited leading me to encounter the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist, in Adoration, in Confession, in scripture passages, in silent prayer and the Rosary – a time of grace for me as I can never thank God enough for his grace. I have returned home stronger in my faith and determined to put our Blessed Mother's messages and directions as five stones to save souls. They are – daily prayer, fasting, reading the Bible daily, confession regularly and to receive Holy Communion, and when possible, going to daily Mass. - *Irene*

During our pilgrimage to Medjugorje, I was hoping my rosary would turn gold (as I have heard someone's did) or my torn tendon would be healed or to witness other spectacular phenomena. Instead, I discovered my path to Our Lord was to be found in and through the confusion, the dryness, the humiliation, the struggle, the ordinary. Then I found peace.

By God's grace, I was moved to be reminded of God's inestimable love for each of us, and have now resolved to put into practice Our Lady's request to "pray, pray, pray!" and to "be converted".

Thank you Lord Jesus, thank you to Our Lady, thank you Fr Marek, thank you pilgrims! - *Pilgrim*





My highlights on the pilgrimage were serving at mass in front of the altar of the Shrine of our lady, the Black Madonna of Czestochowa, I feel honoured to be able to experience such an exclusive privilege. Međugorje was an enlightening experience to my faith, it's a very tranquil place and I could really feel the protective embrace of our mother's veil over the town. I come back with a stronger grounded spirituality and much more exciting experiences to look forward to on my continued pilgrimage with God. - Daven Jordan Fajilan

Mark 10:2-16 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

What God has joined together, no one must divide.

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body. They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them. 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another she is guilty of adultery too.'

People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' Then he put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing.
