Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, Jesus "synthesizes" his message in the "Great Commandment."

The Jews knew these two commandments well. To this day, observant Jews pray twice daily the Shema: to love God "with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your strength." The word shema means "to hear," and comes from the first words of the prayer, "Hear, O Israel . . ." The text for the Shema, which is also inscribed in the "mezuzah," the small container affixed to the door of every Jewish home, is found in Deuteronomy 6: 4-6 (today's first reading). While the Torah outlined a Jew's responsibility to one's neighbors, Jesus is the first to make of these two a commandment: "There is no other commandment greater than these." The only way we can adequately celebrate our live for God is in extending that love to our neighbors.

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

Make Some Noise: The Great "Amen!"

You ever come across a Catholic word that's... intimidating?

Try this one: "Doxology."

Whew, I'm already exhausted. ...But it's true, while we mightn't recognise the



word, as Catholics we all know it. Because the final doxology is a moment in the Mass – when the priest lifts up the sacred host and precious chalice together, and says: "Through Him, with Him, and in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is Yours, Almighty Father, forever and ever." "Amen!"

See... I told you that you knew it.

So this week, let's take a look at the doxology. Specifically, what is it, and why is it called *high point* of the Mass?

+ + +

First things first, the final doxology happens at the very end of the Eucharistic Prayer, and is symbolic of the Crucifixion of Jesus. I recently discovered that different parts of the Mass can remind us of events in Jesus' life. For example:

Entrance Procession – The priest first enters the church, just as Jesus was conceived and first entered the world.

Gloria – The congregation then sings the Gloria, echoing the angels' song of glory and praise at Jesus' birth.

Scripture and Homily – The readings and homily mirror how Jesus began His ministry of preaching and teaching.

Consecration – The words of Consecration recall the Last Supper, where Jesus instituted the Eucharist by breaking bread and sharing the cup.

Final Doxology – And the final doxology. The priest holding up the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ symbolises the Crucifixion of Jesus, where He offers Himself fully up to the Father. The priest lifts up the sacred host and precious chalice, lifts them high up into the air, just as Jesus was lifted high up on the Cross. And in this moment in the Mass, we are reminded of the crucified Jesus who cries out: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit", giving Himself fully over – body, blood, soul and divinity – to the Father. Oh, blessed tree! Oh, sweet wood and nails! How precious this Sacrifice, that saves us from death!

...And so, dear friends, what shall we do at this moment?

+ + +

Well, firstly, gaze up at Jesus Christ. We are not mere spectators. No. In this moment, we are instead there with Jesus, kneeling at the foot of the Cross, like Mother Mary and the Apostle John, and we gaze up at Jesus, who offers Himself fully over to the Father. And we too offer Jesus Christ up to the Father, along with the offering of ourselves.

And secondly, declare loudly the great "Amen!" As early as the third century, one of the great privileges of Christians was to declare the great Amen. It has always been declared loudly. The great Amen is so important, because by it we offer all glory and honour to the Father – united once more with Him, through Jesus' Sacrifice. Because it is through Jesus' offering on the Cross, that the world is restored, and we are saved. So then let declare loudly - the great "Amen!"

CHILDREN'S LITURGY

Children's Liturgy will be held on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month during the 10:30am Mass.

This will cater for children aged 3 to 8 years old. Each week a theme that correlates to the readings and Gospel is presented to the children using age-appropriate materials. The adult catechists incorporate prayer, song, group discussion, worksheets and other activities so the children can relate the Word of God to daily life. The children leave the church after a blessing from the priest, gather in the parish meeting room, and return during the offertory.

The Law appoints high priests who are men subject to weakness; but the promise on oath, which came after the Law, appointed the Son who is made perfect for ever.

Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.
