
Your support enables the daily work of our parish, from pastoral care and liturgy to administration and outreach. Each of these efforts is essential in helping our parish grow and touch new hearts.




At our Remembrance Mass on All Souls Day, Saturday 2nd November at 10am we will remember and pray for all the faithfully departed of your families and our Parish community.

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

Holy Handwash: Scrubbing and Sacrifice

So I just got back from walking the Camino.

...And it was brutal.

Northern Spain. Hiking. 160km. Forests. Mountains. Oceans. Rivers. Countryside. And rain. Lots and lots of rain.



Still, I must admit, even amidst all the pelting rain and thunderstorms, there was something special about pushing through each day, hiking onwards, and overcoming the challenge. Despite getting completely washed, I loved it.

But let's not dwell here - I'll tell you more about it some other time. Because today, we're looking at a different kind of washing. The Washing of the Hands, in Mass.

Smooth transition, I know. But let's still ask the question: In Mass, why does the priest wash his hands?

+ + +

The first reason is because of need. In the early Church, it wasn't just bread and wine neatly brought up in the Offertory. No, rather many gifts – grain, vegetables, fruits, chickens, sheep, goats – all sorts of gifts were brought up, and the priest or deacon would separate that which could be used for the Mass, and that which was for the poor. So then, having touched half of Old MacDonald's farm, I reckon everyone was praying the priest wash his hands.

The second reason is so the priest might offer the sacrifice worthily. In the 4th century, St Cyril of Alexandria said: "We perform actions with our hands; to wash our hands is the nearest thing to purifying our deeds." Thus the priest washes his hands, yes, because his hands will hold the precious chalice and sacred host for consecration, but also, to remind himself that his soul must be cleansed before making the Holy Sacrifice. No wonder the priest whispers quietly while washing: "Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity; and cleanse me from my sin."

And lastly, the priest washes so he can offer the sacrifice... alongside you. Sadly, so very few Catholics know this, but it's not just the priest offering the Sacrifice in the Mass. No, the truth is, we lay faithful in the pews also offer up Jesus Christ to the Father, along with the offering of our own lives. This is why, immediately after the washing of hands, we hear the priest say to us: "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours might be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." Men, women and children – all they lay faithful, united with the priest – offer the sacrifice of ourselves and Christ to the Father. Woah! Thats big!

So, dear friends, what shall we do this Mass?

† † †

Well, firstly, let us look closely at the hands of the priest. As the water is poured over, gaze at those consecrated hands that will offer up (alongside you) – your offering and the offering of Jesus Christ to the Father. How good.

And secondly, pray that God will accept your offering through the priest's hands. Good news. You already do – each time you respond to the priest: "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands, for the praise and glory of His name, for our good and the good of all His holy Church."

Do that, and you too shall be washed, ready for the holy sacrifice. ---- God bless you. Seminarian Matthew

ALL SOULS DAY

2nd November

All Souls' Day provides the opportunity to indulgences for our departed

loved ones and for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory. What is an indulgence? "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven (in the Sacrament of Confession), which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1471).

From the Handbook of Indulgences: A plenary (full) indulgence, which is applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a church or an oratory on All Souls' Day. The requirements for obtaining a Plenary Indulgence are:

Visit a church and pray for the souls in Purgatory while in the state of grace

Say the Our Father and the Creed during the visit to the church (this is accomplished in the liturgy if your visit is during Mass; outside of Mass, offer these on your own)

Pray for the Pope's intentions (an Our Father, or Hail Mary, or any other appropriate prayer is sufficient)

Worthily receive Holy Communion (on the day itself or soon thereafter)

Make a sacramental confession within 20 days of All Souls' Day, either before or after

For a plenary indulgence, be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin (otherwise, the indulgence is partial, not plenary). It is sufficient that the Christian makes an act of the will to love God above all things and to despise all sin.

In addition, you can gain a plenary indulgence visiting a cemetery each day between 1 November and 8 November.



MANLY FRESHWATER PARISH ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR TO 30 JUNE 2024

Dear fellow parishioners,

The Parish Finance Committee is pleased to report a summary of the financial health of the Parish as at 30 June 2024. This REPORT gives an overview of the sources of our income and just as importantly, where the money goes. In the table, you will see a comparison with last year's report and our budget for the current year to June 2025. For those who are interested, please see a representative of the Committee after mass to discuss any aspect of the REPORT.

Without your generosity the Parish would be unable to function as a centre that equips us to serve as true disciples of Christ, worshipping together to build an inclusive, caring community that reaches beyond our parish walls. Total Parish Giving (near the top of the table) forms the backbone of our income. After a post covid boost in 2022/23 the figure has plateaued short of \$300k and we are remaining conservative in forecasting a similar figure in the current year.

Rental income is our other important source of income and that comes from the former Presbytery at St John's in Freshwater. We used an opportunity to carry out a badly needed refurbishment which cost c\$50k directly and \$18k in rental foregone. We estimate the payback on this expenditure will be less than 4 years on such a valuable asset. Rental income will normalise in 2024/25 (at c\$85k gross) enabling us to expand the Operating Expenditure to refocus on growing our spirituality and outreach.

Overall, we are forecasting a slightly softer Net Operating Surplus in the June 2025 year (\$60k vs \$66k in FY24).

After the above-mentioned \$50k spend in FY24, Non-recurring Capital Expenditure is budgeted at \$95k as we embark on projects which have been mentioned previously and are now becoming urgent (Manly Presbytery verandah restoration, Manly Church internal painting and external sandstone repair). This precinct will need to be in a condition of which we should all be proud as we approach our 150th year in 2026.

The planned new capex will reduce the NET FUNDS AVAILABLE TO THE PARISH (\$128K AT 30 June 2024) by \$35k if the Parish was to receive NO special donations or bequests in the current year. We have

'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.

Gospel Reflection

Mark's story of the blind Bartimaeus, which takes place just before Jesus' Palm Sunday entry into Jerusalem, is as much a "call" story as a healing story. For Mark, Bartimaeus is model of faith. The blind beggar

calls out to Jesus using the Messianic title "Son of David." He first asks, not for his sight, but for compassion: He understands that this Jesus operates out of a spirit of love and compassion for humanity and places his faith in that spirit. Ironically, the blind Bartimaeus "sees" in Jesus the spirit of compassionate service that, until now, his "seeing" disciples have been unable to comprehend. *Connectionmediaworks*
